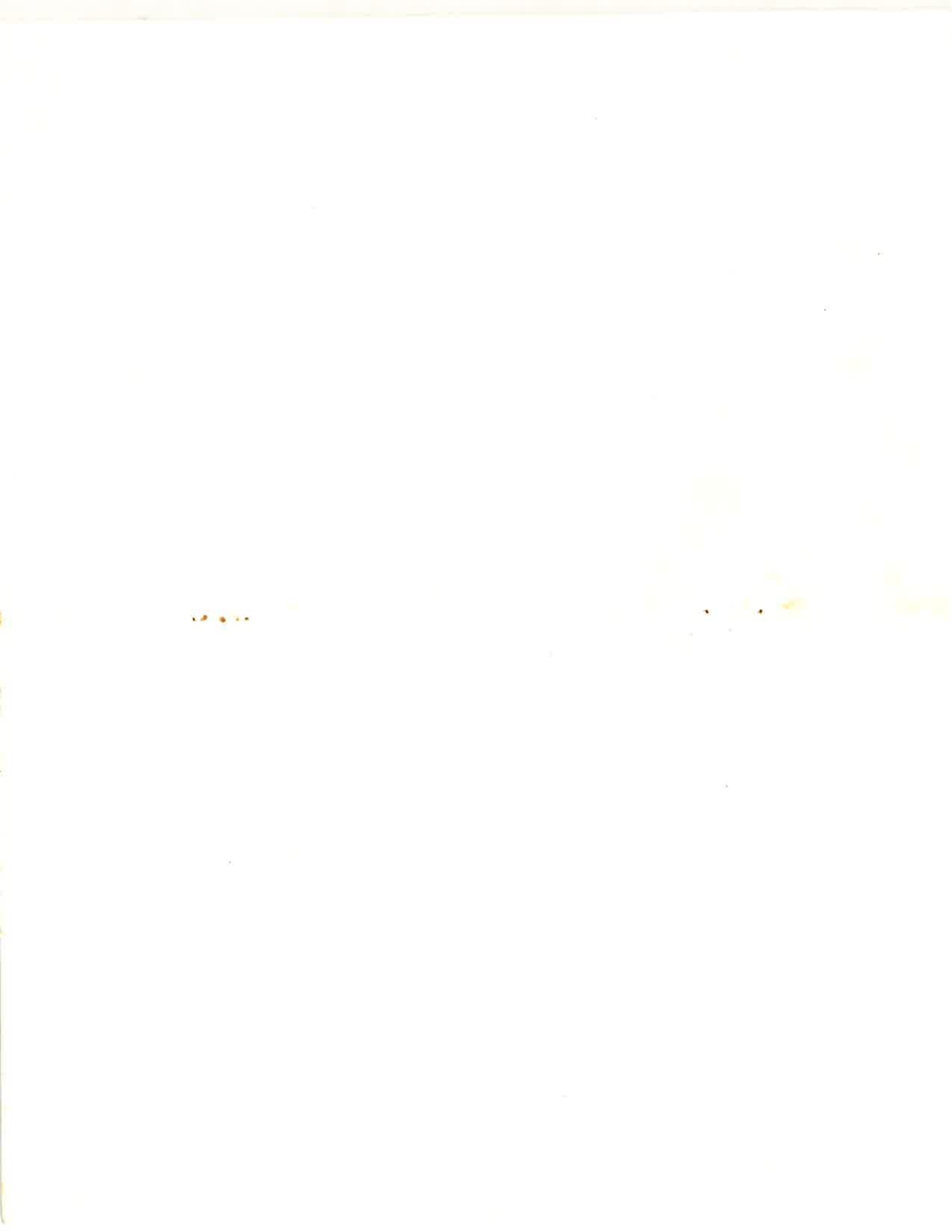

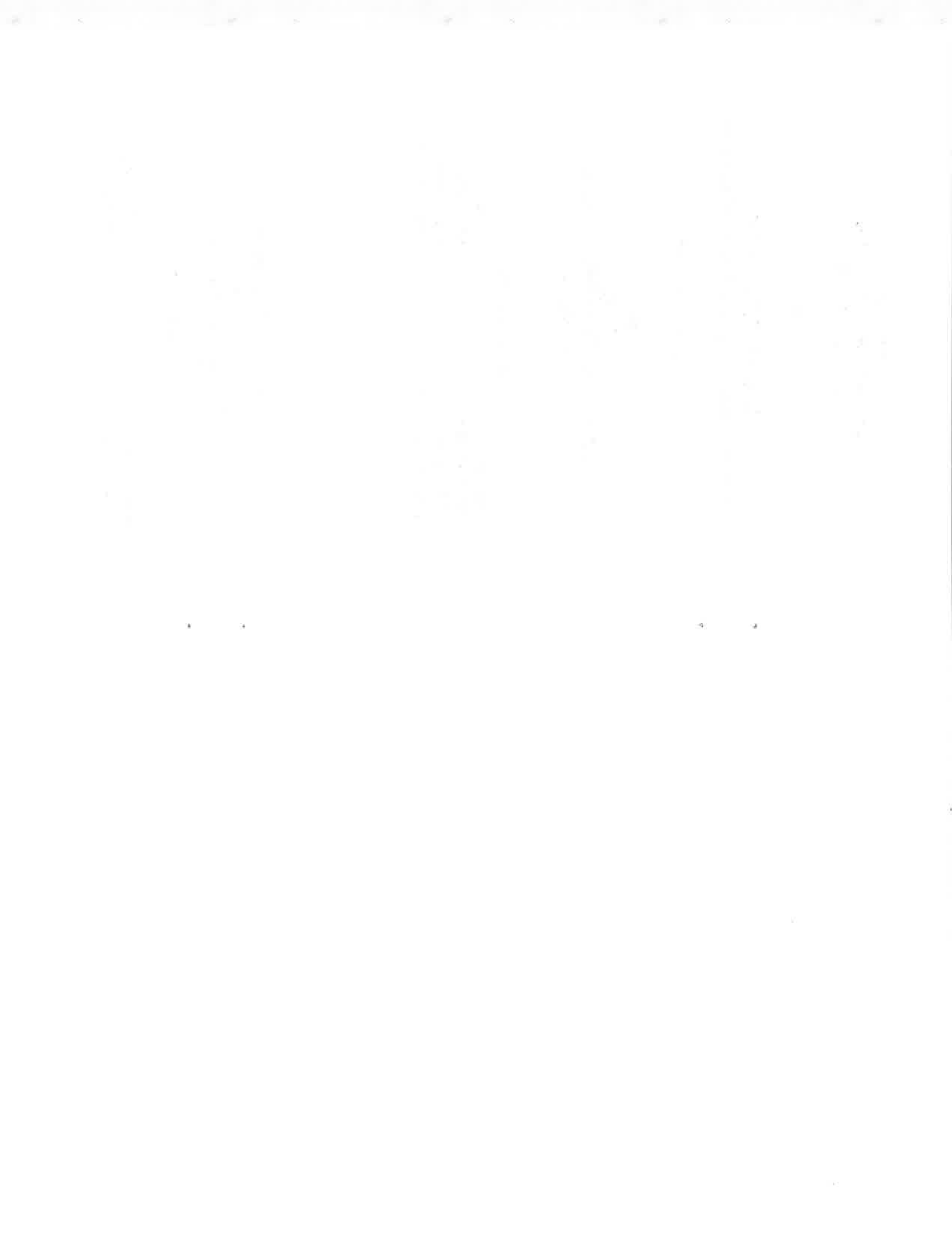

September 12, 1996

Hopewell Missionary Baptist Church

The Annual Messenger Meeting of the Red River - Bowie Missionary Baptist Association was opened with the congregation singing "At Calvary." Bro. Rodney Stevens directed the singing with Bro. Luther Crawford accompanying on the piano. The Moderator, Bro. James Kitchens called for church letters and offerings to be brought to the Clerk during the song. Dr. Ray Brooks led the opening prayer.

The Moderator called on Bro. James Brown, Pastor of Alin Grove Missionary Baptist Church to bring the morning devotion. Bro. Brown read Luke 2:49 and spoke on "The Master's Business." He closed with prayer.

The Moderator asked the congregation to stand and declared the One Hundred Fifty-Third Annual Session of The Red River - Bowie Missionary Baptist Association open for business. Bro. Wayne Stringer led in prayer.

The Moderator then called on the Clerk, Bro. James Brown to read the church letters.

A motion and second was made to have a roll call vote of all the churches. Passed.

Motion and second was made to seat the messengers. Passed.

The report on Temperance was called for by the Moderator. It was read by Bro. E. R. Reynolds, Pastor of East Post Oak MIBC who had prepared the report. Bro. Reynolds moved for the adoption of the report and was seconded by Wayne Stringer. The report was spoken to by Bro. Reynolds. Passed.

The Moderator called for the ABA Literature Report which was prepared by Wards Creek MIBC and read by Pastor Rodney Stevens. Bro. Stevens moved for the adoption of the report and was seconded by Joe Stevens. Passed.

The Moderator called for the Orphans Home Report which was prepared by West Side MIBC and read by Pastor Wayne Stringer. Bro. Stringer moved for the adoption of the report and was seconded by Jonathan McBryer. W. A. Dillard, Administrator of Terarkans Baptist Orphanage spoke to the report. Passed.

