RED RIVER-BOWIE MISSIONARY BAPTIST ASSOCIATION
MESSENGER MEETING SEPTEMBER 20, 1979

Austin Chapel Missionary Baptist Church, DeKalb, Tex

The One Hundred Thirty-Sixth annual session of the Red River-Bowie Association of Missionary Baptist Churches met with Austin Chapel Missionary Baptist Church in DeKalb, Texas, on September 20, 1979, beginning at 10:00 a.m.

The service began with Bro. John Marlar leading the singing, "He Keeps Me Singing." Mrs. Clara Bunger of the Austin Chapel Church played the piano. We then sang "When We All Meet in Heaven." The congregation stood on the last verse while Bro. Marlar, Secretary and Treasurer of Missions for the Red River-Bowie Association led the opening prayer.

Bro. John Marlar, host pastor of the Austin Chapel Missionary Baptist Church came to give words of welcome and to make announcements. A nursery was to be provided by the host church. Bro. Marlar joined the host pastor in extending words of welcome.

Bro. Vernon Barr of Dallas, Texas, representing the Red River-Bowie Association, was called to lead the morning devotional. Bro. Barr read from II Corinthians 4:16-18 and called attention to verse 18 and spoke briefly to Christians. He closed the devotional with prayer.

Bro. Billy Daniels, the moderator, then asked the congregation to stand while he declared the one-hundred thirty-sixth annual session of the Red River-Bowie Missionary Baptist Association now open and open for regular business. Bro. R. T. Stephens was asked to lead the opening prayer.

The Moderator then recognized Bro. A. I. Bond, Moderator, as present and he was asked to stand.

The Moderator then called for the Church letters and announcements to be brought to the Clerk's table.

The Moderator then called for the new pastors of our churches to stand and to introduce themselves and the church they are joining. They were as follows: Bro. Bill Morris, New Hope Missionary Baptist Church; Bro. Tom Ingram, East Post Oak Missionary Baptist Church; Bro. Ronnie Stewart, Aikin Grove Missionary Baptist Church.

Bro. Lynn Hitt, Hillcrest Missionary Baptist Church; Bro. Cecil Purcell, Pinkham Memorial Missionary Baptist Church.

The Moderator then asked the visitors in the service to introduce themselves. They were as follows: Bro. Curtis Hall, Missionary for the North East Texas Baptist Missionary Council working in the city of Linden, Texas; Bro. W. H. Bradberry from Bedford, Texas; Dr. Vernon Barr, representing the A.B.A. Mexican Baptist Institute; Bro. Gene Hoover, Superintendent of the Pine Springs Baptist Camp Grounds near Laneville, Texas; Bro. Kenneth Bazar, Secretary and Treasurer of Missions for the American Baptist Association; Bro. Marvin Gardner, Missionary for the North East Texas Baptist Mission Council working in the city of Tyler, Texas; Bro. Luther Crawford, Secretary and Treasurer of Missions for the Texas State Association of Missionary Baptist Churches; Dr. Ray O. Brooks, President of the Texas Baptist Institute in Henderson, Texas.

The Moderator then read the rules of decorum. (Clerk's Note: These rules can be found in another part of this yearbook.)

A motion was then offered by Bro. James Brown, seconded by Bro. Lynn Hitt, that the annual message be deferred to the eleven o'clock hour and that we proceed with the business that claimed our attention. The motion carried.

A motion was made by Bro. Lynn Hitt, seconded by Bro. J.C. Askew, that the clerks read only the Church name and the messengers names from the Church letters. The motion carried.

The Moderator then appointed Bro. James Hinkle and Bro. Tom Ingram as reading clerks. These reading clerks came and read the names of the Churches that had turned in a letter and the names of messengers and alternates from those letters.

At this time a motion was made by Bro. James Brown and seconded by Bro. A. B. Kellam, to seat the messengers present and to invite the visiting brethren to sit in council with us. The motion carried.

We then went into the election of officers for the coming year. They are as follows:

Nominations were then called for for someone to pre- message in 1980. Bro. James Hinkle was nominated and elected as the alternate, on a motion carried, by Bro. Lynn Hitt and Bro. A. B. Kellam.

Invitations for the 1980 meeting place were extended to Hopewell Missionary Baptist Church, the Johnstown Missionary Baptist Church, and the Wards Creek Missionary Baptist Church to meet with the Johnstown Church.

Bro. James Brown then made a motion, seconded by Bro. Kellam, that the meeting date for the 1980 annual session be September 18, 1980. The motion carried.

Bro. A. I. Bond, Moderator Emeritus and member of the Missionary Baptist Church, accepted the meeting for 1980 of the Johnstown Missionary Baptist Church.

