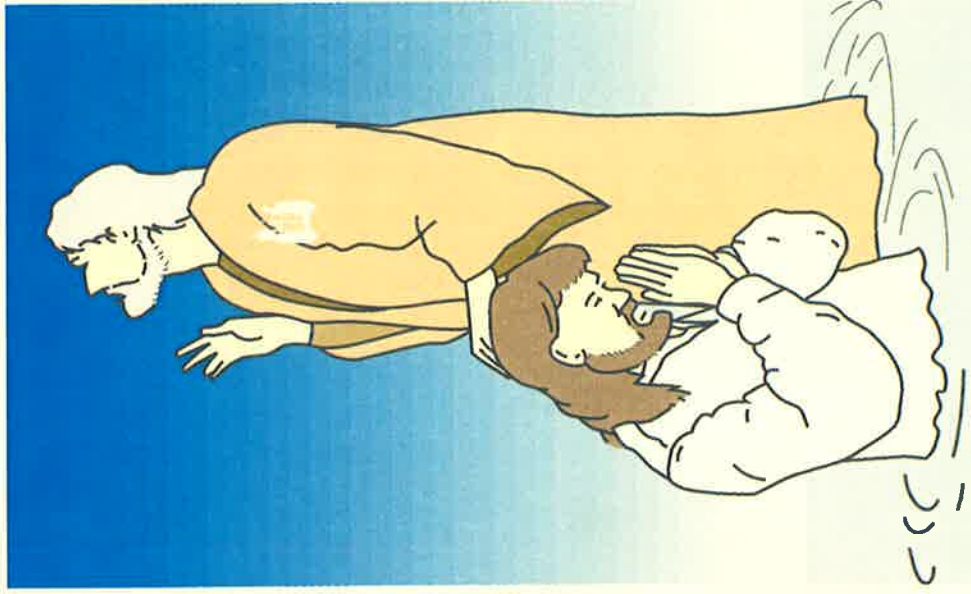

The service was opened with Bro. Jackie Hawkins leading in the singing of "At Calvary". Bro. Billy Daniels, moderator, called on Bro. Wayne Stringer to lead in prayer. Bro. Hawkais led in the singing of "Our Best". Bro. Ronnie Stewart brought the morning devotional from Matthew 28:16-20.

Bro. Rick Gandy, pastor of the host church, gave the welcome on behalf of Hubbard Chapel, and introduced some of the members to the congregation. New pastors in the local association were recognized. The only one present was Bro. Robert Dillon of Wards Creek. Visitors were recognized.

Bro. Daniels called the session to order, and called upon Bro. J. T. McNabb to lead in prayer. The church letters were read. Bro. James Brown moved that the messengers be seated. Bro. Jim Jones and Bro. James Hinkle were elected to the Resolutions Committee. Officers were elected, and they are listed on the opening page of this book. Echo Hills of Red Water was chosen as the meeting place for the 2005 meeting, and Bro. Robert Dillon was elected speaker, with Ray Eastridge serving as alternate for the 2005 meeting. Bro. James Hinkle, from New Haven, delivered the report of the Texarkana Baptist Orphanage and moved its adoption. Bro. Paul Denny, representing the orphanage, spoke to the report, as did Bro. Billy Daniels. The motion carried.

Bro. A. B. Kellam of Hopewell, brought the Temperance Report, and moved that it be adopted. He spoke to the report. The motion to adopt passed.

