Messenger Meeting
September 10, 2009
Aikin Grove Missionary
Baptist Church**

Bro. James Brown opened this year's meeting by leading the congregation in the singing of "O How I Love Jesus". Bro. Billy Daniels led in prayer. Bro. James Hinkle, Moderator, called upon Bro. Jonathan Simons, pastor of New Haven MBC, to bring the devotional. Bro. Simons read from Acts 11:23. Bro. James Brown, pastor of Aikin Grove MBC was recognized to give the welcome to the messengers. Visitors were recognized. New pastors in the association were recognized. They are: Bro. Jonathan Simons at New Haven, Bro. Albert Riggs at Echo Hills (Bro. Riggs has served Echo Hills as missionary for several years, but now that they have organized into a New Testament Church, he is no longer missionary, but pastor of that Church). Bro. Hinkle called the session to order, and Bro. John Bryant led in prayer. Bro. Hinkle asked if reports were ready and those to present them present. A motion was passed to reprint from the previous year's minutes these reports: Ladies' Auxiliary, Men's Brotherhood, Christian Education. Bro. Bobby Peek was appointed to give the Obituary Report. Bro. Henry Blackmon was appointed by the moderator as a "one-man" Resolution Committee. Bro. Bro. Calvin Permenter read the Aged Ministers Report and made a motion that it be adopted. The report was spoken to by Bro. Permenter, Bro. Daniels, and Bro. John Paul Jones. Motion to adopt passed. Bro. Permenter then made a motion to receive a special offering at this meeting to be disbursed equally among 6 of the aged and non-full-time pastoring ministers of this association. The Obituary Report was read by Bro. Bobby Peek, who in memory of those departed, said a prayer for their families.

The Treasurer's Report was read by Bro. Brown, who made a motion that it be adopted. Included in the motion was to pay the clerk \$350.00 plus expenses. Motion carried.

Reports were assigned for the 2010 meeting, and they are listed on page 3 of these minutes.

Bro. Henry Blackmon read a resolution of thanks to the Aikin Grove Church for the good job of hosting this meeting and for the good meal to follow. Motion to adopt the resolution carried.

Announcements were heard, and following a motion for

Section 4: Assistant Secretary: (1) To assist the Secretary in whatever manner needed in performing the duties of that office; (2) To act as Secretary in the absence of the Secretary.

Section 5: Treasurer: (1) To receive and disburse funds as designated by this District Auxiliary; (2) To keep accurate records of all funds taken in and dispersed by the Auxiliary.

Section 6: Assistant Treasurer: (1) To assist the treasurer in whatever manner needed in performing the duties of that office; (2) To act as Treasurer in the absence of the Treasurer.

Section 7: Corresponding Secretary and Reporter: (1) To correspond about necessary matters with the officers of this Auxiliary; (2) To report through our religious papers on the activities of this Auxiliary.

Section 8: Bible & Tract Distributor: (1) To solicit funds and receive voluntary offerings for Bible and Tract work; (2) To keep local Auxiliaries informed about the needs for the carrying on of this work; (3) To supply local Auxiliaries with tracts for distribution in their fields of work; (4) To give a financial report each quarter.

ARTICLE IX - MEMBERSHIP

Any woman who is a member of the Auxiliaries of the churches composing the Red River-Bowie Association shall have the right and privilege of membership in the District Ladies' Auxiliary. Four voting messengers shall be allowed from each Auxiliary.

ARTICLE X - CONTRIBUTIONS

All contributions of this Auxiliary shall be raised by voluntary offerings and shall be given to the Treasurer for proper disbursement.

ARTICLE XI - AMENDMENTS

These Articles of Agreement shall not be amended unless the amendment be submitted to the District Auxiliary in a regular meeting and said amendment lay over until the next regular meeting. It then may be adopted only by a two-thirds majority, each church having only one vote.

Section 2: The place of the meeting shall be determined on a rotation basis, based on the alphabetical order of Auxiliaries.
Section 3: On this basis, the Auxiliary which is next in order must be present or send word that they desire to entertain the District Auxiliary, otherwise, the District Auxiliary will go to the next church in order.

