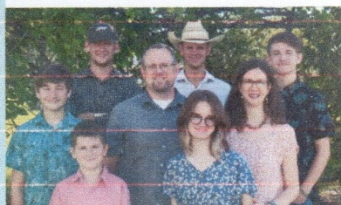

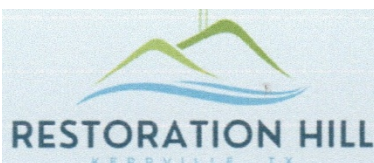

Missions Report 8/31/25

To our Faithful Partners,

Hello and thank you taking a moment to read about what God has been doing at Restoration Hill. The last month has been very exciting. We have been watching God work through us and His people to begin to build a new church here in the Texas Hill Country.

Since the completion of the major outreach in July, we have had a group of 10 or more that have faithfully shown up every Sunday, with our highest attendance being 18. We have been typically averaging around 14. Although there are certainly people who will come and go and be inconsistent just like any other church, the primary variation in attendance has more to do with some of the kids that come having to spend every other weekend in another area. However, God has blessed us with enough kids that we have begun to do children's church to allow the adults a chance to focus during Bible study, and give the kids a more age-appropriate lesson. Our new lesson series on the Sermon on the Mount has been very well received, and we are seeing spiritual growth.



With the increase in people comes an increase in ministry needs. Rapid growth often causes us to do things that we weren't quite prepared for to meet the needs of the church. With that in mind, we made the decision to go ahead and continue to hold services in the event center located at JCRV. It is where we held the outreach and it more than suits our needs. The owner has made a very affordable pricing arrangement that I wouldn't get anywhere else. While its cost is low, it's still a cost that we did not previously have. With more people in attendance each week, the cost of providing breakfast has tripled. We once spent about \$15 each week and now spend about \$50. Along with that there is a need for church related storage. Items that we purchased for the outreach as well as ongoing church items needed a place to be kept safely. That prompted the need for a storage unit that we acquired to house those items. Although we are very blessed to have great pricing on these things, all of this and more drive the monthly cost of operating the church higher. These are all good problems to have, but problems that must have a solution. The only solution at this point is finding additional monthly funds through new monthly partners who feel led to support this work. Please be in prayer about how God might use your church to assist us in this financial need.

Please be in prayer for us and the work here in Kerrville. We are expecting God to continue to use His church to bring new believers into His Kingdom and disciple those that submit themselves to His calling.

Our local ministry continues to be a way we can meet needs in our community. We have implemented procedures to ensure that every request for physical help is also met with the gospel. In August, we were able to serve multiple families in this way.

We rejoice that two young ladies came forward to join our church by letter, and we are excited to welcome them into our fellowship. Our young people have also been faithfully inviting their friends, and we had four first-time visitors this month.

Progress continues on our building project: the water is now hooked up, HVAC installed, ceiling tiles are in, a new walkway has been poured, and the kitchen sink is in place. While a few finishing touches remain, we are planning to use the building for our upcoming Revival, October 6-8 at 6:30 PM nightly, and warmly invite everyone to join us. You can find more info on our website.

We ended the month with a 5th Sunday service, which brought even more visitors. Sadly, the month also closed with several of our families battling COVID, and we are continuing to recover as this report is written.

Through it all, God has been faithful, and we are grateful for the opportunities to serve Him and see growth in our church family.
