Elder R. T. Stevens

Elder R. T. Stevens was born November 4, 1912, at Post Oak, Texas. He served as deacon in the Post Oak Missionary Baptist Church before surrendering to preach in 1950. He was elected District Missionary for the Red River-Bowie Association in 1951 and served until 1952. He also served as Treasurer of the Association during that year. He served as Moderator in 1952 and 1953 and again in 1955 and 1956.

Bro. Stevens' pastorates included Hopewell, New Haven and Avery of the Red River-Bowie Association and Prosperity Avenue and Mesquite of the Central Texas Association. Failing health forced him to give up the fulltime ministry the last several years of his life but he never stopped preaching. When the opportunity was presented and his health permitted, he was ready to tell people about the Christ he knew and loved. Bro. Stevens went to his reward on December 13, 1979.

Wards Creek were eliminated. We then voted on Avery and New Haven and New Haven was selected by the messengers as the 1981 meeting place.

A motion was offered by Bro. James Brown and seconded by Bro. Jim Henry, to set the 1981 session meeting date for September 17, 1981. The motion passed.

The moderator then called for nominations for someone to be the annual speaker for the next session. Those nominated were Bro. John Marlor and Bro. Jim McDougal. A motion was offered by Bro. Lynn Hitt that the one receiving the second highest number of votes should serve as the alternate speaker. Seconded by Bro. A. B. Kellam and passed.

Bro. Jim McDougal was elected to bring the annual message with Bro. John Marlor as the alternate.

The report on Associational Missions was prepared by the New Haven Missionary Baptist Church and read by Bro. James Hinkel, Pastor. Bro. Hinkel moved the adoption of the report and then yielded his time to Bro. Marvin Gardner, Missionary for the North East Texas Baptist Mission Council and working with the Heritage Missionary Baptist Mission in Tyler, Texas, for his report. Bro. Curtis Hall, also Missionary for the North East Texas Baptist Mission Council and working in Linden, Texas, followed Bro. Gardner to give his report. Both Missionaries gave good and encouraging reports of their respective works. The report was then adopted.

The Moderator then called for Bro. Lynn Hitt to come and lead the congregation while they stood and sang, "Follow Me."

The Moderator then asked Bro. A. B. Kellam, Pastor of the Hopewell Missionary Baptist Church, to come and introduce the Speaker for the annual message.

Bro. James Hinkel, Pastor of the New Haven Missionary Baptist Church, was introduced and brought the message based on I Timothy 1:1-4. Bro. Hinkel brought a very challenging message which he closed with prayer.

(CLERK'S NOTE: There were approximately 100 people in the auditorium to hear the annual message.)

The Moderator then called Bro. Lynn McBryde, Pastor of the Avery Missionary Baptist Church in Avery, Texas, to come and give the hand of appreciation to Bro. Hinkel on behalf of the congregation for the message.

Luther Crawford, State Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer of Missions, could not be present because of the illness of his wife.

Bro. Vernon Barr reported on the state mission project in Huntsville, Texas. Bro. Curtis Hall spoke briefly about Texas Mission Development. The report passed.

The Moderator then called for the report on Denominational Literature by the Hubbard Chapel Missionary Baptist Church. Bro. Sam Reeves, Pastor, stated that they did not know about this report until today. He made a motion that the report on Denominational Literature printed in the year book of last year stand as this year's report. The motion was seconded by Bro. Lynn Hitt and passed.

The report on Ladies Auxiliary was prepared by the Avery Missionary Baptist Church and read by Bro. Lynn McBryde, Pastor. Bro. McBryde moved the adoption of the report with the second by Bro. Tom Ingram. The report was spoken to by Bro. McBryde and passed.

ARTICLE IV — NATURE

Section 1: The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk and a Treasurer, who shall be chosen by the messengers meeting in annual session, and shall hold office for one year, or until their successors are chosen.

Section 2: It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over the messenger assembly, keep order and to discharge such other duties as are incumbent upon this office.

Section 3: It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a correct record of each session of the messenger assembly, and to have the same published and distributed to the churches as a report of the Association.

Section 4: It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to keep a correct record of all monies received and disbursed, and to make a report to the same to the Association during its annual session.

ARTICLE VI — EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

This Association may have an Executive Committee composed of one member from each church in the Association. Five members of said Committee shall constitute a quorum, the Moderator of the Committee is to provide leadership and counsel in carrying out the work outlined in the annual messenger assembly of the Association.

ARTICLE VII — AMENDMENTS

Two-thirds of the churches of this Association must approve any change or amendment of this Constitution. The following procedure shall be followed in order to change or amend the Constitution: Any proposed amendment shall be presented for discussion in open session of the Messenger Assembly. After

CONSTITUTION

of the

RED RIVER-BOWIE MISSIONARY BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I — NAME

This Association shall be known as the Red River-Bowie
Missionary Baptist Association.
