The Temperance Report, the Ladies' Auxiliary Report, and the Men's Brotherhood Report was reprinted from 2015. Bro. James Bunger spoke to the Men's Brotherhood Report as he was concerned for the fellowship among the brethren.

The Youth Report from New Haven was given by Bro. Dennis McClintic. The report was spoken to by the following: Bro. Robert Wallace from TBI and Youth Frameworks; Bro. Mark Simmons from Johntown; and Bro. Joey Williams from Bogota. The Youth Report was adopted.

The Aged Minister Report from New Hope was read by Bro. Henry Blackmon and was adopted.

The Treasurer's Report was read by Bro. Henry Blackmon. The report was spoken to by Bro. Henry Blackmon explaining the negative balance. Bro. Dennis McClintic motioned to discontinue the radio program. Bro. James Brown and others discussed the scope of the radio program's outreach. Suggestions were made to carry out the program differently. The motion carried with some opposition.

A motion was made to reprint reports not given from 2015. The motion carried.

Officers for 2016-2017 associational year were elected. (See opening pages for officers elected.) Bro. Joey Williams was elected to bring the annual sermon with Bro. John Rodgers serving as an alternate. The Avery Missionary Baptist Church was selected to host the 2017

meeting. The date and time was set for Thursday, September 7th at 9:00am. The Resolution was given by Bro. James Bunger. The report was as follows: "The messengers of the churches of Red River Bowie Missionary Baptist Association met for a productive session at the Pinkham Memorial Missionary Baptist Church in Dekalb, Texas, and were royally treated and well-fed with every need met. Therefore, be it resolved that we give a hearty rising vote of thanks to the church."

Bro. James Bunger was asked to introduce the speaker Bro. Joe Looney. Bro. Looney preached from Ezekiel 2:1-10 and his message was titled "An Old Testament Example of What Pastors Must Face." His message encouraged God's messengers as they go in to this evil world.

## RED RIVER-BOWIE DISTRICT LADIES' AUXILIARY

### ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT

#### ARTICLE I – Name

The name of this organization shall be the District Ladies' Auxiliary of the Red River-Bowie Association.

#### ARTICLE II – Definition

This organization shall be composed of all the Auxiliaries of the churches of the Red River-Bowie Association.

#### ARTICLE III – Purpose

The purpose of this District Auxiliary shall be to further promote the Lord's work and encourage the women of each local church to be more active in all phases of the work in which they have the Scriptural right and responsibility to participate.

#### ARTICLE IV – Time and Place

Section 1: This District Auxiliary shall meet quarterly: the 1st Tuesday in the months of January, April, July, and October, or such time most convenient to the host church.

Section 2: The place of meeting shall be determined on a rotation basis, based on the alphabetical order of the Auxiliaries.

Section 3: On this basis, the Auxiliary which is next in order must be present or send word that they desire to entertain the District Auxiliary, otherwise, the District Auxiliary will go to the next church in order.

#### ARTICLE V – Officers

The officers of this District Auxiliary shall be (1) President; (2) Vice-president; (3) Secretary; (4) Assistant Secretary; (5) Treasurer; (6) Assistant Treasurer; (7) Reporter and Corresponding Secretary; (8) Bible and Tract Distributor; (9) Song Leader; (10) Pianist.

#### ARTICLE VI – Election of officers and terms of office

All officers shall be elected annually at the meeting of the second quarter (April). No officer, except the Bible and Tract Distributor, shall succeed herself more than once consecutively.

#### ARTICLE VII – Qualifications

Any Lady who is a member of a church in the Red River-Bowie Association, in good standing, and in active participant in Auxiliary work is qualified to hold office in the District Auxiliary.



session, and shall hold office for one year, or until their successors are chosen.

Section 2: It shall be the duty of the moderator to preside over the messenger assembly, keep order, and to discharge such other duties as are incumbent upon this office.

Section 3: It shall be the duty of the clerk/treasurer to keep a correct record of each session of the messenger assembly and to have the same published and distributed to the churches as a report of the Association, to keep a correct record of all moneys received and disbursed, and to make a report of the same to the Association during its annual session.

#### ARTICLE VI. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

This association may have an executive committee composed of one member from each church of the Association. Five members of said committee shall constitute a quorum. The moderator of this committee is to provide leadership and counsel in the carrying out of the work outlined in the annual Messenger Assembly of the Association.

#### ARTICLE VII. AMMENDMENT

Two-thirds of the churches of this association must approve any change or amendment to the Constitution. The following procedure shall be followed in order to change or amend the Constitution. Any proposed amendment shall be presented for discussion in open session of the Messenger Assembly. After discussion, the proposed amendment may be withdrawn only by consent of a simple majority of the messengers voting. Otherwise, it must be referred to the churches of the association. Each church may then vote for or against in the association letter to the next annual session of the messengers. In this matter, each church is entitled to one vote.

### The Missions Report

## CONSTITUTION OF THE RED RIVER-BOWIE MISSIONARY BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

### ARTICLE I. NAME

The Association shall be known as the Red River-Bowie Missionary Baptist Association.

### ARTICLE II. OBJECT

The object of this Association shall be to awaken a deeper interest in the welfare of the churches, to cultivate a closer relationship among the churches, and to encourage and perpetuate the greatest possible activity in missionary, educational, and benevolent enterprises.

### ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP

Section 1: This Association shall be composed of such regular Baptist Churches as may agree to cooperate by means of messengers, to carry out the object as set forth in article II of the constitution; such messengers to present letters of petition for admission from their respective churches.

Section 2: The messengers to the annual session of this association shall be chosen by their respective churches in their letters to the association.

Section 3: Each church composing this Association shall be entitled to three messengers to the annual Messenger Assembly.

Section 4: Each church shall be the sole judge of her messengers.

### ARTICLE IV. NATURE

Section 1: This Association shall be in nature a joint Auxiliary to the churches composing it. It is not formed for ecclesiastical end, but merely for benevolent purposes, but it reserves the right to withdraw from any church which becomes heterodox in faith to disorderly practice.

Section 2: This Association shall recognize freedom of speech as essential to the highest achievement of its work.

### ARTICLE V. OFFICERS

Section 1: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk/treasurer, an assistant clerk/treasurer who shall be chosen by the messengers meeting in annual