A motion was made, and seconded, that the Resolution, presented earlier by Bro. Brown from Aikin Grove be taken from the table. A motion was made that this resolution be adopted by the messengers and printed in our minutes of this meeting. Bro. Eastridge moved that the resolution be amended to read "and taught in the Scriptures". The resolution as amended was approved by the messengers, and is printed in its full amended form below:

#### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS; The November general election ballot in Red River County, Texas, will contain a proposition that would legalize the sale of beer and wine for on and off premises consumption; and

WHEREAS; Missionary Baptists believe that the Bible teaches very strongly against the use of alcohol as a beverage as set forth in the Church Covenant and taught in the Scriptures; and

WHEREAS; We believe that homes and families are destroyed by such,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED; that the Messengers representing the Churches of the Red River-Bowie Missionary Baptist Association when convened on September 9, 2004, go on record as being totally opposed to this proposition; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED; that we strongly urge the

#### ARTICLE XI – AMENDMENTS

These Articles of Agreement shall not be amended unless the amendment be submitted to the District Auxiliary in a regular meeting and said amendment lay over until the next regular meeting. It then may be adopted only by a two-thirds majority, each church having only one vote.



Section 4: Assistant Secretary: (1) To assist the Secretary in whatever manner needed in performing the duties of that office; (2) To act as Secretary in the absence of the Secretary.

Section 5: Treasurer: (1) To receive and disburse funds as designated by this District Auxiliary; (2) To keep accurate records of all funds taken in and dispersed by the Auxiliary.

Section 6: Assistant Treasurer: (1) To assist the treasurer in whatever manner needed in performing the duties of that office; (2) To act as Treasurer in the absence of the Treasurer.

Section 7: Corresponding Secretary and Reporter: (1) To correspond about necessary matters with the officers of this Auxiliary; (2) To report through our religious papers on the activities of this Auxiliary.

Section 8: Bible & Tract Distributor: (1) To solicit funds and receive voluntary offerings for Bible and Tract work; (2) To keep local Auxiliaries informed about the needs for the carrying on of this work; (3) To supply local Auxiliaries with tracts for distribution in their fields of work; (4) To give a financial report each quarter.

#### **ARTICLE IX – MEMBERSHIP**

Any woman who is a member of the Auxiliaries of the churches composing the Red River-Bowie Association shall have the right and privilege of membership in the District Ladies' Auxiliary. Four voting messengers shall be allowed from each Auxiliary.

#### **ARTICLE X – CONTRIBUTIONS**

All contributions of this Auxiliary shall be raised by voluntary offerings and shall be given to the Treasurer for proper disbursement.

## REPORTS SUBMITTED FOR 2004

### MISSIONS REPORT

*"And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature." Mark 16:15*

Webster defines "missions" as "An instance or act of sending; an assignment or task to be carried out." Even a cursory glance at the Great Commission exposes both nuances of this definition.

"Go ye into all the world..." Incredibly, each church of the living God is privileged to be the recipient of this imperative. From the neighbor next door, to the furthest reaches of the globe, Jesus established the boundaries of our responsibility as being without geographic limitation.

## ARTICLE V - OFFICERS

The officers of this District Auxiliary shall be: (1) President; (2) Vice President; (3) Secretary; (4) Assistant Secretary; (5) Treasurer; (6) Assistant Treasurer; (7) Reporter & Corresponding Secretary; (8) Bible & Tract Distributor; (9) Song Leader; (10) Pianist.

## ARTICLE VI - ELECTION OF OFFICERS & TERMS OF OFFICE

All officers shall be elected annually at the meeting of the second quarter (April). No officer, except the Bible & Tract Distributor, shall succeed herself more than once consecutively.

## ARTICLE VII - QUALIFICATIONS

Any lady who is a member of a church in the Red River-Bowie Association, in good standing, and is an active participant in Auxiliary work is qualified to hold office in the District Auxiliary.

## ARTICLE VIII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1: President (1) To preside over all District Meetings, that they may be carried on in an orderly manner; (2) To appoint committees as directed by the District meeting; (3) To call special meetings when necessary; (4) To be active in looking after the welfare of the work.

Section 2: Vice President: (1) To preside over the meeting in the absence of the President or when called upon by the president.

Section 3: Recording Secretary: (1) To keep an accurate record of the proceedings of all meetings; (2) To announce special meetings; (3) To prepare and read reports as instructed by this District Auxiliary.

