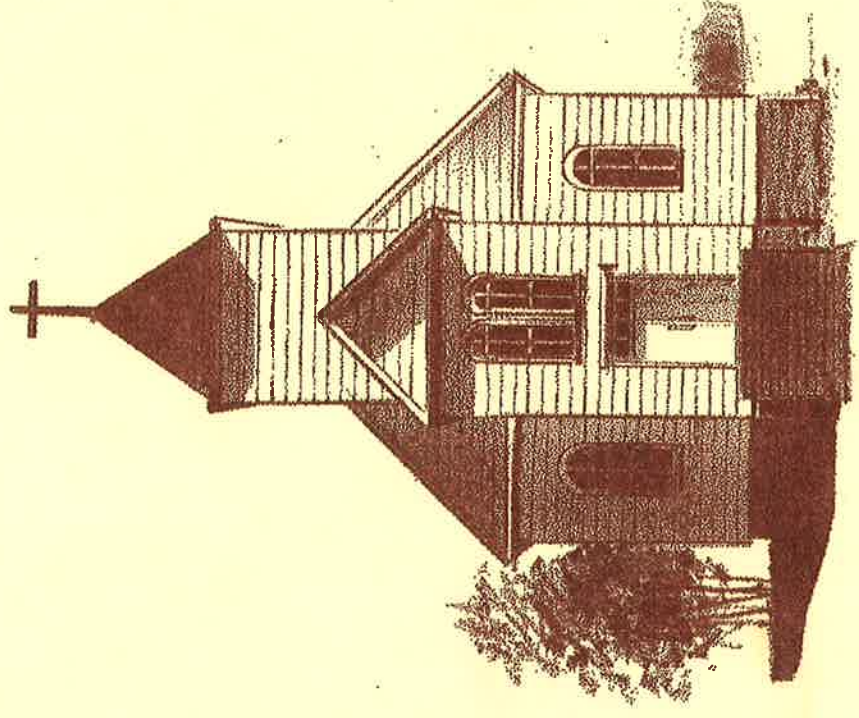

Section 7: Corresponding Secretary and Reporter: (1) To correspond about necessary matters with the officers of this Auxiliary; (2) To report through our religious papers on the activities of this Auxiliary.

Section 8: Bible & Tract Distributor: (1) To solicit funds and receive voluntary offerings for Bible and Tract work; (2) To keep local Auxiliaries informed about the needs for the carrying on of this work; (3) To supply local Auxiliaries with tracts for distribution in their fields of work; (4) To give a financial report each quarter.

ARTICLE IX - MEMBERSHIP

Any woman who is a member of the Auxiliaries of the churches composing the Red River-Bowie Association shall have the right and privilege of membership in the District Ladies' Auxiliary. Four voting messengers shall be allowed from each Auxiliary.

ARTICLE X - CONTRIBUTIONS

All contributions of this Auxiliary shall be raised by voluntary offerings and shall be given to the Treasurer for proper disbursement.

ARTICLE XI - AMENDMENTS

These Articles of Agreement shall not be amended unless the amendment be submitted to the District Auxiliary in a regular meeting and said amendment lay over until the next regular meeting. It then may be adopted only by a two-thirds majority, each church having only one vote.

MESSENGER MEETING
SEPTEMBER 13, 2002
BOGATA MISSIONARY BAPTIST CHURCH**

The 159th annual session of the Red River-Bowie Missionary Baptist Association began with Bro. Perry May leading in the singing of "Send the Light". Bro. John Sanders was the pianist. In the absence of the moderator, and assistant moderator, Bro. Rod Jackson, clerk, opened the meeting by calling on Bro. Mike Mitchell to lead in prayer as the congregation stood.

Bro. Bill Snell was called upon to bring the morning devotional. His subject was "Motivation", and he ended his devotional with a word of prayer.

The moderator called upon Bro. Billy Daniels, host pastor, to give a welcome to the messengers and visitors. One new pastor was introduced- Bro. Bill Snell, pastor of Hillcrest in Paris. Visitors were introduced.

The moderator then called the 2003 meeting of the Red River-Bowie Missionary Baptist Association to order. The assembly stood as Bro. Daniels led in prayer.

Bro. James Hinkle, and Bro. A. B. Kellam were appointed to the Resolutions Committee. Bro. Brown and Bro. Jackson read the church name, and messengers from each church letter.

