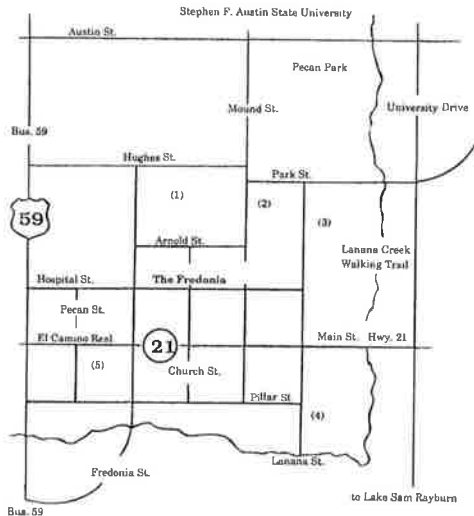

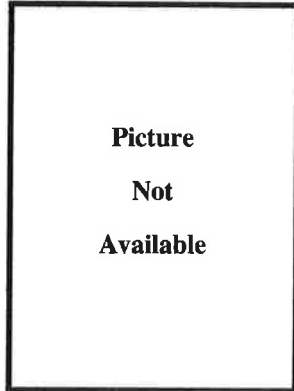

## MODERATOR'S ADDRESS

“IT SHALL NOT! IT HAS NOT!”

Messengers and visitors of the Missionary Baptist Association, this year I am completing my 38th year as an official of this Association. It is a record, because the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas was first organized in 1950, just three years before I was first called on to audit the books of Bro. J. W. Harper, Corresponding Secretary-Treasurer at that time. I have seen our associated work grow from a time of strife to its present position of strength. I humbly thank God for this opportunity. Others will no doubt surpass me in tenure, if our Lord does not return soon.

Tonight I wish to begin this Moderator's Address by saying, “Thank you, churches, for honoring me with these positions of trust as Auditor, Assistant Moderator, and Moderator. They've been thirty-eight good years.”

Will I be considered presumptuous if I take this final opportunity to give you a few facts, sound a few warnings, and perhaps chide you just a little? Don't stop me, for that is what I am about to do. Let me begin with that favorite passage of Missionary Baptists, who believe we have a strict line of succession of true churches from the time of Christ, Matthew 16:18: “Upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.”

It is unnecessary for me to take a lot of time to explain to you that the Rock on which the church was built was not Peter, but our Lord Jesus Christ. The Bible, Old Testament and New, makes very clear who is the Rock. The Rock, the Lord of Israel, is the Rock of His people, upon whom the true church was built, Jesus Christ, and from whom the successors have come by unbroken chain.

There has always been association of the Lord's churches. Associational meetings, such as our's, had their historical beginning in Great Britain in the seventeenth century. Such associations have helped to maintain the unbroken line of faith of which the Lord spoke. In Britain there were the General Baptists, who insisted on freedom of whosoever will to be saved. And there were the Particular Baptists who preached a limited atonement. We have roots in both, and there are things we reject in both. The General Baptist Associations had an elected official who visited among the churches to help them settle their problems, denying them the freedom to act independently without outside interference. The Particular Baptist Associations held absolute independence of every church to associate as it pleased and to take care of its own local affairs. Their associations were not allowed to lord it over the churches.

Both General Baptists and Particular found their way to America, with their doctrines of associationalism little changed. Particular Baptists came to be known popularly as Hardshells. In America there persisted a mixture of Baptist peculiarities to the mid-nineteenth century. The Great Awakening of colonial times saw mass conversions in the evangelistic crusades of Jonathan Edwards, George Whitefield, John Wesley, and others. A new element entered Baptist ranks as a result, especially on the western frontier. Their preachers, and they themselves were, more often than not, illiterate and uneducated. To them it was sinful to pay the preacher for the gospel. Sunday schools and mission societies were opposed. Educated preachers were ridiculed. The associations were hard pressed to maintain a scriptural balance.

As if this were not enough, Campbellism suddenly erupted in this scene. Alexander Campbell appealed to the ignorance of the masses. He encouraged them in their opposition to a paid ministry, or even a God called ministry. He preached against seminaries, though he was, himself, highly educated, a graduate of the University of Glasgow in Scotland. His heresies of baptismal regeneration, denial of the Holy Spirit conviction in salvation, rejection of God called ministers, and such overspread a wide area. Not many know how near Campbell came taking over all Baptist churches from Virginia to Kentucky, Ohio, Indiana, and Illinois. They adapted to his preachments by hundreds. The First Baptist Church in Nashville, Tennessee, and in Little Rock, Arkansas, both became Campbellite churches.

God used the local association to save the day. It was in the Dover Association in Virginia, the largest Baptist association in the world at the time. The year was 1832. After days of prayer and consultation, a committee of leading brethren drew up a set of charges against Campbell's followers, by which those preaching such were excluded from the Association. It is an interesting conjecture what we would do in such a situation today when we insist that whoever wishes can come in, hang up his hat, and sit down with us. Brethren, we might have been Campbellites if that had been the policy then.

But my thesis is to show how our associations have helped to save the day, and have kept the gates of hell from prevailing against us. In England interference in the affairs of the local church was rejected. Hardshellism in America was repelled by strong associations, who insisted on free will. By the same act the Protestant influence from the Great Awakening was repelled.

Desire for a broader missionary outreach led to the organization of the General Baptist Convention, popularly known as the Triennial Convention, because it met every three years. We would not find a great deal wrong with the Triennial Convention. It was the desire of ambitious men to control missionary activity that led to organization of the Southern Baptist Convention in 1845. And that was a different matter altogether. But let us give

credit where credit is due. Those who succeeded in organizing the Southern Convention awoke all Baptists to an awareness of our mission in the world. This awareness helped to settle the Hardshell and Campbellite heresies.

But true missionary Baptist churches refused to allow the board system of the Convention to take away the authority the Lord gave them alone. Southern Baptist leaders of the times admitted there were thousands of churches who did not join the Convention, and who held to the old landmark positions. Again it was the local associations who saved the day.

Many of our churches tried to stay with the convention churches without participating in their board system. In fact, it took over fifty years for them to decide it was impossible. The first state associations were the old Baptist Missionary Association in Texas, organized in 1901, and the General Baptist Association of Arkansas, organized in 1905. It was not until 1924 that these two finally merged in the American Baptist Association. More liberal elements in the Texas Association forded a division in 1950. The American Baptist Association survived, standing for the truth of the New Testament, and is stronger than ever today.

And now I sound my warning. Brethren and sisters, as badly as we hate to admit it, many of our younger generation of preachers are not as staunchly associational as we of the older generation. They have been influenced by modern, so-called evangelicals, whose teachings about church growth and leadership they have absorbed. Some look on our associational meetings as sessions of debate, bickering, and harangue. And too many times this was not too far wrong. Somehow they do not see the same value in this kind of exchange we have seen. Have we failed to instill our convictions in them by insisting too strongly on things which are not doctrinally important? Have some of our methods, which once we found to be good and right, outlasted their time and usefulness?

I close with a look at an Old Testament story found in I Kings 13. The kingdom of Israel had just divided, and Jeroboam had set up his rival religion with the golden calves at Bethel and Dan. God sent a young, unnamed prophet to the dedication of the altar at Bethel. He was to condemn this new system of worship, have no fellowship with any in the country, and not return to Judah by the same road he had come. He delivered his message and started home. But he got tired and stopped to rest. Here an old retired prophet, who had quit his ministry at the very time his preaching was most needed, persuaded the young prophet that God had changed His message. In the end the young prophet's ministry was destroyed. Why? He became discouraged in a lonely ministry, and was misled by listening to an older preacher who had burned out in the ministry and got out of touch with the Lord. The moral of this story: May we who are older not dampen the zeal of the younger, but let us encourage them, while standing steadfast ourselves in the faith.

