 Section 5: Treasurer: (1) To receive and disburse funds as designated by this District Auxiliary; (2) To keep accurate records of all funds taken in and dispersed by the Auxiliary.
 Section 6: Assistant Treasurer: (1) To assist the treasurer in whatever manner needed in performing the duties of that office; (2) To act as Treasurer in the absence of the Treasurer.
 Section 7: Corresponding Secretary and Reporter: (1) To correspond about necessary matters with the officers of this Auxiliary; (2) To report through our religious papers on the activities of this Auxiliary.

Section 8: Bible & Tract Distributor: (1) To solicit funds and receive voluntary offerings for Bible and Tract work; (2) To keep local Auxiliaries informed about the needs for the carrying on of this work; (3) To supply local Auxiliaries with tracts for distribution in their fields of work; (4) To give a financial report each quarter.

ARTICLE IX – MEMBERSHIP

Any woman who is a member of the Auxiliaries of the churches composing the Red River-Bowie Association shall have the right and privilege of membership in the District Ladies' Auxiliary. Four voting messengers shall be allowed from each Auxiliary.

ARTICLE X – CONTRIBUTIONS

All contributions of this Auxiliary shall be raised by voluntary offerings and shall be given to the Treasurer for proper disbursement.

ARTICLE XI – AMENDMENTS

These Articles of Agreement shall not be amended unless the amendment be submitted to the District Auxiliary in a regular meeting and said amendment lay over until the next regular meeting. It then may be adopted only by a two-thirds majority, each church having only one vote.

Minutes of 2014 Messenger Meeting

Red River-Bowie District Ladies' Auxiliary Articles of Agreement

ARTICLE I – Name

The name of this organization shall be the District Ladies' Auxiliary of the Red River-Bowie Association.

ARTICLE II - DEFINITION

This organization shall be composed of all the Auxiliaries of the churches of the Red River-Bowie Association.

ARTICLE III – PURPOSE

The purpose of this District Auxiliary shall be to further promote the Lord's work and encourage the women of each local church to be more active in all phases of the work in which they have the Scriptural right and responsibility to participate.

ARTICLE IV – TIME AND PLACE

Section 1: This District Auxiliary shall meet quarterly: the 1st Tuesday in the months of January, April, July, and October, or at such time most convenient for the host church.

Section 2: The place of the meeting shall be determined on a rotation basis, based on the alphabetical order of Auxiliaries.

Section 3: On this basis, the Auxiliary which is next in order must be present or send word that they desire to entertain the District Auxiliary; otherwise, the District Auxiliary will go to the next church in order.

ARTICLE V – OFFICERS

The officers of this District Auxiliary shall be: (1) President; (2) Vice President; (3) Secretary; (4) Assistant Secretary; (5) Treasurer; (6) Assistant Treasurer; (7) Reporter & Corresponding Secretary; (8) Bible & Tract Distributor; (9) Song Leader; (10) Pianist.

ARTICLE VI – ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND TERMS OF OFFICE

All officers shall be elected annually at the meeting of the second quarter (April). No officer, except the Bible & Tract Distributor, shall succeed herself more than once consecutively.

ARTICLE VII – QUALIFICATIONS

Any lady who is a member of a church in the Red River-Bowie Association, in good standing, and is an active participant in Auxiliary work is qualified to hold office in the District Auxiliary.

ARTICLE VIII – DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1: President (1) To preside over all District Meetings, that they may be carried on in an orderly manner; (2) To appoint committees as directed by the District meeting; (3) To call special meetings when necessary; (4) To be active in looking after the welfare of the work.

Section 2: Vice President: (1) To preside over the meeting in the absence of the President or when called upon by the president.

Section 3: Recording Secretary: (1) To keep an accurate record of the proceedings of all meetings; (2) To announce special meetings; (3) To prepare and read reports as instructed by this District Auxiliary.

Section 4: Assistant Secretary: (1) To assist the Secretary in whatever manner needed in

Section 4: Each church shall be the sole judge of her messengers.

ARTICLE IV. NATURE

Section 1: This Association shall be in nature a joint Auxiliary to the churches composing it. It is not formed for ecclesiastical end, but merely for benevolent purposes, but it reserves the right to withdraw from any church which becomes heterodox in faith to disorderly practice.

Section 2: This Association shall recognize freedom of speech as essential to the highest achievement of it's work.

