#### To the churches of the M.B.A. of Texas,

The 2024-2025 Associational year has been full of exciting events and heart-breaking loss in our great State. We have seen some answered prayer and recognize needs yet to be met in the area of church planting and mission efforts in Texas.

I am so pleased to report some wonderful successes to you. Bro. Aaron Bryan will lead Fellowship BC of Conroe to organize the work and stand as a self-supporting church in November! This is such an exciting thing in light of the disheartening news that multiple churches have closed their doors. Fellowship's organization service and Bro. Bryan's faithful leadership for the church and in his local association stands in stark contrast to churches floundering without any pastoral leadership to fill their pulpits!

I am also pleased to report that Bro. David Smith, of Lifeline BC, Venus, Texas, has seen some wonderful numbers in attendance and growth (78 in a recent 'Back To Church Sunday' event) and Texas Mission Builders are currently at the church property constructing a new building! The church body is maturing and taking a bigger responsibility for Bro. David's salary and asking less from the MBAT!

Bro. Greg Devine's church family at Coastal Way BC in Lake Jackson, Texas are also taking on a bigger part of their pastor's salary and Coastal Way is asking for \$1,000 less support from the MBAT! The Devines are finding unique and authentic ways to invest themselves in the Lake Jackson community. They, and their children are heavily involved in the homeschool groups of their area. Also, Greg and Amy have had life-changing impacts on people's lives through their amazing work with the local Crisis Pregnancy Center where a simple sonogram shows that the 'blob' inside the girl, is really a living person, and then the couples hear about new life in Jesus and many times make decisions for Christ right there in the exam room!

We witnessed a great tragedy in July as the state experienced severe flooding and Kerrville, Texas, where Missionary Todd Haneline works saw much loss. Bro. Todd decided that an outreach event in Kerrville should go on as planned to minister to the local folks and sister churches came down and loved on the people of Kerrville! The result of this outreach is that the community knows Restoration Hill church so much better and Bro. Todd has 20+ folks coming to Sunday Bible study!

Bro. Chris Robertson is making strides with the Raider MBSF of Texas Tech Campus as he and his family impact young adults through the ministry. Quaker Avenue MBC of Lubbock, and Pastor Monty J. Hilliard

are pressing forward with plans to build an MBSF facility ON the church property and really invest in this exciting ministry!

There are many more highlights I could mention, but the truth is that we need More church plants in this vast state! Pray with me that we would be mission-minded and focused on more churches planted in Texas!

  the months to follow.



#### Missions Report 10/31/25

To our Faithful Partners,

October was a great month at Restoration Hill. God continues to bless us with some numerical growth, but most importantly tremendous spiritual growth. It has been my experience that a congregation's spiritual growth must outpace its numerical growth, or it will be unstable. Spiritually mature church members will always be more likely to survive the trials of individual life and the growing pains of a church. They are also a pastor's best advocate for seeing new people show up for Bible studies and church events.

On the last Sunday of the month, we wrapped up our twelve-week study on "The Sermon on the Mount". I can't begin to tell you how much the entire congregation, including myself, got out of this study. With that, one man came forward and confirmed that he had given his heart to Jesus many years ago but never his life and now wanted to see Jesus be Lord in his life. After the service ended, his wife came to me and said that she had been feeling the same things and also wanted to make this new commitment to follow Jesus daily and support her husband as he leads their family. This is one of those moments that a pastor lives for. To see people's live being changed by the Gospel and them taking bold steps to living their lives for Christ and leading their families into generational change.