**ANNUAL SERMON  
DELIVERED BY DR. GEORGE B. CRAWFORD  
PASTOR, LONGVIEW MISSIONARY BAPTIST CHURCH  
LONGVIEW, TEXAS**

Brother Moderator, Messengers, visitors, and friends of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas, greetings. Open your Bibles to the Book of Hebrews, Chapter 6 and lets read verses 17 through 20. I would like to speak to you for a little while on some words found in the 20th verse. This is one of those chapters where its hard to cut in without reading it all, yet I'm going to cut in on verse 17 that begins with the word "Wherein" and that refers you back to the other verses in this chapter. You can read those later on.

The writer of this great Book of Hebrews says, "Wherein God, willing more abundantly to shew unto the heirs of promise the immutability of his counsel, confirmed it by an oath: that by two immutable things, in which it was impossible for Him to lie, we might have a strong consolation, who have fled for refuge to lay hold upon the hope set before us: which hope we have as an anchor of the soul, both sure and steadfast, and which entereth within that which is in the veil; whither the forerunner is for entered, even Jesus, made an high priest for ever after the order of Melchisedec." As we look at this last where it says, "Whither the forerunner is for entered," I would like to speak you about, "OUR FORERUNNER." He is named, you do not have to guess who He is. That one, of course, is Jesus.

You remember that the Jewish High Priest could never be a forerunner. The reason he could not be a forerunner is that he went into the veil just once a year. No one followed him in there and when he came back out that veil would conceal from him, as well as all the other people, all that beauty found in that Most Holy Place. Why, Folks, even if Moses would have tried to go into that Most Holy Place it would have meant certain death, and so he could not be a forerunner. Aaron, the High Priest, could never be the forerunner that goeth into the veil.

I want you to weep with me and rejoice this evening that we do have one that entered within the veil and He is called our forerunner.

I want you to consider with me, first of all, the name that is used to identify our forerunner. That name is mentioned in this verse, "Whither the forerunner is for us entered, even Jesus." I like that name, don't you? Now, Brethren, that is the name which the enemies of Jesus despise. They look upon him as a despised leader. Even this name Jesus would cause the blood of a Jew to boil, and would cause him to gnash his teeth at the name of Jesus. Oh, you might call Him a Christ for they looked for a Christ, didn't they? You may call Him a Messiah and that would be some honor for those

Jews, because they looked for a Messiah, and still are! They're expecting one, but you know, when you mention the name Jesus that was a name that they hated, a name that they despised. I don't suppose that we consider it the enemy just to the Jew, do you? The name Jesus is also despised among the Gentiles, for they are enemies of Jesus Christ. Remember this dear friends, that in the Book of Acts Chapter 4 and verse 12 there is a statement made that there is one name given in heaven and among men whereby we must be saved and that is the name of Jesus. Enemies despise that name. While they despise that name, it is the very name that is very dear to the friends of Jesus. To those of us who love Him, we like that name. Can you think of a better name? There are many titles that are given Him and they are great and wonderful. We would say "Amen!" to everyone of them. But there is just something about that name, Jesus, that just thrills our hearts and thrills our souls when we think of Him. I suppose the reason for it is, that is the name whereby we can be saved, whereby a Savior comes in to our aid, to deliver us from hell and into the Kingdom of Glory. That is the name that the expectant mother was instructed to give Him. For He is going to save His people from their sins. So, we like that name, even though it may be despised by some. I tell you, it is loved and praised by those that love Him. The name Jesus is a name that in all Heaven would bring rejoicing when His name is called out, our forerunner.

I want you to consider, secondly, with me in what sense Jesus is our forerunner. Now this term is a very simple term and it is a word that simply means a person running before. Now that is simple enough, isn't it? But it also implies that somebody is following after, doesn't it? So, a forerunner is a person that goes before to proclaim something. In an Old Testament economy, when a battle had been won, a young man swift of feet would be sent back to the city to proclaim the fact that the army had won the victory and that the Commander-in-chief had been crowned the winner and would soon be coming back. Perhaps he would rush into the marketplace and into the crowds and proclaim the fact the victory had been won. I want you to see with me this evening that the Lord Jesus Christ is the only person that is qualified to run from the battlefield back to the portals of Glory and announce a victory has been won.

I want to see Him there at Calvary's cross as He said, "It is finished! Father, into Thy hands I commend my spirit." The Bible says He gave up the ghost and when He had spent three days and three nights in the heart of the earth and that He was raised from the dead. He spent those forty days going in and out among His people, among those that loved Him and then one day He carried them out to the Mount of Ascension. They asked Him if at this time will you restore the kingdom to Israel? He said it is not for you to know the times or the seasons, but He said, "I'll tell you

what, you are to go into all the world and preach the gospel. You are to preach it beginning in Jerusalem, into Judea and Samaria, and to the uttermost parts of the world. Brethren, you remember that when He had so spoken He began to go up, and up. No rocket ship was needed, He just simply began to ascend back to Glory, and being human they watched Him as long as their eyes could see Him. Then there were two men in white, angels, no doubt, that said, "Ye men of Galilee, why stand gazing into the heavens, why prance about to see if He is coming back, this same Jesus as you have seen Him go away, you will see him come back in like manner." That is a promise that we claim too, a promise that gives us hope, a promise that has been preached all these years among Baptists among these associations that Brother J. W. (Griffith) spoke so ably to us about and gave us a report on. I wonder, as He was received out of their sight, I wonder if they might follow Him by the Scripture and go beyond that cloud and go beyond that Book of Life and see Him as He approaches (I base this on the 24th Psalm) back to Glory, do you remember the words something like this, "Lift up your heads, oh ye gates, and be lifted up and the Prince of Glory shall come in." Can you see the accommodating language of this walled city and with gates to make sure that no one enter that should not enter? No one should get out that shouldn't get out. Here's what I meant, that candidate approaches that gate and says, "Be ye lifted up, O ye gates, because the Prince of Glory will come in". From inside that wall there is a question asked, "Who is the Prince of Glory?" And the answer comes back, "Why, it is the Lord. It is the Lord strong and mighty. The Lord mighty in battle!" Jesus Christ has been in the most fierce battle that a human being could fight while He was here on this earth. Thanks be unto His power, His plan, He won the victory!! No question about it! I tell you today, the devil himself is a defeated foe! He knows it, but he doesn't want you to know it. He doesn't want you to admit that he is a defeated foe.

So here is our forerunner as He enters back and as He approaches Heaven and says, "Let the gates be open and the Prince of Glory will come in!" He repeats this again and the voice from the inside says, "Who is the Prince of Glory?" This is how He answers, "It is the Lord of Hosts!" "It is the Lord of Many!" The expression in that great Psalm teaches me that you can lift up that gate, you can open it wide, and never shut it again, because the victorious one has entered it. There is going to be many that is going to follow after Him, leave that gate open for I am the Lord of Hosts, the Lord of innumerable people that is going to follow after me. Because He is the forerunner and because He has claimed the victory, we can be assured tonight that we are going to follow after Him. Not only does the forerunner run before to proclaim but also in the sense of preceding us. The forerunner goes first and we will follow after. John the Baptist, we think of him as being the forerunner of Jesus Christ. If Christ had not followed after



John the Baptist he would not have been a forerunner, but inasmuch as Jesus did come after him then we can rightly say that John the Baptist was the forerunner of Jesus Christ. He came proclaiming, before Jesus, that there is one coming after me who is mightier than I, I am not even worthy to untie his shoes. Folk, we are worth nothing to God until we too say, "I am not worthy either to untie his shoes." We must show our humility as John the Baptist did. So I can say tonight that the greatest assurance that a Child of God can have in this wicked generation is to know of the presence of Jesus in the Portals of Glory to ensure that one day we will be able to enter the Portals of Glory ourselves. You remember in the Lord's Prayer, I don't mean the one that begins with, "Our Father which art in heaven....," but I mean the Lord's Prayer in the 17th chapter of John. In that prayer He says, "Father, my desire is that those you have given me be with me where I am, that they may behold my glory!" God the Father never has failed to hear and answer the prayer of His Son. He will not fail to answer that one either. One of these days we are going to have the privilege of seeing Jesus face to face and be where He is. He is our forerunner and we are going to enter into His glory.

