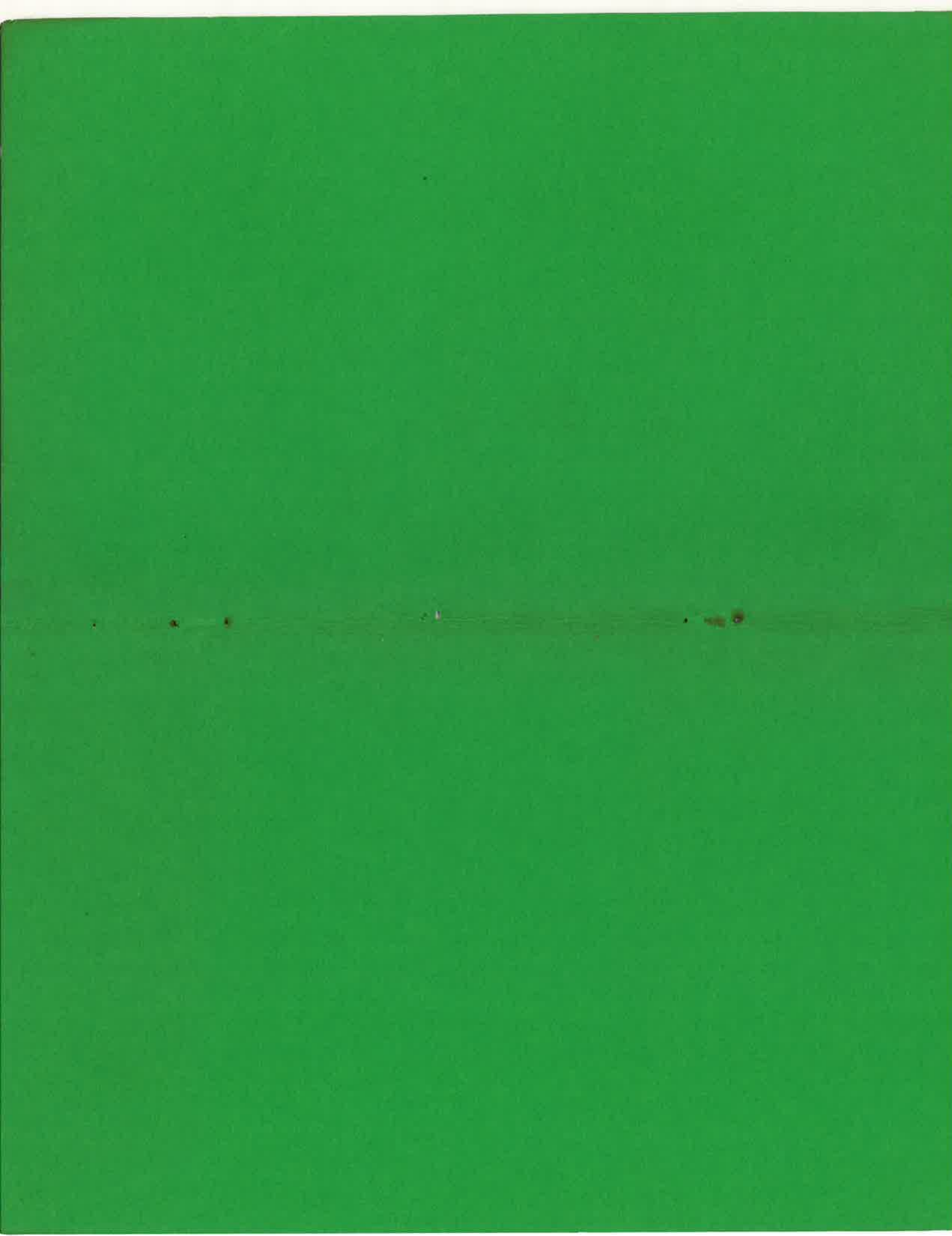

A PETITIONARY LETTER WAS READ FROM OAK RIDGE MISSIONARY BAPTIST CHURCH, CONTINGENT UPON THEIR VOTE SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 13, 1992. THEY EXPRESSED A DESIRE TO ASSOCIATE WITH THE RED RIVER-BOWIE ASSOCIATION BUT THEIR BUSINESS MEETING WOULD FOLLOW THE MEETING OF THE ASSOCIATION. A MOTION CARRIED TO RECEIVE THEM.