ARTICLE V – OFFICERS

The officers of this District Auxiliary shall be: (1) President; (2) Vice President; (3) Secretary; (4) Assistant Secretary; (5) Treasurer; (6) Assistant Treasurer; (7) Reporter & Corresponding Secretary; (8) Bible & Tract Distributor; (9) Song Leader; (10) Pianist.

ARTICLE VI – ELECTION OF OFFICERS &

TERMS OF OFFICE

All officers shall be elected annually at the meeting of the second quarter (April). No officer, except the Bible & Tract Distributor, shall succeed herself more than once consecutively.

ARTICLE VII – QUALIFICATIONS

Any lady who is a member of a church in the Red River-Bowie Association, in good standing, and is an active participant in Auxiliary work is qualified to hold office in the District Auxiliary.

ARTICLE VIII – DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1: President (1) To preside over all District Meetings, that they may be carried on in an orderly manner; (2) To appoint committees as directed by the District meeting; (3) To call special meetings when necessary; (4) To be active in looking after the welfare of the work.

Section 2: Vice President: (1) To preside over the meeting in the absence of the President or when called upon by the president.

Section 3: Recording Secretary: (1) To keep an accurate record of the proceedings of all meetings; (2) To announce special meetings; (3) To prepare and read reports as instructed by this District Auxiliary.

TEMPERANCE REPORT

Paul wrote to the church at Corinth and said, "Let all things be done decently and in order." I Cor. 14:30. When we consider this statement, we can see the need for temperance in the lives of the members of the Lord's churches, and, of course, the actions of a church as the body of Christ.

The word "temperance" means "temperate", and these words are so translated in the Bible six times. Five of the times they are used, the same Greek word is involved with a different ending. With the context calling for the word temperance or temperate as noted in the following scriptures.

"And as he reasoned of righteousness, temperance, and judgment to come, Felix trembled, and answered, Go thy way for this time, when I have a convenient season, I will call on thee." Acts 24:25.

"Meekness, temperance; against such there is no law." Gal. 5:23

And to knowledge temperance, and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness." II Peter 1:6

ARTICLE VII. AMENDMENT

Two-thirds of the churches of this Association must approve any change or amendment to the Constitution. The following procedure shall be followed in order to change or amend the Constitution. Any proposed amendment shall be presented for discussion in open session of the Messenger Assembly. After discussion, the proposed amendment may be withdrawn only by consent of a simple majority of the messengers voting. Otherwise, it must be referred to the churches of the Association. Each church may then vote for or against the proposed amendment, expressing said vote for or against in the associational letter to the next annual session of the messengers. In this matter, each church is entitled to one vote.

Red River-Bowie District Ladies' Auxiliary Articles of Agreement

ARTICLE I - Name

The name of this organization shall be the District Ladies' Auxiliary of the Red River-Bowie Association.

ARTICLE II - DEFINITION

This organization shall be composed of all the Auxiliaries of the churches of the Red River-Bowie Association.

ARTICLE III - PURPOSE

The purpose of this District Auxiliary shall be to further promote the Lord's work and encourage the women of each local church to be more active in all phases of the work in which they have the Scriptural right and responsibility to participate.

ARTICLE IV - TIME AND PLACE

Section 1: This District Auxiliary shall meet quarterly: the 1st Tuesday in the months of January, April, July, and October, or at such time most convenient for the host church.

Section 3: Each church composing this Association shall be entitled to three messengers to the annual Messenger Assembly.

Section 4: Each church shall be the sole judge of her messengers.

ARTICLE IV. NATURE

Section 1: This Association shall be in nature a joint Auxiliary to the churches composing it. It is not formed for ecclesiastical end, but merely for benevolent purposes, but it reserves the right to withdraw from any church which becomes heterodox in faith to disorderly practice.

Section 2: This Association shall recognize freedom of speech as essential to the highest achievement of it's work.

ARTICLE V. OFFICERS

Section 1: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk/treasurer, an assistant clerk/treasurer who shall be chosen by the messengers meeting in annual session, and shall hold office for one year, or until their successors are chosen.

Section 2: It shall be the duty of the moderator to preside over the messenger assembly, keep order, and to discharge such other duties as are incumbent upon this office.

Section 3: It shall be the duty of the clerk/treasurer to keep a correct record of each session of the messenger assembly and to have the same published and distributed to the churches as a report of the Association, to keep a correct record of all moneys received and disbursed, and to make report of the same to the Association during it's annual session.

