for 2014, with Bro. Truman Campbell being elected as alternate speaker.

The Echo Hills Missionary Baptist Church was selected to host the 2014 meeting. The time for the meeting was set for Thursday, September 11, 2014 at 9:00 a.m.

Why are so many men turning away from church? One major reason may be that the church has turned away from ministering to the special needs of men.

TEMPERANCE REPORT

We see in the scriptures the word "temperance" in Galatians The "Temperance Movement" began as a mass movement in the late 18th and early 19th centuries. Its purpose was to warn and speak against drunkenness and the excessive use of alcohol, and encouraging total abstinence.

Carrie Nation, a lady from Kansas standing 6 feet tall and weighing 175 pounds, with a stern countenance, became one of the movement's first leaders. With a hatchet in hand, she would enter the alcohol-serving establishments and attack the property by smashing the bar with the hatchet. She described herself as "a bulldog running along at the feet of Jesus, barking at what he doesn't like." Soon signs appeared in most alcohol-serving establishments that read, "All nations welcome, except Carrie."

The churches of the day also began to preach temperance, and the yearly report on temperance at Missionary Baptist association meetings is a continuation of the movement of that

day.

While we should not use the same methods as Miss Nation, we should still attack the acceptance of alcohol use by "barking against it as a bulldog", for it is still something Jesus does not like. Alcohol use still brings great harm to lives, and we, the Lord's churches, should always preach against its use. Of course we would fare better if we practice temperance in most things.

moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk/treasurer, an assistant clerk/treasurer who shall be chosen by the messengers meeting in annual session, and shall hold office for one year, or until their successors are chosen.

Section 2: It shall be the duty of the moderator to preside over the messenger assembly, keep order, and to discharge such other duties as are incumbent upon this office.

Section 3: It shall be the duty of the clerk/treasurer to keep a correct record of each session of the messenger assembly and to have the same published and distributed to the churches as a report of the Association, to keep a correct record of all moneys received and disbursed, and to make report of the same to the Association during it's annual session.

ARTICLE VI. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

This Association may have an executive committee composed of one member from each church in the Association. Five members of said committee shall constitute a quorum. The moderator of the committee is to provide leadership and counsel in the carrying out the work outlined in the annual Messenger Assembly of the Association.

ARTICLE VII. AMENDMENT

Two-thirds of the churches of this Association must approve any change or amendment to the Constitution. The following procedure shall be followed in order to change or amend the Constitution. Any proposed amendment shall be presented for discussion in open session of the Messenger Assembly. After discussion, the proposed amendment may be withdrawn only by consent of a simple majority of the messengers voting. Otherwise, it must be referred to the churches of the Association. Each church may then vote for or against the proposed amendment, expressing said vote for or against in the associational letter to the next annual session of the messengers. In this matter, each church is entitled to one vote.

CONSTITUTION OF THE RED RIVER-BOWIE MISSIONARY BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I. NAME

The Association shall be known as the Red River-Bowie Missionary Baptist Association.

ARTICLE II. OBJECT

The object of this Association shall be to awaken a deeper interest in the welfare of the churches, to cultivate a closer fellowship among the churches, and to encourage and perpetuate the very greatest possible activity in missionary, educational, and benevolent enterprises.

ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP

Section 1: This Association shall be composed of such regular Baptist Churches as may agree to cooperate by means of messengers, to carry out the object as set forth in Article II of the constitution; such messengers to present letters of petition for admission from their respective churches.

Section 2: The messengers to the annual session of this Association shall be chosen by their respective churches in their letters to the association.

Section 3: Each church composing this Association shall be entitled to three messengers to the annual Messenger Assembly.

Section 4: Each church shall be the sole judge of her messengers.

ARTICLE IV. NATURE

Section 1: This Association shall be in nature a joint Auxiliary to the churches composing it. It is not formed for ecclesiastical end, but merely for benevolent purposes, but it reserves the right to withdraw from any church which becomes heterodox in faith to disorderly practice.