The Clerk was then recognized to give a statistical report showing the growth of our Association over the ten years in each category of our annual report.

The Moderator then called for the report on International Missions. This report was prepared by the Wards Creek Missionary Baptist Church and read by Bro. Carl Raleigh, Pastor. He then moved the adoption of the report which was seconded by Bro. Raleigh then yielded his time to speak to the Bro. Kenneth Bazar, Secretary and Treasurer of Missions American Baptist Association from Texarkana. Bro. Bazar reported on the National and Worldwide Mission program of the American Baptist Churches. The motion was then passed.

The Moderator then advised the messengers and visitors that the meeting would adjourn at eleven o'clock and time for the message.

Bro. John Marlar was called to come and lead the congregation in singing, "Joy Unspeakable", while the people stood.

Bro. R. T. Stephens was then recognized to introduce the speaker, Bro. Lynn McBryde, Pastor of the Missionary Baptist Church in Avery, Texas.

Bro. McBryde came and read from Acts 21:33 - 22:1. on the subject, "Why I am a Christian." More than 110 people were present to hear the message. Bro. McBryde then delivered an inspiring message. Bro. Lynn Hitt, Pastor of the Hillcrest

Baptist Church in Paris, Texas, was asked to extend the hand of appreciation to the speaker.

We then returned to the business at hand.

The report on State Missions, prepared by the East Post Oak Missionary Baptist Church and read by Bro. Tom Ingram, pastor, was then called for. Bro. Ingram read the report and yielded his time to speak to Bro. Luther Crawford, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer of Missions for the State Association of Missionary Baptist Churches in Texas and New Mexico. Bro. Crawford also gave a good report on the mission work being done on the state level. Bro. Brown announced that Bro. Harmon Hunt, State Missionary working in Arlington, Texas, would be with the Friendship Missionary Baptist Church the following Sunday morning, September 23, 1979, and with the New Haven Missionary Baptist Church on Sunday night.

A motion was then offered by Bro. James Brown, seconded by Bro. Lynn Hitt, that we adjourn until 1:30 p.m. Announcements were called for and made by Bro. John Marlar and Bro. Vernon Barr.

A motion was then made to receive an offering that would go to The Baptist Monitor. The motion carried.

The motion to adjourn carried by the people standing. Bro. Bill Morris was called by the Moderator to lead the closing prayer and to ask the blessing on the noon meal.

A very delicious meal was prepared by the ladies of the host Church and was enjoyed by everyone in attendance.

AFTERNOON SESSION

The Moderator, at 1:10 p.m., called the meeting back to order. The weather was very bad at this time and everyone had finished their meal, it was decided to begin the afternoon session early so some of our visitors could complete their reports and start home.

The Moderator had earlier in the day asked Bro. James Brown to work out some special music for the afternoon session. Bro. Daniels announced that the special music program be the afternoon devotional. Bro. Brown then introduced Bro. John Marlar and Bro. Bill Morris and they sang, "Because He Lives." Bro. James Brown then came to sing, "The Longer I Serve Him." This completed the special music program.

Brooks, President Texas Baptist Institute in Henderson, Texas, and Dr. Vernon A.B.A. Baptist Mexican Institute. The motion to adopt passed.

The report on Denominational Literature was prepared by Westside Missionary Baptist Church and read by Bro. Buel pastor. Bro. Lewallen moved the adoption of the report, seconded by Bro. James Brown and spoken to by Bro. Lewallen. The motion passed.

The Moderator then called on Bro. Gene Hoover, Superintendent of the Pine Springs Baptist Camp Grounds at Laneville, Texas his report.

The report on Temperance was prepared by the New Haven Baptist Church and read by Bro. James Hinkle, pastor. Bro. moved the adoption of the report and was seconded by Bro. The report was spoken to briefly by Bro. Hinkle. The motion passed.

Hopewell Missionary Baptist Church prepared the report on Orphans Home and it was read by Bro. A. B. Kellam, pastor. to adopt the report was offered by Bro. Kellam with the second by Bill Morris. The motion passed.

The report on Aged Ministers Support was prepared by Pleasant Missionary Baptist Church and read by Bro. Wilbourn pastor. The motion to adopt the report was made by Bro. Lee second by Bro. Jim Brown. Bro. Lee then spoke to the report passed.

Bro. James Brown then offered a motion, which was seconded by Cecil Purcell, that the 1979 edition of the Red River-Bowling Hooser, deceased ministers of our Association, and both men

Friendship Missionary Baptist Church. The motion carried.