Let me say in conclusion, this forerunner, the Lord Jesus Christ went within the veil to prepare a place for us. I don't know what all is involved in the 14th chapter of John. I know that Jesus said, "Let not your hearts be troubled, ye believe in God, believe also in Me. In my Father's house are many mansions, and if it were not so I would tell you, I go to prepare a place for you and if I go and prepare a place for you." Then He said, "I will come again and receive you unto myself, that where I am there you may be also." Listen, as Jesus had to go to prepare a place for us, remember the night that He had to go to a place for Judas to betray him and go through the mock trials and suffering there in Jerusalem, then go to Golgatha's brow and there be crucified, He had to go to the grave and be resurrected, all of this was necessary on this earth in order that He might prepare us a place over there. As He enters into the Portals of Glory, some way, some how He is going to finish that preparation and get it all ready for us so that when the times comes for us to enter through death, or the rapture, whatever method He uses to bring us into His presence, bless your heart, it is going to be ready. It is going to be ready. It would take a lot of courage to be a Columbus. You remember, and you historians, I am not a historian, so you may straighten me out later on if I am not correct, but a very popular idea in Columbus' day was that the earth was flat and he wouldn't believe that. I don't know where he got his knowledge, but he didn't believe it was flat. He was given permission to sail to search it out. Some were expecting him to be just sailing along and drop off and never be heard of again. It took courage for that ole boy to come across the ocean, not knowing where he was going and what he was going to run

into. It would take courage to do that. Listen to me, we are not going through uncharted waters, we are not going to an unknown place, we are going to a place that our forerunner had already gone and is there now and is getting ready to welcome us when that time comes. So I am not worried about falling off somewhere here and there. We do not stand at the foot of Mt. Sinai with its mountain reeling and rocking like a drunken man, we do not stand at the foot of Mt. Sinai with the thunders and the lightnings, we don't stand there, but I'll tell you, we stand at the foot of the cross, where the blood of Jesus Christ was shed that we might be cleansed from our sins and be made victorious in the presence of God for ever and for ever. Sometimes the devil will get you all discouraged, down in the mouth, down in heart, look to your forerunner. Think about Him, He has gone before. Listen, He has fought the battle against the devil himself, He won the victory and He is worthy of your worship. God bless you is my prayer.

As the messengers and visitors assembled in the Grand Ballroom of the Sheraton By The Falls Hotel in Wichita Falls, Texas Brother Terry Carlisle led in singing "He Lives". He was accompanied at the piano by Brother Doug McFarland. Brother Larry Neeley of Hughes Springs led the opening prayer.

A special musical number entitled "It's You We Worship" was rendered by Terry and Perry Carlisle. The congregation then sang "Blessed Assurance".

Brother Marc Schultz of Jacinto City brought a devotional based on I John 5:3 which he entitled, "Love and Obedience To God".

Moderator J. W. Griffith presented Host Pastor John Paul Jones of the Unity Missionary Baptist Church for words of welcome. Brother Jones spoke and then introduced City Councilman J. W. Martin to relay a welcome from the City Administration. Vice-moderator Billy Daniels gave a response to the welcome given by both men.

Brother Griffith asked Brother and Sister J. C. Askew of New Boston to come to the stand. Brother Askew was asked to speak a few words concerning their labor in establishing the church in Wichita Falls. Sister Tammie Allen of Pasadena sang, "Great Is Thy Faithfulness".

The election of officers was called for and the following brethren were elected:

Brother Billy Turpin of Arlington was elected to bring the Annual Sermon and Brother Sammy Eldredge of Timpson was selected as the Alternate. Brother Robert Emmanuel, a TBI student from India, was elected to bring the Wednesday evening message.

The out of State visitors were recognized. They were Brethren Lloyd Ashenfelter and Robert Russell of Oklahoma; D. S. Madden, Bill Johnson, and Tom Sannes of Texarkana; Dwight Curtis of Bogg Springs Camp; and Roy Hawthorne of Arizona.

Brother Richard Crawford of Broaddus, Brother Steve Maxie of Lufkin and Brother Rusty Denny of Pittsburg were recognized as new pastors in the State.

Brother Luther Crawford, Secretary/Treasurer of State Missions gave his report. After asking that the Auditor's Report be handed out by the Tellers Brother Crawford read the list of missionaries recommended for salary, giving the name of their sponsoring church, where they were working, and the amount of salary requested. Dear Brethren,

The Annual Audit of the Secretary-Treasurer of Missions for the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas has been completed. No exceptions were noted.

The report of Receipts and Disbursements reflects the source and recipient of funds handled through the office. A more detailed report of amounts paid to individuals is included in this year's report. I sought to give information to the messengers that is requested nearly every year during the meeting.

The General Fund balance is low! Last year we spent \$11,129.01 more than was received in the General Fund. This depleted all the reserves we had previously enjoyed. The General Fund balance at the close of the fiscal year was dangerously low at \$1,211.15.

The Minute Fund does not have a large balance. Last year disbursements from this fund totaled \$6,552.96. The current balance is \$5,140.34.

Brethren, the figures speak for themselves. We must exercise sound reasoning as we vote.

Several bookkeeping changes were started at the beginning of the year. Brother & Mrs. Crawford have done an excellent job of learning a new system, and then making it work. I commend them both for a job well done.

## TEXAS BAPTIST INSTITUTE AND SEMINARY REPORT

Calvary Missionary Baptist Church is thankful for the opportunity to serve our God in providing the Texas Baptist Institute and Seminary for the training of those who He calls into His special service. We are very conscious of the fact that the success of this work depends upon all of our churches working together in caring for the growing needs of this school. It is with deep humility that we thank our God for the generous support from so many sister churches and individuals during the forty-two years of service. We also wish to give special thanks to the churches who so graciously permitted their pastors to teach at TBI. Without this help, the school would not be able to function.

The 1989-90 school year closed May 24, 1990 with twenty students receiving diplomas for different levels of graduation. The 1990-91 school year opened August 15 with an enrollment of sixty-six students, twenty of which are first year students. This is an overall increase of six over last year. The first semester was completed November 8 and classes for the second semester began November 9. Three new students have enrolled and that brings our first year class to the highest level in a number of years. We feel that the Lord is answering our prayers for laborers and we urge all of our people to continue to plead with God to call more and more young men into the gospel ministry.

Although we have experienced some relief in the area of health insurance, our General Fund needs remain about the same. Our old main building is now thirty-six years old and is in need of some extensive renovation. Some work on classrooms has been completed, other work is in progress and in planning. All of this increases our General Fund needs. Therefore, churches are encouraged to consider increasing their offerings to the general operating expenses of TBI.

Special thanks are due those churches that have through the years continued their generous monthly support and have periodically increased their offerings to help meet the increasing needs of a growing, developing school.