ARTICLE V. OFFICERS

Section 1: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk/treasurer, an assistant clerk/treasurer who shall be chosen by the messengers meeting in annual session, and shall hold office for one year, or until their successors are chosen.

Section 2: It shall be the duty of the moderator to preside over the messenger assembly, keep order, and to discharge such other duties as are incumbent upon this office.

Section 3: It shall be the duty of the clerk/treasurer to keep a correct record of each session of the messenger assembly and to have the same published and distributed to the churches as a report of the Association; to keep a correct record of all moneys received and disbursed, and to make report of the same to the Association during it's annual session.

ARTICLE VI. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

This Association may have an executive committee composed of one member from each church in the Association. Five members of said committee shall constitute a quorum. The moderator of the committee is to provide leadership and counsel in the carrying out the work outlined in the annual Messenger Assembly of the Association.

ARTICLE VII. AMENDMENT

Two-thirds of the churches of this Association must approve any change or amendment to the Constitution. The following procedure shall be followed in order to change or amend the Constitution. Any proposed amendment shall be presented for discussion in open session of the Messenger Assembly. After discussion, the proposed amendment may be withdrawn only by consent of a simple majority of the messengers voting. Otherwise, it must be referred to the churches of the Association. Each church may then vote for or against the proposed amendment, expressing said vote for or against in the associational letter to the next annual session of the messengers. In this matter, each church is entitled to one vote.

As we support missionaries in far-away places, let us not forget that missions begin at home with us sharing the message of salvation to our neighbors.

A Men's Brotherhood refers to men of the church joining together to accomplish a common goal of organizing men to assist in the ministries of the church, to strengthen their spiritual walk, family values, and church involvement, to assist all men in leading, protecting, and providing for the needs of their families as well as others.

As important as Men's Brotherhoods are, they are fast disappearing from many churches today. As a result, we are also seeing many churches having to depend upon the ladies of the church to keep things moving forward; in fact, in most churches today men are not even a main focus among the ministries of the church. There are women's ministries, women's conferences, women's Bible studies, women's retreats, but who is committed to developing men of excellence and integrity through sound biblical teaching, mentoring, and meaningful fellowship.

Men's Brotherhoods need to teach men that they can become true disciples of Christ; men that know the Lord and live in obedience to God's word. Proverbs 27:17 says, "As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another." In other words, it takes one man, ministering and mentoring another to reach them for Christ and help develop them to become men, husbands, fathers, and spiritual leaders God expects us to be.

The statement has been made, "If you win a man's heart, his hands will follow." Men's Brotherhood allows men to help each other discover how we are uniquely called and shaped by God to live out the Great Commandment and to fulfill the Great Commission.

We must get the men of our churches, as well as our communities actively involved in

the ministries of the church. A recent survey revealed that if the first person in an unchurched family to attend church is a child, the probability that the rest of the family will follow is 3-5%, if it is the mother, it is 17%, but if it is the father, the percentage that the rest of the family will follow is 93%.

Why are so many men turning away from church? One major reason may be that the church has turned away from ministering to the needs of men.

TEMPERANCE REPORT

Galatians 5:22-23, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, Meekness, temperance; against such there is no law."

In Galatians 5:22-23, the word "fruit" is singular and in complemented by nine other words which identify the one fruit. These characteristics are available to all people who have truly repented of sin and put their faith in the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Each of the nine should be clearly visible, at least to some degree, in the lives of saved people.

The word "temperance" completes the list. One definition of temperance is "self-control" or "habitual moderation in regard to the indulgence of the natural appetites and passions". The Apostle Paul wanted churches of Galatia (and the churches of our day) to know that we are to allow the Holy Spirit within us to control our lives so that we practice, live, and display temperance.

The lives of more than one saint are not characterized by temperance, but the lack thereof. We now live in a time when moral relativism, humanistic doctrine, and an increasingly militant secularism is not simply on the horizon, but at hand. We hear little of temperance, but much about something called "tolerance", which according to the world, is the latest and greatest virtue. "Tolerance" has been redefined to mean that man is free to indulge in whatever pleases him, and that he is never to be told that he is wrong. However, the truth is that God calls us not to the indulgence of tolerance, but to the fruit of temperance. If we will allow the Holy Spirit within us to direct us, all within the boundaries of the Scriptures, we shall be equipped for the works that God has in store for us, and we can truly be people who reflect His light to a world that seems to be a little darker each day.