WAS NOMINATED AND ELECTED AS THE ALTERNATE.

INVITATIONS FOR THE 1993 MEETING WERE EXTENDED FROM THE FOLLOWING CHURCHES: WARDS CREEK, JOHNTOWN, AND FAITH. JOHNTOWN WAS SELECTED.

BRO. SANDERS CALLED FOR THE STATE MISSIONS REPORT. BRO. EARL REYNOLDS PRESENTED THE REPORT FROM EAST POST OAK. A MOTION WAS MADE TO ACCEPT THIS REPORT. BRO. JAMES EDDINS SPOKE TO THE REPORT ON BEHALF OF BRO. LUTHER CRAWFORD, SECRETARY-TREASURER OF STATE MISSIONS. HE POINTED OUT THE GREAT NEED FOR MORE OFFERINGS AT THE PRESENT TIME. BRO. MARLIN FREEMAN, MISSIONARY TO CENTER, ALSO SPOKE TO THE REPORT.

IT WAS ALSO POINTED OUT AT THIS TIME THAT SISTER LINDA OWENS COULD USE SOME FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOLLOWING THE DEATH OF BRO. PAUL OWENS.

THE MOTION TO ADOPT THE STATE MISSIONS REPORT CARRIED.

THE CHRISTIAN EDUCATION REPORT WAS READ BY BRO. B. T. BAUGH FOR WARDS CREEK. A MOTION WAS MADE TO ADOPT THE REPORT. IT WAS SPOKEN TO BY BRO. FRANK VAUGHN, HENDERSON. HE REPORTED THAT TEXAS BAPTIST INSTITUTE HAD GOTTEN OFF TO A GOOD START THIS YEAR. HE ALSO REPORTED THAT THE MONTHLY OPERATING EXPENSES ARE ABOUT \$22,500 AND ENCOURAGED CONTINUED SUPPORT FOR THE SCHOOL. THE MOTION TO ADOPT THE REPORT CARRIED.

THE MODERATOR CALLED FOR A CONGREGATIONAL SONG. BRO. DANNY LED IN SINGING, "THIS IS MY FATHER'S WORLD", AFTER WHICH BRO. KEVIN PLASTER INTRODUCED BRO. DAVID WILSON TO BRING THE ANNUAL MESSAGE.

BRO. WILSON READ REVELATION 2:1-7 AND SPOKE ON THE THEME OF "LOVE."

BRO. ED PARKER, FROM FAITH, EXTENDED THE HAND OF APPRECIATION TO BRO. WILSON FOR THE MESSAGE AND TO BRO. WIERSEMA FOR THE MORNING DEVOTIONAL.

FOLLOWING ANNOUNCEMENTS, A MOTION CARRIED TO ADJOURN UNTIL 1:00 P.M. BRO. M.J. MCNEIL LED THE DISMISSAL PRAYER.

AFTERNOON SESSION

THE AFTERNOON SESSION OPENED WITH THE CONGREGATION SINGING, "VICTORY IN JESUS." BRO. DAVID BENNETT, MISSIONARY TO ALBANIA, LED IN PRAYER.

THE FOLLOWING BRETHREN SANG, "THE GRACE OF GOD AMAZES ME": JOHN SANDERS, JAMES BROWN, DAVID WILSON, RICKY GANDY, ED PARKER, DANNY STURDIVANT.

THE MODERATOR, BRO. SANDERS, CALLED ON BRO. DAVID BENNETT, MISSIONARY TO THE SOUTH PACIFIC, TO BRING THE AFTERNOON DEVOTIONAL. HE READ ACTS 9:16-17 AND SPOKE WORDS OF INSPIRATION ON THE CALL TO SUFFER FOR CHRIST.