We are especially thankful for all the churches, individuals, and associations of churches that rallied to our General Fund needs this past year. Without these special offerings, the school would be operating in the red. Calvary MBC of Henderson initiated the drive with their TBI Recognition Day. Other churches that joined in this were: First MBC of Grand Prairie, Bellaire West of Houston and Freeway of La Marque. Associations holding TBI Appreciation Rallies were: Shelby County at Heritage in Center; Red RiverBowie at Johntown; and Navarro County at Cedar Creek. This fine

practice has already begun for this school year. Calvary has held her second annual TBI Recognition Day and two other pastors have discussed the possibility of their churches hosting one. Shelby County is planning their second TBI Rally at Heritage in Center, December 13. Tri-County has one planned for November 17 at Landmark in Athens. Brethren, we recommend that many more of our churches and associations of churches plan TBI Rallies. These will help us all to become better acquainted with the faculty and students of the school as well as help to meet the needs of the school.

The TBI Endowments continue to grow. It was especially gratifying to receive a \$25,000.00 endowment from a Henderson businessman who is not a member of one of our churches. Also, a fine friend of the school, the late Mrs. Cora Patterson Clark of Sherman, remembered TBI in her will. She left \$5,000.00 for the Jesus Saves Endowment begun by her family in memory of their father. It should be remembered that in most cases only the interest on endowment money is available for use.

It also seems good to mention three other individuals who have permitted the Lord to use them in helping in a special way. One is unnamed by choice. Along with a most generous offering of \$8,700.00 she sent a small note relating how the school had been a blessing to her. The second is a special friend of Brother Ray Brooks. He is a member of the first church he pastored, Hopewell of Navarro County. Brother Charles McCarter has blessed our hearts and met our needs on a number of occasions with \$1,000.00 offerings when we needed them the most. The other is long-time friend of TBI, Brother Joe White. He had served as Missionary-Pastor of Grace Baptist Mission of Irving. The mission closed and sold their property. When he heard of our having to borrow \$5,000.00 to meet closing of school expenses, he got the mission members to pay this debt for us. We thank God for such friends.

Ladies Auxiliaries, churches, and individuals continue to be very helpful in meeting the personal needs of our students and their families. Gifts of food, clothing, and money make it possible for many students to remain in school. We are very thankful to all who continue to help in this way to make schooling possible for some, and the TBI years a little easier on others. The Calvary Ladies are especially thankful for all who help them supply the Christmas baskets for all the TBI student families.

The A. J. Kirkland Memorial Lectures are recognized as one of the top lecture programs of our ABA work. The 1990 lectures will be held December 4-7. Dr. Roy Culley will speak on Biblical Counseling each morning at 10:45. Tuesday, December 4 will be a special Visitor's Day with additional guest speakers. Services will begin at 9:30 a. m. and conclude with a fine lunch served by the school family. The TBI Alumni Banquet will

be held at 7:00 p.m. in the Henderson Community Center. Brother Glenn Griffith has been selected as the Banquet Speaker.

We ask that all of you pray for our students, faculty, Calvary Church, and our president, Brother Ray Brooks.

## PUBLICATIONS REPORT

The presentation of the Publication Report will feature a report from our Editor in Chief and our Business Manager. In addition to these reports, we urge the support of the Baptist Monitor which serves the state of Texas as a very powerful means of communications for our Texas brethren. The cost of publication is great so please place the Baptist Monitor in each home and in your monthly budget.

Our Business Manager, Bro. Tom Sannes, reports the following: "The past twelve months have been extremely busy for your staff in Texarkana. The following quarterlies have been distributed: Sunday School—1.4 million, BTC—263 thousand, VBS—118 thousand, Tracts—1.1 million. Along with the quarterlies, over 35 thousand Christian Education Bulletins are prepared and distributed quarterly. In addition to our publishing business, two Christian bookstores are operated in Texarkana along with a national mail order business. Estimated retail book sales for 1990 should be a record 1.3 million dollars. We currently have 45 employees helping in the Editorial, Press, Warehouse, Stores, and Office. The business has no long term debts nor past due bills. Pray for us as we serve our Lord through you."

The report from our Editor in Chief is as follows: "The editorial department of the Baptist Sunday School Committee work in Texarkana now produces thirty-nine quarterly units, including twenty-eight for Sunday School and eleven for Baptist Training Course. In addition to these, we also produce a Vacation Bible School curriculum consisting of fifteen units and the Discovery materials for teen Bible Clubs.

The most modern pre-press equipment is used by the nine staff personnel. All writers are members of Missionary Baptist churches fellowshipping in the American Baptist Association. There are about thirty-three part-time writers now working with the editorial department.

The latest book published by the Committee is a commentary on Matthew by Dr. I. K. Cross. A new devotional quarterly will be added to the Sunday School materials beginning with winter quarter, 1990-1991."

## INTERSTATE AND FOREIGN MISSIONS REPORT

We who are conservative Baptist have always been delighted at the power and practicality of our Lord's commands. The honorable mandate to tell others of the Gospel of grace has always been an humbling privilege, whether it has been one-to-one evangelism, or the developing of a dynamic mission program in a church. Without one hint of reservation, Christ welcomed us mortals into the exciting work of sharing His message of hope.

Such is the work of the Interstate and Foreign associational mission work of the churches of the American Baptist Association. The churches in the state of Texas have assumed a great role in this tremendous effort, for which

we give our Lord all the glory. Of eight states reporting at least 10 or more churches within that state supporting this associated work, Texas stands at the lead with 70% of our churches involved in associational Interstate and Foreign work with an average monthly offering per church per month of \$114.18. Many other churches are also deeply committed to their own Interstate and Foreign mission programs. Again, our Lord is to be praised for this endeavor.

However, if the other 30% of our Texas churches were to join the state-wide average, our churches in this state could contribute another \$11,988.00 per month to this associated work. This would more than cover the deficits that have been occurring in recent months in our national office. This certainly should be a matter of prayer for associational churches in Texas who are not involved in the great outreach of Interstate and Foreign missions.

The reports of those dedicated missionaries deserves our support. One-hundred and eleven of our sister churches are receiving support for one-hundred and thirty-one missionaries. There are forty-five interstate missionaries; thirty-four of those are salaried and eleven are receiving designated funds. Eighty-six men are serving as foreign and national missionaries, with fifty-three of those on salary and thirty-three receiving designated funds. Twenty-three foreign countries are represented in our associated mission effort along with twenty-one states in our own country. The monthly need of this associational work averages approximately \$91,000.00 per month.

Not every sponsoring church sends a monthly update of the statistics of their missions, but most of those who do report monthly gains in professions of faith and baptisms, along with progress in buildings and facilities.

May we as an association of Missionary Baptist churches in Texas continue to lead in this great national and foreign work, and encourage our sister churches to join in this Biblical effort.

## **HISTORY AND ARCHIVES REPORT, 1990**

Dear Messengers and Friends, Will you please take this report home with you and share it with your church? Let us tell you what has been accomplished by this committee since it was established at Snyder in 1974. I believe you should be pleased.

**ARCHIVES.** We have accumulated files containing hundreds of old records, items, and other information about churches, pastors, and associations, schools, etc. from all over Texas and cataloged, and put into com-

puter. The records are stored in the fireproof room at Texas Baptist Institute. It is available for any who need access to it.

**MUSEUM.** The Museum features nine cabinets containing historical artifacts and memorabilia. It also contains the preachers biographical album, old pews, lighting fixtures, organ, pulpit, stove, etc. The highlight is a six-panel panorama, reaching around the walls, which traces our history from the shores of Galilee to Henderson, Texas. The Museum is our pride. It is open for visitors by appointment. We hope soon to open it on a regular schedule for two or three days a week. It is also available to church groups who wish to hold an "old-fashioned" service.

