REPORTS SUBMITTED FOR 2012 MISSIONS REPORT

Jesus said unto the first church just before He departed this earth "...ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth." (Acts 1:8) Mission work is the work of taking the witness of the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ to lost souls who need to be saved from their sin. It is true churches duty and privilege to taking the gospel into their community, city, county, state, country, and world.

The Lord's churches need to remember that the light that shines the farthest shines the brightest at home. Our work starts in communities and radiates out into the world through mission work. That is why Baptist people started forming associations of churches so that they could pool resources to help God called men on the field. TEMPERANCE REPORT (Reprint)

We see in the scriptures the word "temperance" in Galatians 5:23 in a list of the fruits of the Spirit. This list is given in contrast to the works of the flesh given in Galatians 5:19-21. We learn that temperance is a quality of the Christian's life when the individual yields him/herself to the governing of the Holy Spirit as opposed to the lusts of the flesh when one walks according to the flesh.

The word "temperance" is described as self-control, self-rule, or moderation. The word translated temperance in the Greek means "in strength of power". Thus the word means to govern, control, or restrain the natural expression of self and sin. We understand that this is done with the aid and power of the Holy Spirit, and that man is incapable of any good thing. Romans 7:18.

The churches of this association exist in a culture that is enslaved to the lusts and passions of the flesh. This is evident in the rate of divorce which plagues even Christian families, the compulsive gambler, and teen pregnancy. These only scratch the surface of the compounding improprieties of this society. The control of the natural compulsion of our flesh should set us apart as the people and churches of God.

Temperance has been defined as abstinence from intoxicating drinks, but it must be understood as more than that. It is an abstinence from all things that would defile or corrupt the purity which God wants us to have. This certainly includes abstaining from alcohol, but also a host of various temptations and sins which keep us from being the people God wants us to be.

Section 4: Assistant Secretary: (1) To assist the Secretary in whatever manner needed in performing the duties of that office; (2) To act as Secretary in the absence of the Secretary.

Section 5: Treasurer: (1) To receive and disburse funds as designated by this District Auxiliary; (2) To keep accurate records of all funds taken in and dispersed by the Auxiliary.

Section 6: Assistant Treasurer: (1) To assist the treasurer in whatever manner needed in performing the duties of that office; (2) To act as Treasurer in the absence of the Treasurer.

Section 7: Corresponding Secretary and Reporter: (1) To correspond about necessary matters with the officers of this Auxiliary; (2) To report through our religious papers on the activities of this Auxiliary.

Section 8: Bible & Tract Distributor: (1) To solicit funds and receive voluntary offerings for Bible and Tract work; (2) To keep local Auxiliaries informed about the needs for the carrying on of this work; (3) To supply local Auxiliaries with tracts for distribution in their fields of work; (4) To give a financial report each quarter.

ARTICLE IX – MEMBERSHIP

Any woman who is a member of the Auxiliaries of the churches composing the Red River-Bowie Association shall have the right and privilege of membership in the District Ladies' Auxiliary. Four voting messengers shall be allowed from each Auxiliary.

All contributions of this Auxiliary shall be raised by voluntary offerings and shall be given to the Treasurer for proper disbursement.

ARTICLE XI – AMENDMENTS

These Articles of Agreement shall not be amended unless the amendment be submitted to the District Auxiliary in a regular meeting and said amendment lay over until the next regular meeting. It then may be adopted only by a two-thirds majority, each church having only one vote.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION REPORT

Christian education is to be, first of all, a personal discipline. Paul told Timothy, "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." II Tim. 2:15. Spending time alone with the Lord in regular studies of the Bible, and daily prayer is the beginning of knowing what it is that God requires and wants of believers in Jesus Christ. ARTICLE IV - TIME AND PLACE

Section 1: This District Auxiliary shall meet quarterly: the 1st Tuesday in the months of January, April, July, and October, or at such time most convenient for the host church.

ARTICLE VII - QUALIFICATIONS

Any lady who is a member of a church in the Red River-Bowie Association, in good standing, and is an active participant in Auxiliary work is qualified to hold office in the District Auxiliary.

ARTICLE VIII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1: President (1) To preside over all District Meetings, that they may be carried on in an orderly manner; (2) To appoint committees as directed by the District meeting; (3) To call special meetings when necessary; (4) To be active in looking after the welfare of the work.

Section 2: Vice President: (1) To preside over the meeting in the absence of the President or when called upon by the President.

Section 3: Recording Secretary: (1) To keep an accurate record of the proceedings of all meetings; (2) To announce special meetings; (3) To prepare and read reports as instructed by this

ARTICLE VI. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

This Association may have an executive committee composed of one member from each church in the Association. Five members of said committee shall constitute a quorum. The moderator of the committee is to provide leadership and counsel in the carrying out the work outlined in the annual Messenger Assembly of the Association.