## **RED RIVER-BOWIE DISTRICT LADIES' AUXILIARY**

### **ARTICLE OF AGREEMENT**

#### **ARTICLE I - Name**

The name of this organization shall be the District Ladies' Auxiliary of the Red River-Bowie Association.

#### **ARTICLE II - DEFINITION**

This organization shall be composed of all the Auxiliaries of the churches of the Red River-Bowie Association.

#### **ARTICLE III - PURPOSE**

The purpose of this District Auxiliary shall be to further promote the Lord's work and encourage the women of each local church to be more active in all phases of the work in which they have the Scriptural right and responsibility to participate.

#### **ARTICLE IV - TIME AND PLACE**

Section 1: This District Auxiliary shall meet quarterly: the 1<sup>st</sup> Tuesday in the months of January, April, July, and October, or at such time most convenient for the host church.

Section 2: The place of the meeting shall be determined on a rotation basis, based on the alphabetical order of Auxiliaries.

Section 3: On this basis, the Auxiliary which is next in order must be present or send word that they desire to entertain the District Auxiliary, otherwise, the District Auxiliary will go to the next church in order.

## **MEN'S BROTHERHOOD REPORT**

According to Webster's dictionary, "brotherhood" is defined as "quality or state of being brothers, and a fellowship or alliance". If a local New Testament church is going to shine as a light on a hill for God, she must have a strong fellowship of Christian brothers. ## ARTICLE V. OFFICERS

Section 1: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk/treasurer, an assistant clerk/treasurer who shall be chosen by the messengers meeting in annual session, and shall hold office for one year, or until their successors are chosen.

Section 2: It shall be the duty of the moderator to preside over the messenger assembly, keep order, and to discharge such other duties as are incumbent upon this office.

Section 3: It shall be the duty of the clerk/treasurer to keep a correct record of each session of the messenger assembly and to have the same published and distributed to the churches as a report of the Association, to keep a correct record of all moneys received and disbursed, and to make report of the same to the Association during it's annual session.

## ARTICLE VI. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

This Association may have an executive committee composed of one member from each church in the Association. Five members of said committee shall constitute a quorum. The moderator of the committee is to provide leadership and counsel in the carrying out the work outlined in the annual Messenger Assembly of the Association.

## ARTICLE VII. AMENDMENT

Two-thirds of the churches of this Association must approve any change or amendment to the Constitution. The following procedure shall be followed in order to change or amend the Constitution. Any proposed amendment shall be presented for discussion in open session of the Messenger Assembly. After discussion, the proposed amendment may be withdrawn only by consent of a simple majority of the messengers voting. Otherwise, it must be referred to the churches of the Association. Each church may then vote for or against the proposed amendment, expressing said vote for or against in the associational letter to the next annual session

# CONSTITUTION OF THE RED RIVER-BOWIE MISSIONARY BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

## ARTICLE I. NAME

The Association shall be known as the Red River-Bowie Missionary Baptist Association.

## ARTICLE II. OBJECT

The object of this Association shall be to awaken a deeper interest in the welfare of the churches, to cultivate a closer fellowship among the churches, and to encourage and perpetuate the very greatest possible activity in missionary, educational, and benevolent enterprises.

## ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP

Section 1: This Association shall be composed of such regular Baptist Churches as may agree to cooperate by means of messengers, to carry out the object as set forth in Article II of the constitution; such messengers to present letters of petition for admission from their respective churches.

Section 2: The messengers to the annual session of this Association shall be chosen by their respective churches in their letters to the association.

Section 3: Each church composing this Association shall be entitled to three messengers to the annual Messenger Assembly.

Section 4: Each church shall be the sole judge of her messengers.

## ARTICLE IV. NATURE

Section 1: This Association shall be in nature a joint Auxiliary to the churches composing it. It is not formed for ecclesiastical end, but merely for benevolent purposes, but it reserves the right to withdraw from any church which becomes heterodox in faith to disorderly practice.

Section 2: This Association shall recognize freedom of speech as essential to the highest achievement of it's work.