**BULLETIN.** The quarterly Sweetgum Grove Museum Bulletin is one of our most gratifying ventures. Its four pages are packed with historical information and the work of our committee. It goes out to over 300 churches and individuals without charge. It has been mailed by various church groups or individuals from the first issue. All of these have been voluntary. We would like to hear from others who are interested in helping with the printing and mailing.

**TOURS.** For a number of years your committee has conducted Church History Tours, and we have now put together three, which have been much enjoyed by those who joined them. These are the Pioneer, East Texas, and Morrell Wagon Trek. The East Texas Tour will be scheduled for spring, 1991. Cost ranges from about \$60 to \$90 per person and each is two nights and three days. If you are interested in a Tour please write or call us: History Tours, Box 570, Henderson, Tx 75653; Phone (903) 657-6543, (903) 657-6254, or (903) 592-5507. Special tours can be arranged for church groups.

**"I REMEMBER A. J. KIRKLAND."** This project is well underway. Memorials to the late Dr. Kirkland were received from over sixty people. They are now being edited to include in a booklet. The booklet will also contain a short biography by his son, Dr. James A. Kirkland, and special remembrances by his other children. When it is ready for the press, sometime next year, we will contact you with a pre-publication price. We hope you will order at that time to help us defray early costs of publication. A few contributions have already been received.

**PLAQUES.** Your committee has sponsored the purchase and erection of five bronze memorial plaques in memory of these great men, who have departed from our midst: A. J. Kirkland, J. W. Harper, R. E. Rodgers, G. D. Walters, and A. L. Patterson. Plaques have also been approved for Bro. A. J. Findley and Bro. Vernon L. Barr, but at present there has been no church to sponsor the fund raising.

**NEEDS.** These are several. We need your prayers first and your good will. Of a more material nature we need:

1. Volunteers to pay the cost of mailing our Bulletin.
2. We appreciate the good response to our solicitation of funds which you sent to this meeting. This will be a tremendous help. Please put us in your regular budget for a few dollars each month or year.
3. Continue to send us items which you think we can use in our archives and for display in the Museum.
4. If we could raise funds to buy a camcorder, or if someone who has one could accompany us on our tours, we could make videos which we could rent out to church groups or individuals and let many more people enjoy the fruits of our work.

Brothers and Sisters, our Texas History and Archives work is one of the finest in the A. B. A. We are now on the verge of doing even greater things. Won't you be a part of this by your prayers and contributions, and by coming to visit our Museum, or taking one of our Tours?

Nevertheless, this has been the first year in quite some time that TMD has recorded a declining year. Though it not be a major decline still it is not the kind of progress we hoped for. By raising your present support by 10-15%, TMD would be on a definite track towards our \$10,000 goal. Also there are many churches in the state who do not have TMD in their present mission budget. We seriously ask you to consider presenting this mission program to your churches.

We humbly thank all the churches and missions who have brought Texas Mission Development from \$740.57 that was sent to the work in Athens in 1972 to what it is today. We are very thankful for the cooperation and support our trustees have given us during our tenure here. Bro. Cloud deserves much thanks and praise for his accomplishment with our problems with the state. We feel much improvement has been made in this area.

As stated above, most of our new building and renovation expenses are completed. To continue to support the increasing number of children we are getting plus the ever increasing cost of utilities, medical bills, and groceries we have found it necessary to increase our proposed budget. ## DOCTRINAL STATEMENT MBA OF TEXAS

1. We believe in the plenary verbal inspiration and inerrancy of the whole Bible as originally written, and that the Bible is the all-sufficient rule of faith and practice, (Psalm 119-160; II Tim. 3:16-17).
2. We believe in the personal triune God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, equal in divine perfection, (Matt. 28:19).
3. We believe in the Genesis account of creation, (Gen. 1, 2).
4. We believe that Satan is a fallen angel, the archenemy of God and man, the unholy god of this world and that his destiny is the eternal lake of fire, (Isa. 14:12-15; Ezek. 28:11-19; Matt. 25:41; II Cor. 4:4; Eph. 6:10-17; Rev. 20:10).
5. We believe in the virgin birth and sinless humanity of Jesus Christ, (Matt. 1:18-20; II Cor. 5:21; I Peter 2:22).
6. We believe in the Deity of Jesus Christ, (John 1:1, 14; 10:30; 14:9; II Cor. 5:19).
7. We believe that the Divine Administrator for Jesus Christ in His churches is the Holy Spirit (Luke 24:49; John 14:16, 17; 16:13; Act 1:4, 5, 8), whose work as such began on the first Pentecost after the resurrection of Jesus Christ with the Baptism of the Holy Spirit, which event occurred only once and is not repeated, (Acts 2).
8. We believe that the miraculous gifts of the Spirit listed in I Cor. 12:8-10 were done away when the Bible was completed (I Cor. 13:8-10), that the gift of apostleship ceased with the death of the last chosen directly by the Lord Jesus (Eph. 2:20), and that the abiding gifts adequately equip the churches for service to God, (Rom. 12:13; I Cor. 13:1-3; Eph. 4:7-16; I Peter 4:10, 11; II Tim. 3:16, 17). (See explanatory note at the end of this doctrinal statement.)
9. We believe that man was created in the image of God and lived in innocence until he fell by voluntary transgression from his sinless state, the result being that all mankind are now sinners, (Gen. 1:26; 3:6-24; Rom. 5:12, 19).

10. We believe the substitutionary suffering and death of Jesus Christ was sufficient to propitiate for the sins of all humanity, thus making salvation available for all mankind, (Isa. 53:6; Heb. 2:9; I Peter 2:24; 3:18; II Peter 3:9; I John 2:2).

11. We believe in the bodily resurrection and ascension of Christ and the bodily resurrection of His saints, (Matt. 28:1-7; Acts 1:9-11; I Cor. 15:42-58; I Thess. 4:13-18).

12. We believe in the pre-millennial, personal, bodily return of Christ as the crowning event of the Gentile Age. We further believe at His coming the righteous dead shall be raised, the living saints shall be changed and both shall be caught up to meet the Lord in the air. We also believe after the Millennial Reign of Christ on earth the unrighteous shall be resurrected unto eternal punishment in the lake of fire, (John 14:1-6; I Thess. 4:13-18; II Thess. 2:8; Rev. 20: 4-6, 11-15; 21:8).

13. We believe the depraved alien sinner is saved wholly by grace through faith in Jesus Christ and the requisites to regeneration are repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ (Luke 13:3, 5; John 3:16, 18; Acts 20:21; Rom. 6:23; Eph. 2:8, 9), and the Holy Spirit convicts sinners and regenerates, seals, secures, and indwells every believer, (John 3:6; 16:8, 9; Rom. 8:9-11; I Cor. 6:19, 20; Eph. 4:30; Titus 3:5).

14. We believe all who trust in Jesus Christ for salvation are eternally secure and shall persevere in Him and shall not perish, (John 3:36; 5:24; 10:27-30; Rom. 8:35-39; Heb. 10:39; I Peter 1:5).

15. We believe God deals with believers as His children, chastises the disobedient, blesses the obedient in this life and reserves rewards for the future, (Matt. 16:27; 25:14-23; John 1:12; Heb. 12:5-11; II John 8; Rev. 22:12).

16. We believe Jesus Christ, during His personal ministry, established His Church, which is a local, visible assembly of scripturally baptized believers in covenant relationship, to carry out the Commission of the Lord Jesus Christ. We further believe each church is an independent, self-governing body over which no other ecclesiastical body may exercise authority. We believe Jesus Christ gave the Great Commission to New Testament churches only, and promised the perpetuity (Matt. 4:18-22; 16:18; 18:15-18; 28:19-20; Mark 1:14-20; John 1:35-51; Eph. 3:21).



