The Moderator appointed as reading clerks, Bro. Mike Black and Bro. Ervin Gould.

A motion was made and carried that only the names of the messengers and alternates be read from the church letters.

Following the reading of the letters, a motion was made to seat the messengers and invite the visiting brethren to sit in counsel. The motion carried.

The Moderator called for the election of officers. Nominations were opened for Moderator. Bro. Guy Culver was nominated and elected.

Other officers elected were: Assistant Moderator, Bro. James Brown; Clerk, Bro. Billy Daniels; Assistant Clerk, Bro. Charles Johnston; Treasurer, Bro. James Eddins; Assistant Treasurer, Bro. Ervin Gould.

Nominations were opened for a speaker for the 1989 session. Bro. Charlie Ellison, Missionary at Hooks, was nominated and elected. Bro. Carl Raleigh, pastor at Mt. Pleasant, was selected as the alternate.

Invitations for the 1989 meeting came from New Haven, Wards Creek, and Johnstown. Wards Creek was selected by the majority of messengers voting.

Bro. Culver called for the reading of the reports. Bro. Ellison asked a question concerning the reports, whether or not the Temperance Report could be replaced by a report on current issues at the Moderator's discretion.

Following discussion, a motion was made to include an additional report, to be chosen by the Moderator, on some relevant issue. The motion carried.

The Moderator called for the reading of the Report on State Missions. Bro. Brown read the report for Aikin Grove. A motion was made to adopt the report.

Bro. Luther Crawford, Secretary-Treasurer of State Missions, was recognized to speak to the report. He stressed the need for additional funds in the General Fund account and recommended that the churches send an offering for the General Fund rather than the Minute Fund as it was in good shape.

Bro. Marlin Freeman spoke to the report on behalf of the work in Center. Bro. Leroy Smith spoke to the report concerning the work of the Texas Mission Builders. He reported that they had completed twenty two projects in a two year period.

The motion to adopt the State Mission Report carried.

A motion was made to receive an offering for the General Fund for State Missions. Motion carried.

The congregation sang, "To God be the Glory" as the offering was received.

Bro. Guy Culver called on Bro. J. T. McNabb to introduce the speaker of the hour, Bro. A. B. Kellam, pastor of Hopewell Missionary Baptist Church.

Bro. Kellam read Acts 2:41-47 and called on Bro. Carl Raleigh to lead in prayer. Bro. Kellam spoke on "When Is A Church A Church of the Lord Jesus Christ?"

Bro. Ellison extended the hand of appreciation to Bro. Kellam for the message.

Bro. Culver recognized Bro. Brown to read the report on Christian Education for Austin Chapel, as they were unable to be present. A motion was made to adopt the report.

Dr. Ray O. Brooks was recognized to speak to the report. He spoke concerning the needs of T.B.I. and also Mexican Baptist Institute. The motion to adopt carried.

Bro. Kellam was recognized to make an announcement concerning lunch.

A motion was made to adjourn until 1:00 p.m. The motion carried. Bro. B. T. Baugh led the dismissal prayer.

simple majority of the messengers voting. Otherwise, it must be referred to the churches of the Association. Each church may then vote for or against the proposed amendment, expressing said vote for or against in the association letter to the next annual session of the messengers. In this matter, each church is entitled to one vote.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. This body shall be opened by song and prayer.
2. Any member wishing to speak shall arise and address the Moderator and await his recognition.
3. When a member has been recognized by the Moderator, he shall not be interrupted while speaking unless he departs from the subject, or uses personal or indecorous language.
4. No member shall be allowed to speak more than twice on any subject.
5. No one shall be allowed to speak more than 10 minutes on any one subject unless granted an extension of time by the body.

Section 2: This Association shall recognize freedom of speech as essential to the highest achievement of its work.

ARTICLE V--OFFICERS

Section 1: The officers of this association shall be a Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, and a Treasurer, who shall be chosen by the messengers meeting in annual session, and shall hold office for one year, or until their successors are chosen.