ARTICLE VII. AMENDMENT

Two-thirds of the churches of this Association must approve any change or amendment to the Constitution. The following procedure shall be followed in order to change or amend the Constitution. Any proposed amendment shall be presented for discussion in open session of the Messenger Assembly. After discussion, the proposed amendment may be withdrawn only by consent of a simple majority of the messengers voting. Otherwise, it must be referred to the churches of the Association. Each church may then vote for or against the proposed amendment, expressing said vote for or against in the associational letter to the next annual session of the messengers. In this matter, each church is entitled to one vote.

CONSTITUTION OF THE RED RIVER-BOWIE MISSIONARY BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I. NAME

The Association shall be known as the Red River-Bowie Missionary Baptist Association.

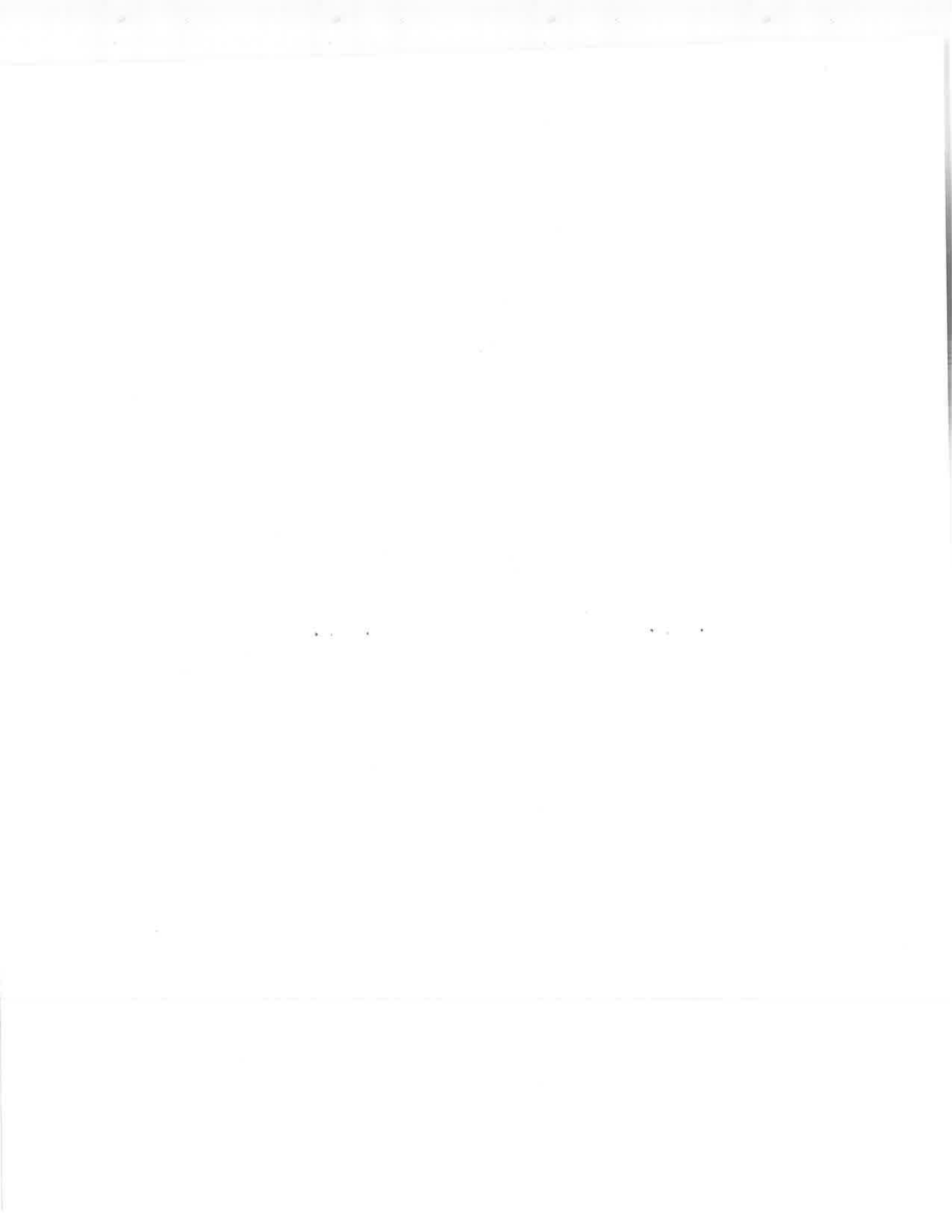