Officers for 2002-2003 were elected, and they, along with the speaker, alternate, and meeting place, time, and date, are listed on the opening page of these minutes. Concerning the annual speaker, a motion was made and passed that the person receiving the second highest number of votes will serve as alternate.

The Christian Education Report was called for. Bro. Billy Turpin read the report for Jhontown MBC, and moved that the report be adopted. Bro. Ray Brooks, President of Texas Baptist Institute and Seminary spoke to the report, and in his remarks also gave a report

All officers shall be elected annually at the meeting of the second quarter (April). No officer, except the Bible & Tract Distributor, shall succeed herself more than once consecutively.

ARTICLE VII - QUALIFICATIONS

Any lady who is a member of a church in the Red River-Bowie Association, in good standing, and is an active participant in Auxiliary work is qualified to hold office in the District Auxiliary.

ARTICLE VIII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1: President (1) To preside over all District Meetings, that they may be carried on in an orderly manner; (2) To appoint committees as directed by the District meeting; (3) To call special meetings when necessary; (4) To be active in looking after the welfare of the work.

Section 2: Vice President: (1) To preside over the meeting in the absence of the President or when called upon by the president.

Section 3: Recording Secretary: (1) To keep an accurate record of the proceedings of all meetings; (2) To announce special meetings; (3) To prepare and read reports as instructed by this District Auxiliary.

Section 4: Assistant Secretary: (1) To assist the Secretary in whatever manner needed in performing the duties of that office; (2) To act as Secretary in the absence of the Secretary.

Section 5: Treasurer: (1) To receive and disburse funds as designated by this District Auxiliary; (2) To keep accurate records of all funds taken in and dispersed by the Auxiliary.

Section 6: Assistant Treasurer: (1) To assist the treasurer in whatever manner needed in performing the duties of that office; (2) To act as Treasurer in the absence of the Treasurer.

ARTICLE II - DEFINITION

This organization shall be composed of all the Auxiliaries of the churches of the Red River-Bowie Association.

ARTICLE III - PURPOSE

The purpose of this District Auxiliary shall be to further promote the Lord's work and encourage the women of each local church to be more active in all phases of the work in which they have the Scriptural right and responsibility to participate.

ARTICLE IV - TIME AND PLACE

Section 1: This District Auxiliary shall meet quarterly: the 1st Tuesday in the months of January, April, July, and October, or at such time most convenient for the host church.

Section 2: The place of the meeting shall be determined on a rotation basis, based on the alphabetical order of Auxiliaries.

Section 3: On this basis, the Auxiliary which is next in order must be present or send word that they desire to entertain the District Auxiliary, otherwise, the District Auxiliary will go to the next church in order.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS

The officers of this District Auxiliary shall be: (1) President; (2) Vice President; (3) Secretary; (4) Assistant Secretary; (5) Treasurer; (6) Assistant Treasurer; (7) Reporter & Corresponding Secretary; (8) Bible & Tract Distributor; (9) Song Leader; (10) Pianist.

ARTICLE VI - ELECTION OF OFFICERS & TERMS OF OFFICE

Bro. Jackson read the Missions report for Pinkham Memorial and made a motion that the report be adopted. Bro. David Smith with the Macedonian Missionary Services spoke to the report, as did Bro. John Sanders current missionary to Romania, now preparing for a new field of labor in Colorado. Bro. Bryant spoke concerning the A.B.A. International Media Service. Bro. Albert Riggs gave a report on the Echo Hills work in Redwater. Bro. Rusty Denny, pastor of the Mt. Pleasant M.B.C. in Denison, Tx, spoke concerning the mission work in Idaho. Bro. Billy Daniels, Secretary-Treasurer of the North East Texas Baptist Mission Council, reported on the works supported by the mission council. Bro. Brooks also spoke on behalf of two missionaries. The motion to adopt passed.

The Temperance Report was read by Bro. James Hinkle, pastor of New Haven MBC, and moved it's adoption. Motion carried.

The congregation stood and sang "In My Heart There Rings a Melody"

The Orphan's Home Report was called for, and read by Bro. A. B. Kellam, pastor of the Hopewell MBC. And called for it's adoption. Bro. Daniels, trustee of the home, spoke to the report. Motion to adopt passed.