Section 2: This Association shall recognize freedom of speech as essential to the highest achievement of it's work.

ARTICLE V. OFFICERS

Section 1: The officers of this Association shall be a

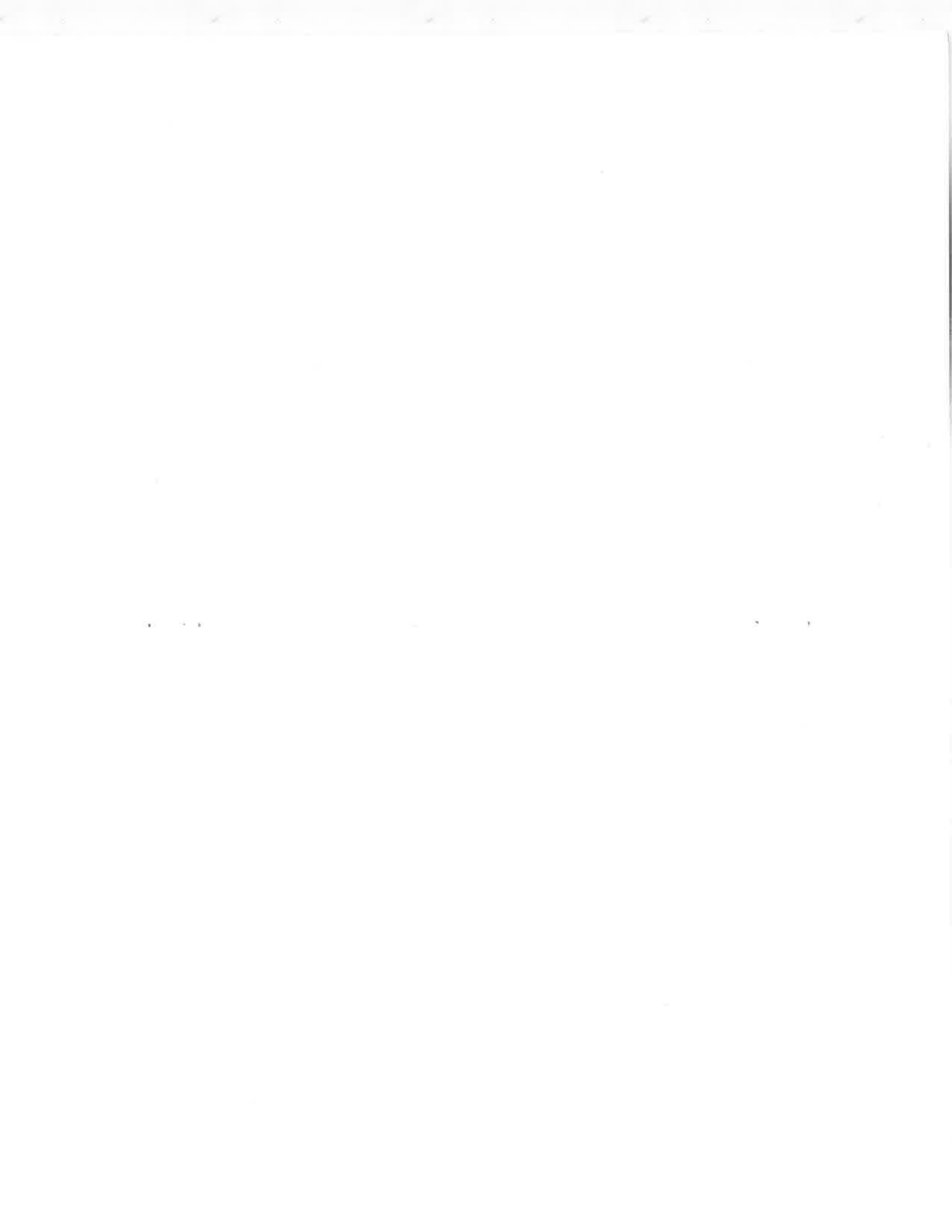