17. We believe there are two pictorial ordinances in the Lord's churches: baptism and the Lord's Supper. Scriptural baptism is the immersion of penitent believers in water, administered by the authority of a New Testament church in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. We further believe the Lord's Supper is a memorial ordinance, restricted to the members of the church observing the ordinance, (Matt. 28:19, 20; Acts 8:12, 38; Rom. 6:4; I Cor. 5:11-13; 11:1, 2, 17-20, -26).

18. We believe there are two divinely appointed offices in a church, pastor and deacon, to be filled by men whose qualifications are set forth in I Tim. 3:1-16; Titus 1:5-9.

19. We believe all associations, fellowships, conventions, boards, and their committees are servants of the churches, (Matt. 20:25-28).

20. We believe in the complete separation of churches and state (Matt. 22:21) and affirm our belief in civil obedience unless the laws and regulations of civil government run contrary to the Holy Scriptures (Rom. 13:1-7; I Peter 2:13-15; Acts 5:29).

Footnote: "I suggest this explanation: 'The apostles and prophets were the inspired agents through whom the New Testament revelation was given. When that revelation was complete, there was no further need for the office of apostle and prophet; thus, the apostleship ceased with the death of the last apostle chosen directly by the Lord Jesus.'"—James Kirkland.

# STATEMENT OF MISSION POLICY

## SECTION I

The messengers of the churches of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas will not recommend any man to the mission field unless he has first been elected or endorsed by the church of his membership, said church being associated with and subscribing to the principles and practices of the churches of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas.

## SECTION II

Each church recommending a missionary from their membership to the churches of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas in annual session is requested:

1. To submit in writing, hereafter, to the Secretary-Treasurer's Mission Office, the endorsement of any missionary, whether salaried or on designated funds, and/or a mission project of any sponsoring church, by the fifteenth (15th) day of September prior to each messenger meeting.
2. To submit for public reading a brief summary of the ministerial activities of the recommended missionary.
3. To give a statement as to what their plans are concerning their support of the missionary being recommended.
4. To give the location of the area where the recommended missionary will devote his labor.

This information concerning the recommended missionary, his abilities, training and work will greatly aid the messengers from the churches in making their decision about individual missionaries.

## SECTION III

We recognize that a missionary elected by his local church, if it be a Scriptural church, is a Scriptural missionary, without recommendation of the messengers from the churches of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas.

## SECTION IV

Any messenger may request an individual vote on any name recommended for endorsement to the messengers in annual session.

## SECTION V

We recognize as Scriptural the right of the messengers in annual session to recommend stipulated salaries for the missionaries.

We also recognize the responsibility of the sponsoring church and the mission to aid in raising the missionary’s salary. Therefore, the corresponding Secretary-Treasurer shall not be permitted to pay over 80 (eighty) percent of the missionary’s salary.

**SECTION VI**

All missionaries of the churches working as State Missionaries under the recommendations of the messengers shall:

Make duplicate monthly reports to their endorsing church and Secretary-Treasurer.

- 1. These reports shall tell of the work done during the month and shall list all money, material and monetary gifts collected on the field. All money collected on the field shall be counted as salary, unless the money is designated to some special church or mission project, with the following exceptions:

**a. MATERIAL GIFTS**

Missionaries shall have the same privilege as pastors in receiving material gifts above their salary and shall not be require to report them as salary.

Material gifts are defined as items (or money for them) as:

- Clothing
- Automobile accessories
- Household goods

**b. MONETARY GIFTS**

Monetary gifts are defined as such gifts as pastors receive for:

- Weddings
- Funerals
- At Christmas season
- Honorariums
- etc.

**c. REVIVALS**

The missionaries and the Secretary-Treasurer may hold as many as two revivals each year without reporting the funds received for the revivals.

**d. VACATIONS**

The missionaries and the Secretary-Treasurer may have two weeks paid vacation each year in addition to two revival meetings.

- 2. All reports shall be made available to the churches and a yearly report published in the minutes.
- 3. The endorsing church is requested to provide a report annually for the messengers assembly regarding:
  - a. The amount and nature of all material and monetary gifts.

- b. An assessment is requested as to whether there has been any abuse of this privilege on the part of the missionary.

### SECTION VII

State Mission work shall be defined as follows:

1. Work in cities where we have no Missionary Baptist Churches, or in cities large enough to have two or more churches.
2. Work with weak pastorless churches, to aid them in growing and securing a pastor.
3. Although we look with favor on revival meetings, revivals in established churches with regular pastors, should not be counted as mission work.
4. A month's work should include at least 160 hours actually spent in constructive mission work.

### SECTION VIII

We recommend:

1. The missionaries seek fields in sections of the state where we have no churches.
2. The missionaries should seek out a church to sponsor the mission that is consistent in their support of missions, and that is of sufficient strength to fulfill the responsibility of a sponsoring church, and that the sponsoring church adopt a policy concerning the mission that would not allow it to be organized into a church until it becomes self-supporting in every respect, including a full-time pastor on the field.
3. That the missionaries begin teaching leading newly organized missions and churches to support all phases of mission work and that they begin immediately to give support to the missionaries's salary and that such support be increased regularly as the work grows. The missionary and mission should work toward a goal of being able to support a pastor within five years. That this be done by seeking to support 20 percent of the missionary's salary within the first year, 40 percent within the second, 60 percent within the third, 80 percent within the fourth and within the fifth year of being able to support a full time pastor. The missionary should remain with the mission until it becomes self-supporting.
4. That the missionaries seek to lead the newly organized churches to adopt and put to proper use, a good Sunday School record system and plan of Sunday School organization.
5. That the missionaries lead the newly established churches to follow a definite plan of organized visitation evangelism.
6. That the missionaries not be used as supply preacher in our established churches where pastors are on the field.
7. That missionaries not pastor a church that is recognized as a self-supporting church, regardless of how much of his salary they might pay.

8. That the missionaries should not be elected to an office of the Association.

### **SECTION IX**

The trustees of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas are authorized to relocate old mobile church units and locate new ones between sessions of the association under the following guidelines:

1. State Missionaries of this association on stipulated salary be given priority for usage of mobile units;
2. State missionaries of this association on designated offerings be eligible for mobile units when need by a salaried missionary is not imminent;
3. The trustees shall not relocate an old unit or locate a new one within the sixty days just prior to an associational meeting, but they shall refer the matter to the messenger assembly;
4. A mobile unit may be recalled by the messenger assembly in any annual session or called session.

### **SECTION X**

May the statements of this policy never be interpreted as binding laws upon churches or missionaries, but as goals and guidelines.

### **SECTION XI**

#### **GUIDELINES FOR THE USE OF MOBILE UNITS:**

- I. It is agreed that the churches of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas will:
  - A. Provide the mobile unit;
  - B. Pay for moving the unit;
  - C. Pay for relocating the unit;
  - D. Pay for major repairs brought on by physical damage outside the control of those using it, such as storm damage, vandalism and-or mechanical failure.
- II. It is agreed that the mission and-or sponsoring church will:
  - A. Provide the location for the unit;
  - B. Pay for all connections, such as water, gas, electricity, sewage;
  - C. Keep unit in good state of repair while in custody of mission and-or sponsoring church;
  - D. Pay for any and all repairs needed while in their use except those covered in Part I, Section D;
  - E. Pay for relocating or resetting unit while in their use;
  - F. Make no alterations in physical structure of unit without approval of trustees.
- III. After the unit is located and all connections made, the Mission Secretary, in company with the missionary and at least one member

of the mission and-or sponsoring church, shall inspect the unit. The inspection shall reveal the condition of the unit at the time the mission begins using it. A written record of such findings shall be signed by both parties and a copy of same provided for both parties.

