September 2025 Report

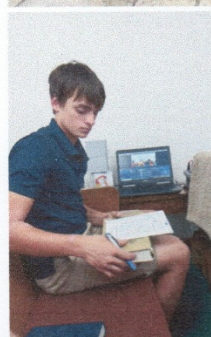