The Moderator next called for the report on Aged Ministers Support which was prepared by Pinkham Memorial MIBC and read by Pastor Roddy Jackson. Bro. Jackson moved for the adoption of the report and was seconded by A. B. Kellam. The report was spoken to by Bro. Jackson and W. A. Dillard. Passed.

The Moderator called for the Ladies' Auxiliary Report which was prepared by Johnstown MIBC. The Clerk made a motion that the report be printed in the minutes as it is received in the mail, explaining that Johnstown had completed the report but failed to bring it to the Messenger Meeting. The motion was seconded by A. B. Kellam. Passed.

The Moderator then called for the Men's Brotherhood Report which was prepared by Friendship MIBC and read by Pastor Terry Patterson. Bro. Patterson moved for the adoption of the report and was seconded by Jonathan McBryer. The report was spoken to by Bro. Patterson. Passed.

The Moderator called for the Youth Report which was prepared by Hooks MIBC. Pastor Bill Johnson thanked everyone for the good offering for the Hooks Mission Building Fund, and then read the report. Bro. Johnson moved for the adoption of the report and was seconded by James Brown. The report was spoken to by Bro. Johnson. Passed.

(Clerk's Note: From this point, the minutes are recorded as can best be remembered. The notes taken at the Messenger Meeting have been lost.)

The Treasurers Report was given by A. B. Kellam. Bro. A motion was made for the adoption of the report and was seconded. It was noted that more money is needed for the Radio Program. Passed.

The Moderator called upon Assistant Moderator Joe Stevens to moderate while he gave the Obituary Report as prepared by Austin Chapel MIBC. Bro. Kitchens moved for the adoption of the report which called for a moment of silent prayer in memory of those who had gone to meet the Lord. Seconded and passed.

A report was then given by the special committee that had been asked at last year's Messenger Meeting to meet with the pastor of the Hillcrest Baptist Church. A motion was made to withdraw fellowship from Hillcrest and was seconded. Several in the assembly spoke to the motion. A substitute motion was then made that only those churches who represented by messenger or letter be listed in the Year Book. It was seconded. After some further discussion, the substitute motion

REPORTS SUBMITTED FOR 1996

ASSOCIATIONAL MISSIONS

The very nature of Missionary Baptist Churches is associational. Through our association with other churches of like faith and order, we can do a better job of carrying out the Great Commission given by our Lord. We associate for the specific purpose of promoting mission work. Associational Missions includes all phases of mission work, from local to foreign mission fields.

Missionary Baptist Churches of the Red River - Bowie Association are involved in every phase of associated missions, however, our focus in this report is on local missions. Local associated mission work in this association began more than forty years ago. This writer recalls his father serving as a local missionary for a short period of time in the early fifties. In 1963 the Red River - Bowie Association of Churches joined with the Hopewell and Salem Associations to form the North East Texas Baptist Mission Council. This has proven to be a good way to do associational mission work.

This tri-association organization presently supports mission points in Gilmer and Mt. Pleasant. Delegates from cooperating churches meet once a quarter to be updated on mission blessings and needs, to edify one another and to fellowship.

INTERSTATE AND FOREIGN MISSIONS

Thank you for the opportunity to give a report on Interstate and Foreign Missions. We praise God for the churches' help in spreading the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ into all the world.

By the vote of the messengers in the meeting in Phoenix, Arizona, a total of

145 missionaries were recommended for support through the office in Texarkana. This includes: 32 Interstate Missionaries on Salary, 8 Interstate Missionaries on Designated Funds, 5 Foreign Missionaries on Salary, 15 Foreign Missionaries on Designated Funds, 61 National Missionaries on Salary, and 24 National Missionaries on Designated Funds.

With the increase in the number of missionaries, the five percent increase in salaries for the full salaried missionaries and paying Brother Madden's salary through the year 1996, an additional \$18,000.00 is needed per month above last year. The total monthly payout will be approximately \$106,000.00.

Brethren, for the cause of Christ and the faithful missionaries, we must have a vision of what needs to be done and be busy doing it. Brother Randy Cloud is the newly elected Secretary/Treasurer of Missions. He is aggressively approaching this issue and hopefully the mission money needed will come in from the churches.

Churches are being asked to increase their offerings to help meet the need. Churches which are not supporting with offerings are urged to begin doing so.