- IV. A similar inspection called for in Part III shall be conducted before the unit is disconnected from the utilities at the time of moving from the custody of any mission and-or sponsoring church. The results of this inspection shall be recorded and signed by both parties.

## SECTION XII

### GUIDELINES FOR THE MBSF REPRESENTATIVE

1. The MBSF representative will meet the same qualifications and requirements of the missionaries as set forth in Sections I and II. The endorsing church should take the initiative in seeing that the representative abides by these guidelines.
2. He will receive the same salary as the missionaries.
3. He will be reimbursed for travel expenses related to the MBSF work outside his local area of residence at a rate prescribed by the messenger assembly.
4. Section VI of the Mission Policy shall apply to the MBSF Representative as well as to the missionaries.
5. He may use the mailing permit through the office of the Secretary-Treasurer for state-wide projects.
6. He will work with college and university students and not just serve as a supply preacher.
7. He will visit with and encourage MBSF groups already begun, aiding them in their programs and outreach.
8. He will seek to establish new campus MBSF chapters under the direction of a sponsoring church which works in the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas. No chapter will be organized without such a sponsoring church. It is recognized that each MBSF chapter is under the direction of a local church.
9. He will seek to develop a spirit of loyalty to Christ, to the Bible, to the local church and to the Missionary Baptist principles of faith and practice. He will neither promote nor participate in activity which compromises Missionary Baptist doctrinal positions, disturbs the lawful order of the citizenry or displays immorality. He will seek to encourage all chapters to function within the framework of school regulations.
10. He will publicize the MBSF work of this association and of the American Baptist Association, seeking to keep both mutually informed.

# ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT

## ARTICLE I—Name

This association shall be known as the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas.

## ARTICLE II—Object

The object of this Association shall be to awaken a deeper interest in the welfare of the churches, to cultivate a closer fellowship among the churches, and to encourage and perpetuate the very greatest possible activity in missionary, educational and benevolent enterprises.

## ARTICLE III—How Composed

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of such regular independent Missionary Baptist Churches as may voluntarily choose to cooperate in carrying out the object of this Association.

Section 2. The Messenger Assemblies of this Association shall be composed of messengers elected by the churches composing it.

Section 3. Each church choosing to represent in this Association shall be entitled to three messengers.

Section 4. Each church shall be the sole judge of the qualification of her messengers.

## ARTICLE IV—Nature

The Messenger Assembly of this Association shall be, in nature, formed as a council in matters pertaining to missionary, education and benevolent work.

## ARTICLE V—Principles

The Messenger Assembly of this Association shall recognize the freedom of speech as essential to the highest achievement in its work. It shall stand or fall on its own conformity to the truth. It shall exercise no ecclesiastical authority, but it shall, by every precaution recognize the independence and sovereignty of every individual church. It shall also encourage on the part of the church and the messengers the greatest possible freedom of expression in discussing matters pertaining to its work.

## ARTICLE VI—Powers

The action of the Messenger Assembly shall be limited to the work of awakening enthusiasm in missionary, educational and benevolent enterprises and receiving and distributing funds for the same.

### **ARTICLE VII—Funds**

Section 1. All funds of this Association shall be raised by voluntary donations secured solely upon the merits of the cause in the interest of which appeals are made for gifts: provided, this is not to prevent the use of any income or any property that may be acquired by donation or by purchase.

Section 2. Distribution of funds shall be authorized by an act of this Messenger Assembly, or by an act of properly authorized committees of this assembly hereinafter provided for; but in no instance shall the assembly or any committee of it use means in violation of the expressed preference of the donor.

### **ARTICLE VIII—Officers**

Section 1. The officers of this Messenger Assembly shall be a moderator, and assistant moderator, two (2) recording secretaries and a corresponding secretary-treasurer.

Section 2. All officers of this assembly shall be chosen annually, and shall hold their offices until their successors are elected and the same shall be true of all members of standing committees. All officers shall be elected by a majority of the messengers voting. No moderator shall succeed himself more than one year.

Section 3. The duties of all officers shall be as may be directed by the Messenger Assembly, unless otherwise directed by the churches.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the corresponding secretary-treasurer to take charge of money and valuables not specifically entrusted to someone else and to dispose of same as he may be directed by this Messenger Assembly. He shall make an annual report to this assembly of all monies received and disbursed.

Section 5. The recording secretaries, in addition to keeping the records of this Association, will superintend the printing and distribution of minutes of such regular meetings as the messengers may direct.

### **ARTICLE IX—Committees**

Section 1. The missionary committee shall be composed of one representative of each church choosing to be represented. The duty of the committee shall be to meet quarterly, or as directed by the Messenger Assembly, in the interest of all the work. It shall be empowered to fill vacancies of regular offices between sessions of the Messenger Assembly and to call a special meeting of a Messenger Assembly when needed.

Section 2. The following officers of the Assembly shall be the trustees of the association: Namely, the moderator, assistant moderator, two recording secretaries and secretary-treasurer, subject to the direction of the Messenger Assembly, and they are empowered to act in legal capacity as trustees of the Association.



### **ARTICLE X—Missionaries**

We hold that the authority for execution of the Great Commission was given to the New Testament Church and the authority must remain forever with the churches. Therefore, the right and privilege of every church of this Association to endorse, set apart or send out missionaries of its own choosing and the act of one church in sending out missionaries can in no way bind or obligate any other church. The churches shall be free and their support of missionaries shall be voluntary on their part.

### **ARTICLE XI—Meetings**

The regular meetings of the Church Messengers shall be at such time and place as the assembled messengers may appoint.

### **ARTICLE XII—Amendments**

The Messenger Assembly shall have no power to change Articles of Agreement. Any church desiring a change shall send to the annual meeting a copy of the proposed change; the Messenger Assembly will then submit the proposed change to each cooperating church; if two-thirds of the cooperating churches vote for the change, then the Articles of Agreement shall be amended to conform to the proposed change. Two-thirds of the churches representing in assembly in the previous year shall be the number determining the results.

## PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

### SEEK AND REAP THE PROMISES OF GOD

## GIRL'S AUXILIARY REPORT

The year of 1989-90 has been another year of growth for our Girl's Auxiliary program in Texas. Current records indicate that we have over 35 registered G. A. circles at work in the state of Texas. From the correspondence and conversation I have had with various leaders, it appears that many churches that had previously let their G. A. programs cease to exist, have now seen the need to revive this ministry. We are always thankful for each church who will support their young people through this program.

For the fourth consecutive year, we held a one-day G. A. Retreat at New Liberty in Garland, Tx. This retreat has always been a focal point for Girl's Auxiliaries in Texas, and this year was no exception. We have always promoted this time as one to encourage both the girl's and teachers involved in G. A.'s. This year's retreat was on May 12, 1990, with the theme "His Sheep Am I." The day included small group Bible studies, craft time, recreational time, and various other activities. At the G. A. Retreat we also have a teacher workshop time. This year's workshop was presented by Mrs. Mary Goff from our church in College Station. The teachers gained many new teaching ideas and new methods of promoting the learning of the "Upward Steps." The retreat was attended by 5 different churches, with over 50 in attendance. If you have not previously attended the G. A. retreats, please plan to do so in 1991. We typically hold the retreat in the Spring. Specific details will be forthcoming.