The report on Ladies Auxilliary was prepared by the Johntown Missionary Baptist Church and read by Mrs. Oletia McAlester, teacher of the Johntown Auxilliary. Motion to adopt was made by Bro. James Brown with the second by Bro. J. C. Askew and it was passed.

The report on Men's Brotherhood was prepared by the Avery Missionary Baptist Church and was read by Bro. Lynn McBryde, pastor. Bro. McBryde moved the adoption for the report, seconded by Bro. Batchelor, and passed.

The report on Obituary was prepared by the Liberty Missionary Baptist Church and was read by Bro. H. L. Johnston, pastor. Bro. Johnston moved the adoption of the report, seconded by Bro. James Hinkle, and was passed by the people standing for a moment of silent prayer in memory of those who had passed from this walk of life.

The Moderator then asked Bro. J. C. Askew to voice an oral prayer.

The Clerk was then recognized to read the list of assignment of reports for the next year.

The Treasurer, Bro. John Marlar, then gave his report. The motion to adopt the treasurer's report was made by Bro. James Brown, seconded by Bro. A. B. Kellam, and passed.

There was then a motion made by Bro. Lynn McBryde, and seconded by Bro. R. T. Stephens, that the Clerk and Treasurer be paid the same as last year for their work. Passed.

A motion was then made by Bro. J. C. Askew, seconded by Bro. H. L. Johnston, to give the host church a rising vote of appreciation for the good meal and their hospitality.

A motion was made by Bro. Lynn McBryde, seconded by Bro. A. B. Kellam, to adjourn.

Announcements were made and Bro. A. I. Bond led the closing prayer.

REPORTS SUBMITTED TO THE ASSOCIATION IN 1979

TEMPERANCE

Section 3: It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a correct record of each session of the messenger assembly, and to have the same published and distributed to the churches as a report of the Association.
Section 4: It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to keep a correct record of all monies received and disbursed, and to make a report to the same to the Association during its annual session.

ARTICLE VI - EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

This Association may have an Executive Committee composed of one member from each church in the Association. Five members of said Committee shall constitute a quorum, the Moderator of the Committee is to provide leadership and counsel in carrying out the work outlined in the annual messenger assembly of the Association.

ARTICLE VII - AMENDMENTS

Two-thirds of the churches of this Association must approve any change or amendment of this Constitution. The following procedure shall be followed in order to change or amend the Constitution: Any proposed amendment shall be presented for discussion in open session of the Messenger Assembly. After discussion, the proposed amendment may be withdrawn only by consent of a simple majority of the messengers voting. Otherwise, it must be referred to the churches of the Association. Each church may then vote for or against the proposed amendment, expressing said vote for or against in the association letter to the next annual session of the messengers. In this matter, each church is entitled to one vote.

We are taught in I Cor. 9:25 to be temperate in all things that we as God's children must say NO to some things.
Alcohol should not be used as a beverage by any who are children. Also, we need to be temperate in our dress, our diet, and our Christian walk. In I Cor. 10:31, Paul said, "Therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God."

Therefore, we recommend that our churches take heed to the word of God's word and be temperate in ALL THINGS.

CONSTITUTION

of the

RED RIVER-BOWIE MISSIONARY BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I - NAME

This Association shall be known as the Red River-Bowie Missionary Baptist Association.

ARTICLE II - OBJECT

The object of this Association shall be to awaken a deeper interest in the welfare of the denomination to cultivate a closer union between the churches, to produce and perpetuate the greatest activity as a missionary and education enterprises, and to widen the scope of denomination benevolence.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1: This Association shall be composed of such regular Baptist Churches as may agree to co-operate by means of messengers, to carry out the object as set forth in Article II of this Constitution; such messengers to present letters of petition for admission from their respective churches

ARTICLE IV - NATURE

Section 1: This Association shall be in nature a joint auxiliary to the churches composing. It is not formed for ecclesiastical end, but merely for Benevolent purposes, it reserves the right to withdraw from any church which comes heterodox in faith or disorderly in practice.

Section 2: This Association shall recognize freedom of speech as essential to the highest achievement of its work

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS

Section 1: The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk and a Treasurer who shall be chosen by the messengers meeting in annual session, and shall hold office for one year, or until their successors are chosen.

Section 2: It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over the messenger assembly, keep order and to discharge such other duties as are incumbent upon this office

RULES OF DECORUM:

1. This body shall be opened by song and prayer.
2. Any member wishing to speak shall arise and address the Moderator and await this recognition.
3. When a member has been recognized by the Moderator he shall not be interrupted while speaking unless he departs from the subject, or uses personal or indecorous language.
4. No member shall be allowed to speak more than twice on any subject.
5. No one shall be allowed to speak more than 10 minutes on any one subject unless granted an extension of time by the body.