THE REPORT ON INTERSTATE AND FOREIGN MISSIONS WAS CALLED FOR AND READ BY BRO. A. B. KELLUM FOR HOPEWELL. A MOTION WAS MADE TO ADOPT THE REPORT. IT WAS SPOKEN TO BY BRO. BENNETT, BRO. WIERSEMA, BRO. TED BARKER, MISSIONARY TO ALBANIA, AND BRO. BILL JOHNSON. THE NEED FOR AN INCREASE IN OFFERINGS WAS NOTED. THE MOTION TO ADOPT CARRIED.

THE REPORT ON ASSOCIATIONAL MISSIONS WAS CALLED FOR AND READ BY BRO. KEVIN PLASTER FOR NEW HAVEN. A MOTION WAS MADE TO ADOPT THE REPORT. BRO. DANIELS SPOKE, GIVING A BRIEF REPORT ON THE NORTH EAST TEXAS BAPTIST MISSION COUNCIL. BRO. SANDERS SPOKE, EXPRESSING

ARTICLE VI--EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

THIS ASSOCIATION MAY HAVE AN EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE COMPOSED OF ONE MEMBER FROM EACH CHURCH IN THE ASSOCIATION. FIVE MEMBERS OF SAID COMMITTEE SHALL CONSTITUTE A QUORUM, THE MODERATOR OF THE COMMITTEE IS TO PROVIDE LEADERSHIP AND COUNSEL IN CARRYING OUT THE WORK OUTLINED IN THE ANNUAL MESSENGER ASSEMBLY OF THE ASSOCIATION.

ARTICLE VII--AMENDMENTS

TWO-THIRDS OF THE CHURCHES OF THIS ASSOCIATION MUST APPROVE ANY CHANGE OR AMENDMENT OF THIS CONSTITUTION. THE FOLLOWING PROCEDURE SHALL BE FOLLOWED IN ORDER TO CHANGE OR AMEND THE CONSTITUTION: ANY PROPOSED AMENDMENT SHALL BE PRESENTED FOR DISCUSSION IN OPEN SESSION OF THE MESSENGER ASSEMBLY. AFTER DISCUSSION, THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT MAY BE WITHDRAWN ONLY BY CONSENT OF A SIMPLE MAJORITY OF THE MESSENGERS VOTING. OTHERWISE, IT MUST BE REFERRED TO THE CHURCHES OF THE ASSOCIATION. EACH CHURCH MAY THEN VOTE FOR OR AGAINST THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT, EXPRESSING SAID VOTE FOR OR AGAINST IN THE ASSOCIATION LETTER TO THE NEXT ANNUAL SESSION OF THE MESSENGERS. IN THIS MATTER, EACH CHURCH IS ENTITLED TO ONE VOTE.

(CONSTITUTION CONTINUED)

ARTICLE IV--NATURE

SECTION 1: THIS ASSOCIATION SHALL BE IN NATURE A JOINT AUXILIARY TO THE CHURCHES COMPOSING IT. IT IS NOT FORMED FOR ECCLESIASTICAL END, BUT MERELY FOR BENEVOLENT PURPOSES; BUT IT RESERVES THE RIGHT TO WITHDRAW FROM ANY CHURCH WHICH BECOMES HETERODOX IN FAITH OR DISORDERLY IN PRACTICE.

SECTION 2: THIS ASSOCIATION SHALL RECOGNIZE FREEDOM OF SPEECH AS ESSENTIAL TO THE HIGHEST ACHIEVEMENT OF ITS WORK.

ARTICLE V--OFFICERS

SECTION 4: IT SHALL BE THE DUTY OF THE TREASURER TO KEEP A CORRECT RECORD OF ALL MONIES RECEIVED AND DISBURSED, AND TO MAKE A REPORT OF THE SAME TO THE ASSOCIATION DURING ITS ANNUAL SESSION.