ARTICLE VI. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

This Association may have an executive committee composed of one member from each church in the Association. Five members of said committee shall constitute a quorum. The moderator of the committee is to provide leadership and

CONSTITUTION OF THE
RED RIVER-BOWIE MISSIONARY
BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I. NAME
The Association shall be known as the Red River-Bowie Missionary Baptist Association.

ARTICLE II. OBJECT

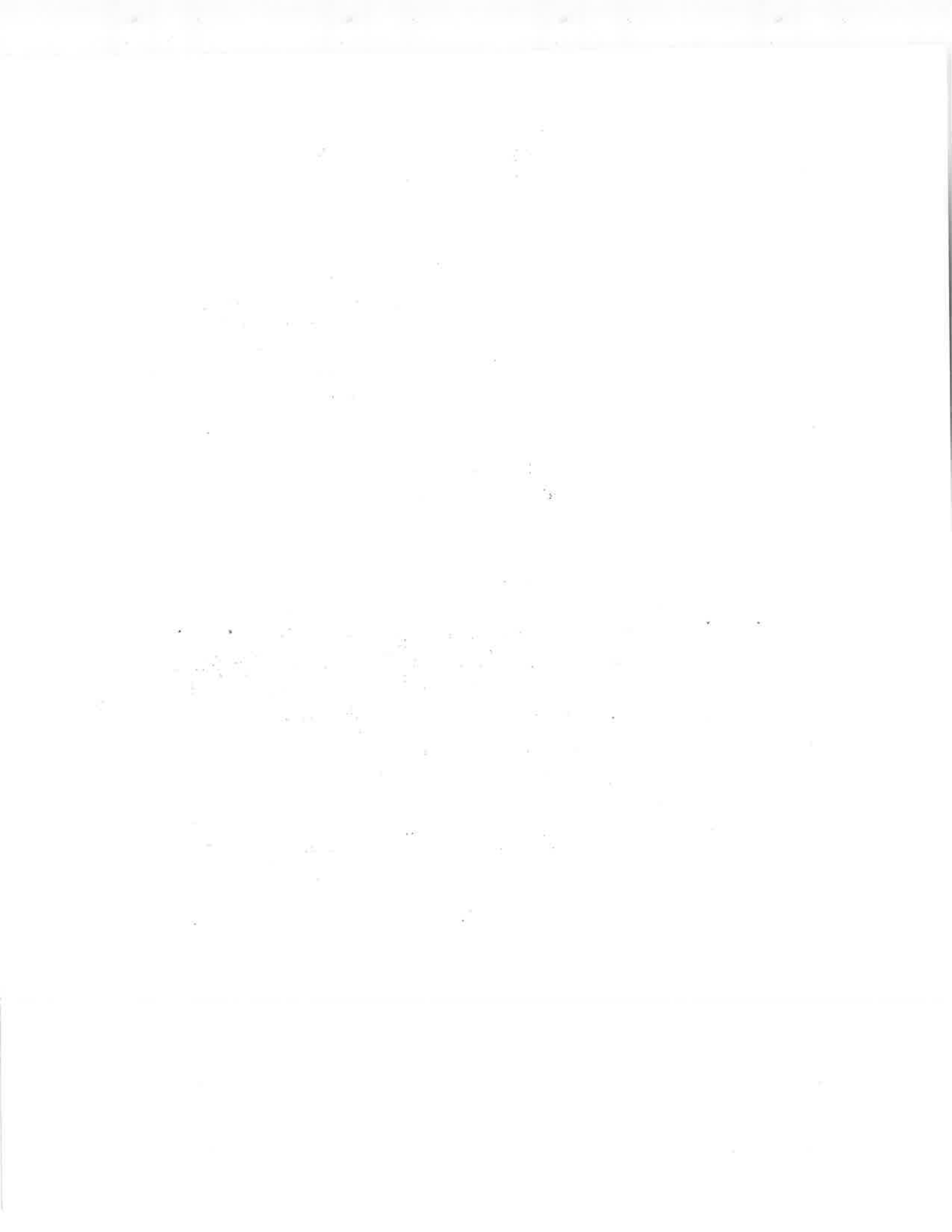