The Ladies Auxiliary Report, prepared by Friendship MBC was read by Bro. Mike Mitchell. He moved the adoption of the report. The report was spoken to by Bro. Brooks and Bro. Jackson. The motion to adopt passed.

The Men's Brotherhood Report was assigned to Pleasant Oaks. Due to the absence of the report, a motion was made and carried to reprint the report from last year's minute book

The Youth Report, was read by Bro. Daniels, pastor of Bogata MBC. He moved that it be adopted. Bro.'s Daniels, Permenter, Johnson, and Jackson spoke to the report. Motion to adopt passed.

Bro. Paul Magness from the Heritage MBC brought the Aged Minister's Report. Bro. Daniels reported on the minister's housing on the TBO property. Bro. Calvin Permenter spoke to the report. Motion for adoption carried.

The Obituary Report was given by Bro. Riggs from Echo Hills. A motion was made to adopt the report, and called for a moment of silent prayer in memory of those listed in the report. After a moment of silent prayer, Bro. James Bunger led the congregation in prayer.

correct record of each session of the messenger assembly and to have the same published and distributed to the churches as a report of the Association, to keep a correct record of all moneys received and disbursed, and to make report of the same to the Association during it's annual session.

ARTICLE VI. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

This Association may have an executive committee composed of one member from each church in the Association. Five members of said committee shall constitute a quorum. The moderator of the committee is to provide leadership and counsel in the carrying out the work outlined in the annual Messenger Assembly of the Association.

ARTICLE VII. AMENDMENT

Two-thirds of the churches of this Association must approve any change or amendment to the Constitution. The following procedure shall be followed in order to change or amend the Constitution. Any proposed amendment shall be presented for discussion in open session of the Messenger Assembly. After discussion, the proposed amendment may be withdrawn only by consent of a simple majority of the messengers voting. Otherwise, it must be referred to the churches of the Association. Each church may then vote for or against the proposed amendment, expressing said vote for or against in the associational letter to the next annual session of the messengers. In this matter, each church is entitled to one vote.

ARTICLE OF AGREEMENT

ARTICLE I - Name

The name of this organization shall be the District Ladies' Auxiliary of the Red River-Bowie Association.

fellowship among the churches, and to encourage and perpetuate the very greatest possible activity in missionary, educational, and benevolent enterprises.

ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP

Section 1: This Association shall be composed of such regular Baptist Churches as may agree to cooperate by means of messengers, to carry out the object as set forth in Article II of the constitution; such messengers to present letters of petition for admission from their respective churches.

Section 2: The messengers to the annual session of this Association shall be chosen by their respective churches in their letters to the association.

Section 3: Each church composing this Association shall be entitled to three messengers to the annual Messenger Assembly.

Section 4: Each church shall be the sole judge of her messengers.

ARTICLE IV. NATURE

Section 1: This Association shall be in nature a joint Auxiliary to the churches composing it. It is not formed for ecclesiastical end, but merely for benevolent purposes, but it reserves the right to withdraw from any church which becomes heterodox in faith to disorderly practice.

Section 2: This Association shall recognize freedom of speech as essential to the highest achievement of it's work.

ARTICLE V. OFFICERS

Section 1: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk/treasurer, an assistant clerk/treasurer who shall be chosen by the messengers meeting in annual session, and shall hold office for one year, or until their successors are chosen.

Section 2: It shall be the duty of the moderator to preside over the messenger assembly, keep order, and to discharge such other duties as are incumbent upon this office.

Section 3: It shall be the duty of the clerk/treasurer to keep a

Let us be mindful that the financial and prayerful support of these mission endeavors goes a long way in bringing souls unto the Lord. As the churches sow the seed of the word, eternity shall reveal the great harvest of souls.

The known harvest of souls from our Interstate and Foreign efforts for the year 2001-2002 is 12, 967 professions of faith. The American Baptist Association of churches contributed a record amount of \$1,963,059.82. Currently there are 145 church-sent missionaries and missionary helpers who were approved for support by the messengers of the churches in June.

Bro. Crawford reports good progress in our state work, with several building projects. Bro. Daniels should report in this meeting on the progress of the works supported through the North East Texas Baptist Mission Council.

May the Lord continue to bless as we continue to support the spread of the gospel message in, and through the Lord's New Testament Churches.

The Apostle Paul informed us that it was by God's grace that we were given "...pastors and teachers; for the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ."
