**THE MINUTES OF THE 2015
REDD RIVER-BOWIE
MISSIONARY BAPTIST ASSOCIATION
SEPTEMBER 10, 2015
FRIENDSHIP MISSIONARY BAPTIST CHURCH**

Bro. Don McPherson, Moderator called upon Billy Daniels to lead in prayer after the singing of "Blessed Assurance". The welcome was extended by Bro. Bobby Peek, pastor of Friendship, the host church. The devotional from Hebrews 11:5 was given by James Bunger.

The moderator declared the meeting in session and called upon John Bryant to lead in prayer. The moderator asked that Bro. Blackmon and Bro. Jackson to read from the church letters the names of messengers and alternates. Bro James Brown was appointed to receive and report any resolutions to the body.

Officers for the 2015-2016 associational year were elected. They are listed on the opening page of these minutes. Bro. Tommy Horn was elected to bring the annual sermon, with Joe Looney serving as alternate. The Pinkham Memorial Baptist Church was selected to host the 2016 meeting. The time for the meeting was set for September 8, 2016 at 9:00 am.

The giving of reports was called for. The missions report from Friendship was read by Bro. Bobby Peak who made the motion that it be adopted by the messengers. The report was spoken to by Curtis Gilbert (MBA of Texas), Brother Billy Daniels (NETMC), David Proctor (Emmaus), Wayne Stringer (PMD), Don McPherson, Ronnie Steward (Landmark), and John Bryant (ABA Media). The motion to adopt carried.

The Christian Education Report will be reprinted from last year. Bro Robert Wallace spoke to this report representing TBI.

The Children's Home report from Echo Hills was given by Truman Campbells, who made the motion that the report be adopted. The motion carried. Bro. Billy Daniels spoke to this report being a trustee of the children's home in Texarkana, TX.

The Temperance Report from East Post Oak MBC was read by Henry Blackmon who made the motion that the report be adopted. This report was spoken to by Henry Blackmon and Rick Gandy. The motion to adopt carried.

The Ladies Auxiliary Report from Bogata MBC was given by Bro. Daniels who made the motion to adopt the report. The report was

To act as secretary in the absence of the Secretary.

Section 5: Treasurer: (1) To receive and disburse funds as designated by this District Auxiliary; (2) To keep accurate records of all funds taken in and dispersed by the Auxiliary.

Section 6: Assistant Treasurer: (1) To assist the treasurer in whatever manner needed in performing the duties of that office. (2) To act as Treasurer in the absence of the Treasurer.

Section 7: Corresponding Secretary and Reporter: (1) To correspond about necessary matters with the officers of this Auxiliary; (2) To report through our Religious Papers on the activities of this Auxiliary.

Section 8: Bible and Tract Distributor: (1) To solicit funds and receive voluntary offerings for Bible and tract work; (2) To keep local Auxiliaries informed about the needs for the carrying on of this work; (3) To supply local Auxiliaries with tracts for distribution in their fields of work; (4) To give a financial report each quarter.

ARTICLE IX - Membership
Any woman who is a member of the Auxiliaries of the churches composing the Red River - Bowie Association shall have the right and privilege of membership in the District Ladies' Auxiliary. Four voting members shall be allowed from each Auxiliary.

ARTICLE X - Contributions
All contributions of this Auxiliary shall be raised by voluntary offering and shall be given to the treasurer for proper disbursement.

ARTICLE XI - Amendments
These Articles of Agreement shall not be amended unless the amendment be submitted to the District Auxiliary in a regular meeting and said amendment lay over until the next meeting. It then may be adopted only by two-thirds majority, each church having only one vote.

ARTICLE III – Purpose

The purpose of this District Auxiliary shall be to further promote the Lord's work and encourage the women of each local church to be more active in all phases of the work in which they have the Scriptural right and responsibility to participate.

ARTICLE IV – Time and Place

Section 1: This District Auxiliary shall meet quarterly: the 1st Tuesday in the months of January, April, July, and October, or such time most convenient to the host church.

Section 2: The place of meeting shall be determined on a rotation basis, based on the alphabetical order of the Auxiliaries.

Section 3: On this basis, the Auxiliary which is next in order must be present or send word that they desire to entertain the District Auxiliary, otherwise, the District Auxiliary will go to the next church in order.