Section 2: It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over the messenger assembly, keep order and to discharge such other duties as are incumbent upon this office.

Section 3: It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a correct record of each session of the messenger assembly, and to have the same published and distributed to the churches as a report of the Association.

Section 4: It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to keep a correct record of all monies received and disbursed, and to make a report of the same to the Association during its annual session.

ARTICLE VI--EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

This Association may have an Executive Committee composed of one member from each church in the Association. Five members of said Committee shall constitute a quorum, the Moderator of the Committee is to provide leadership and counsel in carrying out the work outlined in the annual messenger assembly of the Association.

ARTICLE VII--AMENDMENTS

Two-thirds of the churches of this Association must approve any change or amendment of this Constitution. The following procedure shall be followed in order to change or amend the Constitution: Any proposed amendment shall be presented for discussion in open session of the Messenger Assembly. After discussion, the proposed amendment may be withdrawn only by consent of a

Charlie Ellison spoke concerning the work in Hooks. Bro. Billy Daniels spoke concerning the work of the North East Texas Baptist Mission Council. Bro. Bruce Crawford spoke on the work in Sawyer, Oklahoma. The motion to adopt carried.

Bro. Raleigh read the report on Temperance from Mt. Pleasant Missionary Baptist Church. A motion was made to adopt. Bro. Raleigh spoke concerning the report. The motion to adopt carried.

Bro. Brown read the report on A.B.A. Literature for Hopewell Missionary Baptist Church. A motion was made to adopt the report. Bro. Brooks was recognized to speak and gave a report on the needs of the Baptist Monitor. The motion to adopt the report carried.

Bro. J. T. McNabb was recognized to present the report on the Orphan's Home for Liberty Missionary Baptist Church. A motion to adopt carried.

Bro. Art Reed was recognized to give the report on Aged Minister's Support for New Hope Missionary Baptist Church. The motion to adopt carried.

The report on Ladies' Auxiliary was read by Bro. Kevin Plaster for New Haven Missionary Baptist Church. A motion was made to adopt. Mrs. Billy Daniels spoke to the report. The motion to adopt carried.

The Brotherhood Report was read by Bro. Plaster for the Friendship Missionary Baptist Church. A motion was made to adopt. The motion carried.

Bro. Gould gave the Obituary Report for the Avery Missionary Baptist Church. A motion was made to adopt the report with the Clerk having the privilege of adding other names that might come in. The motion called for the congregation to stand for a moment of silent prayer. Bro. J. C. Askew lead in prayer. The motion to adopt carried.

Bro. Plaster was recognized to give a report for Bro. Gene Hoover on the Youth Camp work.

The Treasurer's Report was given by Bro. Eddins and accepted as read.

A motion was made to increase the clerk's salary by \$25.00 to \$230.70 and the Treasurer's salary by \$25.00 to \$135.00. The motion carried.

CONSTITUTION OF THE RED RIVER-BOWIE MISSIONARY BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I--NAME

This Association shall be known as the Red River-Bowie Missionary Baptist Association.

ARTICLE II--OBJECT

The object of this Association shall be to awaken a deeper interest in the welfare of the denomination, to cultivate a closer union between the churches, to produce and perpetuate the greatest activity as to missionary and educational enterprises, and to widen the scope of denominational benevolence.

ARTICLE III--MEMBERSHIP

Section 1: This Association shall be composed of such regular Baptist Churches as may agree to cooperate by means of messengers, to carry out the object as set forth in Article II of this Constitution; such messengers to present letters of petition for admission from their respective churches.

Section 2: The messengers to the annual session of this Association shall be chosen by their respective churches, such action being certified by the churches in their letters to the Association.

Section 3: Each church composing this Association shall be entitled to three messengers to the annual messenger assembly.

Section 4: Each church shall be the sole judge of her messengers.

ARTICLE IV--NATURE

Section 1: This Association shall be in nature a joint auxiliary to the churches composing it. It is not formed for ecclesiastical end, but merely for benevolent purposes; but it reserves the right to withdraw from any church which becomes heterodox in faith or disorderly in practice.
