**RED RIVER-BOWIE MISSIONARY BAPTIST ASSOCIATION  
MESSENGER MEETING SEPTEMBER 24, 1970  
East Post Oak Missionary Baptist Church, Post Oak, Texas**

At 10:00 A. M. the meeting was opened with the song, "Brethren, We Have Met To Worship," led by Bro. James R. Brown with Sis. Stevens at the piano.

The opening prayer was led by Bro. A. I. Bond, Moderator Emeritus.

Bro. Cecil Purcell, pastor of the Austin Chapel Baptist Church of DeKalb was called on to bring the morning devotional. He read from I Peter 2:21 and spoke on the subject "Walking Where Jesus Walked."

The Moderator, Bro. Roper, asked the congregation to stand as he declared the 127th messenger meeting opened for business. Prayer was then offered by Bro. Augustus Downing, Bro. Darrell Owens of the Pinkham Memorial Church in DeKalb was called to come and read the Rules of Decorum.

The new pastors of the Association were introduced. They were Bro. James Brown, Friendship; Bro. Paul Owens, West Side; Bro. R. E. Cecil, Hillcrest; and Bro. David Jordan, Liberty.

We then recognized the visiting preachers: Brethren Elvin Crocker, W. H. Hitt, Glen Gary, Alvin Blaylock, J. B. Powers.

Bro. Bob Griffith, host pastor, then extended the welcome to all the messengers and visitors. The response to the welcome was made by the moderator.

Bro. Brown led the congregation in singing, "Loyalty to Christ." Prayer was offered by Bro. Elvin Crocker of the South Union Church, Daingerfield, Texas.

Motion was made by Bro. Downing, seconded by Bro. Purcell, to defer the annual sermon to the 11:00 o'clock hour to read the letters and elect the officers. Passed.

Those appointed as reading clerks to read the Church letters were: Brethren James Brown, R. E. Cecil and Paul Owens.

Letters were read from the following churches: Hillcrest, Hodgson, New Hope, Pinkham Memorial, Alkin Grove, West Side, Friendship, Johntown, Liberty, Avery, New Haven, Mt. Pleasant, Hubbard Chapel, Hopewell and Post Oak.

Motion was made by Bro. H. L. Johnston that the letters be accepted as read to seat the messengers and invite the visitors to sit with us in deliberation and counsel. Motion was seconded by Bro. A. B. Kellen and passed.

The moderator then called the roll of Churches that had been assigned reports to see if all were present. The reports were all ready to be read.

The election of officers for the Association was called for. The following officers were elected to serve during this Association year:

Moderator: Bro. Augustus Downing.

Assistant Moderator: H. L. Johnston.

Clerk: Bro. James R. Brown.

Treasurer: Bro. Marvin A. Gardner.

The moderator then called Bro. Brown to lead the congregation while they sang, "Blessed Assurance." Sis. Stevens again at the piano.

The newly elected officers were then introduced and began the duties of their office.

In the absence of Bro. Lloyd Goodman who had been elected to bring the annual message (but since had moved from our association), the alternate, Bro. John Henderson of the Hubbard Chapel Church was introduced by Bro. Downing for the message. Bro. Henderson read I Peter 5:2 and spoke on the subject of "Feeding the Sheep." The message was very inspirational and was closed with prayer.

The moderator called for Bro. H. Murry to come and give the hand of appreciation to Bro. Purcell and Bro. Henderson on behalf of the congregation.

The moderator then called for invitations for the 1971 meeting.

The clerk reported that the Avery Missionary Baptist Church had written a request for the meeting. Motion was made by Bro. Gardner, seconded by Bro. D. Owens to meet with the Avery Church. Passed.

A brief discussion followed on the meeting date. Motion was made by Bro. Brown that the date be set for Sept. 23, 1971. Seconded by Bro. Gardner and passed.

Nominations were opened for someone to bring the annual message. Those nominated were Brethren Paul Owens, Darrell Owens, and James Brown. Bro. Darrell Owens was elected with Bro. Paul Owens as Alternate.

The moderator asked if a night service had been planned. Bro. Griffin, host pastor, reported that it would be left up to the messengers. A vote was taken and it was decided not to have night service.

A motion was made by Bro. Cecil Purcell, seconded by Bro. Darrell Owens, to begin hearing reports that were assigned to the churches last year. The motion passed.

The reports were heard as follows: (The reports are printed in another section of these minutes).

Associational Missions submitted by Hillcrest Church, read by Bro. R. E. Cecil, spoken to by Brethren Glen Gary and Augustus Downing. Adopted.

State Missions submitted by Pinkham Memorial Church, read by Bro. Darrell Owens, spoken to by Bro. W. H. Hitt and adopted.

A motion to adjourn until 1:15 this afternoon was made by Bro. Gardner, seconded by Bro. Purcell. Passed.

## AFTERNOON SESSION

Following a delicious meal prepared by the host church, the congregation was called to order and opened with a song, "Trust and Obey," led by Bro. John Henderson with Sis. Henderson at the piano. Bro. Alvin Blaylock led the opening prayer. A very good program of special music was rendered by the following men. Bro. David Jordan sang, "Praise the Lord Anyhow." Bro. Darrel Owens then sang "I surrender All." Bro. John Henderson also sang "Does Jesus Care." The music was enjoyed by everyone.

A motion was made by Bro. Brown and seconded by Bro. Johnston that we receive an offering today for the Church in Wichita Falls, Texas, that was in need. Passed. The offering amounted to \$50.00.