In the course of the year the G. A. circles were encouraged to collect monies to go toward the G. A. goal. My preliminary numbers indicate that we have received close to \$75.00. We sincerely appreciate those teachers who use the G. A. goal as a means to promote a "service" attitude within their circles.

I sincerely appreciate all of the hard-working G. A. teachers we have in the state of Texas. In most cases, work like that of the Girl's Auxiliary takes more time and energy than many other teaching positions within your church. Most of us believe that the young people in our churches are truly our church of tomorrow. The Christian education of these young girls will always be an important task. God will certainly bless your efforts in this area.

## STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES TEXAS STATE WOMEN'S AUXILIARY

### ARTICLE I—Name

The name of the organization shall be Women's Auxiliary of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas.

### ARTICLE II—Definition

The Auxiliary shall be composed of messengers of the local auxiliaries of the churches which compose the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas.

### ARTICLE III—Purpose

The purpose of this State Auxiliary shall be to encourage the women of the local churches to be active in all phases of the work in which they have the scriptural right to participate and to encourage the establishment of auxiliaries in all our churches where none exist.

### ARTICLE IV—Time and Place

The State Auxiliary shall meet annually at 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday before the annual session of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas. The place of each meeting shall be determined by the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas messengers.

### ARTICLE V—Officers

The officers of the State Auxiliary shall be: (1) President, (2) First Vice President, (3) Second Vice President, (4) Recording Secretary, (5) Assistant Recording Secretary, (6) Treasurer, (7) Assistant Treasurer, (8) Corresponding Secretary, (9) Bible and Tract Distributor, (10) Parliamentarian, (11) Girls' Auxiliary Promotional Director, (12) Assistant Girls' Auxiliary Promotional Director (to be appointed by the Director), (13) Advisory Council of 3.

### ARTICLE VI

All officers shall be elected annually by nomination and majority vote and must be a member of an auxiliary. No officer shall succeed herself more than once consecutively except the Advisory Council and G. A. Promotional Director.

### ARTICLE VII—Duties of Officer

#### SECTION I—President

The duties of the President shall be:

- (a) To preside over all state meetings;
- (b) To appoint committees as

directed by the Messenger Body; (c) To call special meetings when necessary; (d) To be active in looking after the welfare of the work.

#### SECTION II—Vice Presidents

The duties of the First Vice President shall be:

(a) To preside over the meetings in the absence of the President or when called upon by the President; (b) To perform the duties that usually devolve upon such officers; (c) Shall be Chairman of the Committee to Stimulate Interest.

The duties of the Second Vice President shall be:

(a) To preside over the meeting in the absence of the President and First Vice President or when called upon; (b) Shall be the Chairman of the Program Committee; (c) To perform the duties that usually devolve upon such officers.

#### SECTION III—Secretary

The duties of the Secretary shall be:

(a) To keep a record of the proceedings of the meetings; (b) To announce special meetings; (c) To prepare and read reports as instructed by the Messenger Body; (d) To perform such other duties as may be necessary in carrying on the work of this office.

#### SECTION IV—Treasurer

The duties of the Treasurer shall be:

To receive and disburse funds as designated by the donors.

#### SECTION V — Corresponding Secretary

The duties of the Corresponding Secretary shall be:

(a) To correspond about necessary matters with the officers of the State Organization; (b) To report through our religious papers on the activities of Women's Work; (c) To correspond with the State Officers of other State Auxiliaries with regard to work and meetings; (d) To keep a mailing list of Auxiliaries over the state, both active and inactive; (e) To send copies of the State Women's Auxiliary program to each auxiliary before the state meeting; (f) To mail a report to all Auxiliaries in April and at the end of the year, when programs are mailed, concerning the State Project in an effort to encourage the help of all Auxiliaries in reaching our goal.

#### SECTION VI—Bible and Tract Distributor

The duties of the Bible and Tract Distributor shall be:

(a) To solicit funds and receive voluntary offering for Bible and Tract work; (b) To keep local auxiliaries informed about the needs for the carrying on of this work; (c) To supply local auxiliaries with tracts for distribution in their fields of work.

#### SECTION VII—Parliamentarian

The duties of the Parliamentarian shall be:

To advise the presiding officer on points of parliamentary law and also to give similar advice to the body when they request it.

**SECTION VIII—G. A. Promotional Director**

The duties of the G. A. Promotional Director shall include:

- (a) The promotion of existing G. A.'s; (b) Help in organizing new auxiliaries; (c) Publication of the G. A. Newsletter as needed.

**ARTICLE VIII—Membership**

Each church shall be entitled to three messengers who have been chosen by her Auxiliary and approved by the church.

**ARTICLE IX—Contributions**

**SECTION I**—All contributions to this Auxiliary shall be raised by voluntary offerings and shall be given to the Treasurer for proper disbursement.

**SECTION II**—At each annual meeting, the messengers shall select, by majority vote, a special project within the confines of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas, for the coming year. (a) Individual or District Auxiliaries who shall desire to nominate a project shall be encouraged to send a copy of the proposal to the Corresponding Secretary by September 1 so that she may include such information in a publicity letter to auxiliaries over the state before the State Meeting; (b) Individual or District Auxiliaries who nominate a project should be prepared to present adequate information concerning the project; (c) All project offerings shall be given to the Treasurer for proper disbursement.

**SECTION III**—At each annual session, a Tract Goal shall be selected. The Bible and Tract Distributor shall receive funds for this project and make proper disbursements.

**ARTICLE X—Reports**

**SECTION I**—This Auxiliary shall make an annual report of work accomplished by the combined Ladies Auxiliaries to the messengers of the churches which compose the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas when they are convened in annual session.

**POSTER RULES**

1. Each auxiliary circle is encouraged to bring one poster.
2. Each girl's auxiliary circle is allowed an entry.
3. We encourage the practice of lettering on all posters being done by members of the auxiliary. A person should not be hired for the job.
4. The posters are to be representative of the work which has been carried on throughout the past year. Pictures, facts or details should be given on the poster, making sure the project idea is carried over clearly.

5. New projects which have been underway need to be presented on the poster.
6. The posters should be of a uniform size—22 inches by 28 inches.
7. The name and location of the church can be placed on the front of the poster.
8. The posters will not be judged, but are for the purpose of sharing new ideas and projects with other ladies' auxiliaries.

### **CHRISTIAN OUTREACH REPORT**

We recommend the use of this report for encouragement of ourselves as auxiliaries in evaluation of our individual service to our Lord, our churches and others.

#### **Explanation of "Christian Outreach Through Ladies' Auxiliary"**

1. Personal Visits—Any personal visit on behalf of your church or function of your church.
2. Hospital Visits and Visits to Sick—Any visit to a person in the hospital or visit to sick in home.
3. Visits to Shut Ins—Any visit to a person confined at home or nursing home because of permanent sickness or disability.
4. Comfort Visits—Any personal visit made in time of death or adverse circumstances.
5. Telephone Calls—Any telephone call made on behalf of your church or to show Christian concern or encouragement.
6. Cards and Letters Sent—Any card or letter sent on behalf of your church or to show Christian concern or encouragement.
7. Bibles, Tracts or Literature Distributed—Bibles, tracts or literature given out other than in a class situation.
8. Soul Talks—Personal talks given with the intent of soul-winning or spiritual growth.
9. Flowers or Gifts Sent—Flowers or gifts sent in Christian love.
10. Food Gifts Sent—Food sent in time of need or to help or to encourage.
11. Christian Deeds Performed—Any deed performed in Christian love, outside of your regular church duties.
12. Conversions Witnessed—Seeing the fruit of salvation in a field that you helped cultivate.
13. Daily Bible Reader.