ORPHANS HOME

Texarkana Baptist Orphanage is owned by the Missionary Baptist Churches of the state of Arkansas and supported by churches of the American Baptist Association. The Orphanage is operated by a five member board of trustees, elected annually by the Arkansas State Messenger Meeting. Dr. W. A. Dillard, Administrator of the Home, furnished the following report concerning the condition of Texarkana Baptist Orphanage:

This report is submitted to the churches with joy and thanksgiving. The ministry of the churches to orphaned, abandoned, and abused children in need of a home and Christian guidance is blessed. There are sufficient children, staff, and support in place to continue to fulfill its mission. Generally, things at the Home are going well.

Presently, there are thirty children in the Home ranging from age five to seventeen. All are enrolled in public schools and are starting the year off well. At the end of the Spring Semester, thirteen of our children were on honor rolls. This year, we are striving to increase that number. The children are healthy except for minor problems, dental problems, and some counseling needs that are being met. Actually we have had to use the medical community very little. Dr. Joe cloud and his wife, Cherry of Russellville, AR gave all the children and staff medical examinations again this year. Some other medical help is also given to the Home.

In-kind goods continue to be strong. Such help as substantial food gifts, and clothing gifts to the children by their sponsors are a major help in making contributions sufficient for our budget. We are especially grateful for faithful supporters of the Home and the many Vacation Bible Schools who elected to send their offerings to our Home this year. "Children helping children" somehow seems so appropriate.

Due to the generosity of many churches and individuals, the children enjoyed an unprecedented trip of a lifetime to Arizona. The "Grand Canyon Christmas in June" allowed the children to fly on a big jet, sing at the ABA, see the Grand Canyon and other interesting, educational sites, and worship with the Landmark Baptist Church in Prescott Valley, AZ, Stephen Bailey, Pastor. All the children and staff express heartfelt thanks to everyone who helped to give the Home this unusual opportunity.

The needs of the Home continue to be the prayerful support of God's people, offerings to the General Fund, especially as we try to expand and update the aging campus, and replacement staff members from time to time. All are asked to be mindful of this ministry as a tremendous way for churches to minister to needful children in their areas by recommending such children to the Home.

The trustees, staff, and children of the Home express gratitude to all for their support of this great ministry. We encourage prayer, financial, and in-kind support of the Home and its dear children. We also encourage visits to the campus as opportunity allows.

Article VI. Executive Committee

This Association may have an executive committee composed of one member from each church in the Association. Five members of said committee shall constitute a quorum. The Moderator of the committee is to provide leadership and counsel in the carrying out the work outlined in the annual Messenger Assembly of the Association.

Article VII. Amendment

Two-thirds of the churches of this Association must approve any change or amendment to the Constitution. The following procedure shall be followed in order to change or amend the Constitution. Any proposed amendment shall be presented for discussion in open session of the Messenger Assembly. After discussion, the proposed amendment may be withdrawn only by consent of a simple majority of the messengers voting. Otherwise it must be referred to the churches of the Association. Each church may then vote for or against the proposed amendment, expressing said vote for or against in the associational letter to the next annual session of the messengers. In this matter, each church is entitled to one vote.

CONSTITUTION OF THE RED RIVER - BOWIE MISSIONARY BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

Article I. Name

This Association shall be known as the Red River - Bowie Missionary Baptist Association.

Article II. Object

The object of this Association shall be to awaken a deeper interest in the welfare of the Denomination, to cultivate a closer union between the churches, to produce and perpetuate the greatest activity as the Missionary and Education Enterprises, and to widen the scope of Denominational Benevolence.

Article III. Membership

Section 1: This Association shall be composed of such regular Baptist Churches as may agree to cooperate by means of messengers, to carry out the object as set forth in Article II of this Constitution; such messengers to present letters of petition for admission from their respective churches.

Section 2: The messengers to the annual session of this Association shall be chosen by their respective churches, such action being certified by the churches in their letters to the Association.

Section 3: Each church composing this Association shall be entitled to three messengers to the annual Messenger Assembly.

Section 4: Each church shall be the sole judge of her messengers.

Article IV. Nature

Section 1: This Association shall be in nature a joint Auxiliary to the churches composing it. It is not formed for ecclesiastical end, but merely for benevolent purposes; but it reserves the right to withdraw from any church which becomes heterodox in faith to disorderly practice.

Section 2: This Association shall recognize freedom of speech as essential to the highest achievement of its work.

Article V. Officers

Section 1: The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk/Treasurer, and an Assistant Clerk/Treasurer who shall be chosen by the messengers meeting in annual session, and shall hold office for one year, or until their successors are chosen.

Section 2: It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over the messenger assembly, keep order and to discharge such other duties as are incumbent upon this office.

Section 3: It shall be the duty of the Clerk/Treasurer to keep a correct record of each session of the messenger assembly and to have the same published and distributed to the churches as a report of the Association; to keep a