We resumed giving of the reports.

Interstate and Foreign Missions submitted by Hubbard Chapel. Read by Bro. John Henderson, spoken to by Bro. W. H. Hitt and adopted.

Christian Education submitted by Johnstown Church, read by Bro. Gardner, spoken to by Bro. Elvin Crocker and Bro. Gardner and adopted.

Denominational Literature submitted by Avery Church, read by Bro. Downing, spoken to by Bro. J. B. Powers and adopted.

Temperance submitted by East Post Oak Church, read by Bro. Griffith and adopted.

Orphan's Home submitted by Hopewell Church, read by Bro. A. B. Kellam and adopted.

The song "Praise Him, Praise Him" was sung, directed by Bro. John Henderson with Sis. Henderson at the piano. Prayer was offered by Bro. Joseph Baird of Avery.

Old Ministers Relief submitted by Austin Chapel Church, read by Bro. Cecil Purcell, spoken to by Bro. Elvin Crocker and adopted.

Ladies Auxiliary submitted by Friendship Church, read by Bro. James R. Brown, spoken to by Bro. Brown, Bro. W. H. Hitt, and Sis. Glen Gary and adopted.

A motion was made by Bro. James Brown and seconded by Sis. H. L. Johnston that two pages in the minute book be devoted to Ladies Work. Passed.

Men's Brotherhood submitted by West Side Church, read by Bro. Paul Owens and adopted.

Obituary submitted by New Haven, read by Bro. H. L. Johnston and adopted. The congregation stood for a moment of silent prayer after which Bro. Augustus Downing led in prayer.

The treasurer's report was given by Bro. Marvin Gardner and adopted.

A motion was made by Bro. Gardner to pay the clerk \$50.00 for his work in preparing the minutes. Second by Bro. Paul Owens and passed.

A motion was made by Bro. H. L. Johnston, seconded by Bro. Marvin Gardner that we recommend to each church that they send \$5.00 additional money for the minute fund. Passed.

Bro. Cecil Purcell made a motion, seconded by Bro. Darrel Owens, that a standing vote of thanks be given to the host Church. Passed, and all stood.

Motion by Bro. H. L. Johnston, seconded by Bro. Bond, to adjourn. Passed.

## RULES OF DECORUM

1. This body shall be opened by song and prayer.
2. Any member wishing to speak shall arise and address the Moderator and await this recognition.
3. When a member has been recognized by the Moderator he shall not be interrupted while speaking unless he departs from the subjects, or uses personal or indecorous language.
4. No member shall be allowed to speak more than twice on any subject.
5. No one shall be allowed to speak more than 10 minutes on any one subject unless granted an extension of time by the body.

## CONSTITUTION

### Of the Red River-Bowie Missionary Baptist Association

#### ARTICLE I—NAME

This Association shall be known as the Red River-Bowie Missionary Baptist Association.

#### ARTICLE II—OBJECT

The object of this Association shall be to awaken a deeper interest in the welfare of the denomination, to cultivate a closer union

between the churches, to produce and perpetuate the greatest activity as to missionary and educational enterprises, and to widen the scope of denominational benevolence.

#### **ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP**

Section 1: This Association shall be composed of such regular Baptist churches as may agree to co-operate by means of messengers, to carry out the object as set forth in Article II of this Constitution; such messengers to present letters of petition for admission from their respective churches.

Section 2: The messengers to the annual session of this Association shall be chosen by their respective churches, such action being certified by the churches in their letters to the Association.

Section 3: Each church composing this Association shall be entitled to three messengers to the annual messenger assembly.

Section 4: Each church shall be the sole judge of her messengers.

#### **ARTICLE IV—NATURE**

Section 1: This Association shall be in nature a joint auxiliary to the churches composing it. It is not formed for ecclesiastical end, but merely for benevolent purposes; but it reserves the right to withdraw from any church which becomes heterodox in faith or disorderly in practice.

Section 2: The Association shall recognize freedom of speech as essential to the highest achievement of its work.

#### **ARTICLE V—OFFICERS**

Section 1: The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, and a Treasurer, who shall be chosen by the messengers meeting in annual session, and shall hold office for one year, or until their successors are chosen.

Section 2: It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over the messenger assembly, to keep order, and to discharge such other duties as are incumbent upon this office.

Section 3: It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a correct record of each session of the messenger assembly, and to have the same published and distributed to the churches as the report of the Association.

Section 4: It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to keep a correct record of all monies received and disbursed, and to make a report of the same to the Association during its annual session.

#### **ARTICLE VI—EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE**

This Association may have an Executive Committee composed of one member from each church in the Association. Five members of said Committee shall constitute a quorum, the Moderator of the Committee is to provide leadership and counsel in carrying out the work outlined in the annual messenger assembly of the Association.

#### **ARTICLE VII—AMENDMENTS**

Two-thirds of the churches of this Association must approve any change or amendment of this Constitution. The following procedure shall be followed in order to change or amend the Constitution: Any proposed amendment shall be presented for discussion in open session of the Messenger Assembly. After discussion, the proposed amendment may be withdrawn only by consent of a simple majority of the messengers voting. Otherwise it must be referred to the churches of the Association. Each church may then vote for or against the proposed amendment, expressing said vote for or against in the associational letter to the next annual session of the messengers. In this matter, each church is entitled to one vote.