ARTICLE V – Officers

The officers of this District Auxiliary shall be (1) President; (2) Vice-president; (3) Secretary; (4) Assistant Secretary; (5) Treasurer; (6) Assistant Treasurer; (7) Reporter and Corresponding Secretary; (8) Bible and Tract Distributor; (9) Song Leader; (10) Pianist.

ARTICLE VI – Election of officers and terms of office

All officers shall be elected annually at the meeting of the second quarter (April). No officer, except the Bible and Tract Distributor, shall succeed herself more than once consecutively.

ARTICLE VII – Qualifications

Any Lady who is a member of a church in the Red River-Bowie Association, in good standing, and in active participant in Auxiliary work is qualified to hold office in the District Auxiliary.

ARTICLE VIII – Duties of Officers

Section 1: President: (1) To preside over all District Meetings, that they may be carried on in an orderly manner; (2) To appoint committees as directed by the District meeting; (3) To call special meetings when necessary; (4) To be active in looking after the welfare of the work.

Section 2: Vice President: To preside over the meeting in the absence of the president or when called upon by the president.

Section 3: Recording Secretary: (1) To keep an accurate record of the proceedings of all meetings; (2) To announce special meetings; (3) To prepare and read reports as instructed by this District Auxiliary.

Section 4: Assistant Secretary: (1) To assist the secretary in whatever manner needed in performing the duties of that office; (2)

Bro. Billy Daniels made a motion that all reports that were not given be reprinted from last years' minutes. The motion carried.

The annual sermon was preached by Bro. Terral Neely from Luke 24:13-32 entitled "Longing for Heart Burn". Bro. Blackmon extended the hand of appreciation to Bro Bunger for the devotional and Bro. Neely for the annual sermon.

Reports were assigned for 2016 meeting, and they are listed on page 3 of these minutes.

Bro James Brown read a resolution of thanks to the Friendship MBC for her hospitality. A motion and second were made to adopt this resolution. The resolution was adopted.

Prayer requests and announcements were heard following a motion to adjournment, Bro. Roger's from Ward's Creek dismissed the assembly in prayer.

Missions Report

The purpose of our Lord's New Testament churches is directly stated in Matthew 28:18 - 20: And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. 19 Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: 20 Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen. This Great Commission, as it is commonly called, is found in various forms throughout the Gospels and also in the Book of Acts 1:8 wherein Christ stated (in part), "ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth." Thus, the work of the Lord's churches is to spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ throughout the world.

Every scriptural New Testament church has been commissioned to engage in a mission program that encompasses the entire world. This mission work includes the uttermost parts of the earth, but also our nation, states, and local cities. The Lord's churches, through association, can do much in carrying out the Lord's work. Section 2: This Association shall recognize freedom of speech as essential to the highest achievement of its work.

ARTICLE V. OFFICERS

Section 1: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk/treasurer, an assistant clerk/treasurer who shall be chosen by the messengers meeting in annual session, and shall hold office for one year, or until their successors are chosen.

Section 2: It shall be the duty of the moderator to preside over the messenger assembly, keep order, and to discharge such other duties as are incumbent upon this office.

Section 3: It shall be the duty of the clerk/treasurer to keep a correct record of each session of the messenger assembly and to have the same published and distributed to the churches as a report of the Association, to keep a correct record of all moneys received and disbursed, and to make a report of the same to the Association during its annual session.

ARTICLE VI. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

This association may have an executive committee composed of one member from each church of the Association. Five members of said committee shall constitute a quorum. The moderator of this committee is to provide leadership and counsel in the carrying out of the work outlined in the annual Messenger Assembly of the Association.

ARTICLE VII. AMMENDMENT

Two-thirds of the churches of this association must approve any change or amendment to the Constitution. The following procedure shall be followed in order to change or amend the Constitution. Any proposed amendment shall be presented for discussion in open session of the Messenger Assembly. After discussion, the proposed amendment may be withdrawn only by consent of a simple majority of the messengers voting. Otherwise, it must be referred to the churches of the association. Each church may then vote for or against in the association letter to the next annual session of the messengers. In this matter, each church is entitled to one vote.

CONSTITUTION OF THE RED RIVER-BOWIE MISSIONARY BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I. NAME

The Association shall be known as the Red River-Bowie Missionary Baptist Association.

ARTICLE II. OBJECT

We have a major job ahead, and that is to secure churches for tomorrow by mentoring our youth of today.
