Bro. James deeply loved the Lord, lost souls and the people of his pastorates. He inspired his family and many others to serve the Lord.

His family expresses thanks to all who helped to make his life to enjoyable and full.

MODERATOR'S ADDRESS

THE COMMAND — VICTORY

On January 16, 1991, the Commander-in-Chief of the United States Armed Forces, President George Bush, issued an order for the forces to assemble and take action necessary to liberate Kuwait. The unit leaders put a plan into action and began to move to carry out the order.

It is important to note that the personnel had been trained in exact detail as to what they were to do. They also knew what other units would be doing. Because of a plan well-laid and carried out, and with the blessing of God, there was quick and decisive victory.

I am proud to be an American. I am proud to be associated with this kind of defensive operation. I am proud to be numbered with a people of courage who trust in God.

Almost two-thousand years ago, the Commander-in-Chief of God's churches issued a command. This command was given to the first New Testament church which Jesus had called into existence. To this church, He gave the command, "Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature," Mark 16:15. Luke 24:47 states the command in this way, "And that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in his name among all nations, beginning at Jerusalem."

The command was given in detail, telling the church where to go and what to do: preach, baptize, and teach. After the resurrection, Jesus being assembled together with His church, reissued the command as recorded in Acts 1:8: "But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth."

With this command there has also been given examples and precepts of how to carry out the command. As Paul did after his conversion, it is effective to go and tell others what happened to you. As he stood before Agrippa, Paul recounted the Damascus Road experience as recorded in Acts 26. As he pressed for a decision, he asked, "Agrippa, believest thou the prophets?" Paul's expressed desire was that Agrippa be altogether a Christian.

Sharing the individual experience of grace has always been used effectively by the Holy Spirit to bring about conviction. In sharing the personal experience, it is important to include the gospel message. More important than the preacher who is preaching, more important than the teacher who is teaching, more important than the parent who is parenting, is the message: Jesus saved my soul."

The woman of Samaria said, "Come see a man that told me all things that ever I did. Is not this the Christ?" The man blind from his birth said, "Whereas I was blind, now I see." By inspiration God shares with man these experiences in order to show how to carry out His command.

For all these years God's people have been doing as Jesus commanded and winning victory after victory. God's commands are effective and this has been proven through past experience. Today's Christian does not lack for instruction nor example. Neither does he lack in equipment. All scripture is given by inspiration of God and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness . . ." The Christian worker needs only to hear God's Word and "Be doers of the Word and not hearers only."

God's command is still effective. It is the only way to win the victory. There are no new orders. There is no need for new orders. God, who knows the end from the beginning, knew what would be needed for this present generation. His command is still strong and pressing for execution. "Go" is the pressing instruction for you and me. Go into our communities. Go down the streets of our towns and cities. Go into the highways and hedges compelling people to come. Go, preaching the gospel as we go. Whether it is going next door or around the world, our going must be in the power of the Holy Spirit who came to give that power. As we go, claiming this power, there will be victory for Jesus.

As important as the going is, there must also be the preaching. Not just any preaching, but presenting Jesus Christ as the way of salvation. Jesus said, "I am the door . . ." The responsibility of the churches is to get people to enter by the door and let Jesus save. He so wants to come into the heart of each person. He is not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance.

In the past, churches have taught God's command to new converts, thus passing on His work to the following generations. The success of God's work where you are, depends on doing God's command. As this plan is followed, churches pass on the work of God from one soldier to another.

With these workable commands and the power to carry them forth, God's people need only to obey. Should there be more victories where you minister? Do you want more people saved? Then there needs to be more following of the orders of God. No tricks, no gimmicks, just going forth preaching the gospel as Christ commanded and teaching obedience to His Word. There is assurance from Jesus of victory when His Word is followed. God's Word will not return unto Him void, but will accomplish its purpose.

The enjoyment of victory can be repeated again and again as work for God continues in accordance with His command. Thank God for decisive victories for Christ! There are victory celebrations daily! In the church where you serve, or in a church down the road or across town or in another city or country. The sound of victory is heard again and again as sinners repent and receive Jesus as Savior.

I am proud to be a Christian. I am proud to be a soldier of Jesus Christ. I am proud to serve in His army. I am proud to be a Missionary Baptist because of their stand for truth.

Let us be challenged with the command from Jesus, care for the business at hand, and return to the fields of labor to follow His command and rejoice in His victories!

NOVEMBER 12, 1991

Brother Perry Carlisle directed the messengers and visitors in singing "To God Be The Glory" to begin the 1991 session of the messengers meeting of 1991. He was accompanied by Brother Doug McFarland at the keyboard. Brother Earl Reynolds led the opening prayer.

The Men's Ensemble of Texas Baptist Institute and Seminary sang a special entitled "There Is A New Name."

Moderator Billy Daniels asked Brother Kevin Plaster of New Haven Missionary Baptist Church of Clarksville to bring a devotional. Brother Plaster read Acts 17:26-31 and brought an uplifting devotional on the subject "The Security of The Believer."

Pastors Billy Eden and Gary Roberts brought words of welcome on behalf of the host churches. Brother Roberts introduced Mayor Judy McDonald of the city of Nacogdoches, Police Lieutenant Norris Dudley, and Linda Millard, Convention Center Director for a warm welcome from each of their respective departments. The moderator asked Brother Glenn Griffith to give the response to the welcome on behalf of the messenger body.

The following out of state visitors were recognized: Brother Earl Mooney and Brother and Sister Travis Arden of Hobbs, New Mexico; Brother Vernon Lierly and Brother and Sister Ron Hoover of Albuquerque, New Mexico; Brethren Wayne Sewell, Tom Sannes, and Bill Johnson of Texarkana; Brother David Smith of Florida; Brother Dwight Curtis of Bogg Springs Camp; Brother David Humber of Shreveport; Brother Robert Myers of Maryland; Brother Roy Hawthorne of Arizona; Brother Ronnie Munson of Germany and Brother Walter Shuler of Pennsylvania.

Several men who are new pastors in the State were recognized.

A motion and second carried to honor the request of Brother Bill Johnson that the Publication Report be the first order of business. Brother Steve Butler of Henderson, a member of the Sunday School Committee of the American Baptist Association, gave the report. There was a motion and second to adopt the report. The report was addressed by Brethren Butler, Tom Sannes, Bill Johnson, Steve Reeves, Steve F. Vaughn, Ray O. Brooks, Elvin Crocker, and Charles Swilling and then adopted.

The Tellers were asked to distribute printed copies of the Auditor's Report to the messengers. Auditor Steve F. Vaughn discussed the report and it was adopted.

(One-half Salary) Brother Danny Chappell of Arlington, recommended by Crestview Baptist Church of Arlington; Brother Larry Shelby of El Paso, recommended by Wyndrock Baptist Church of Abilene; Jorge Cordero of Garland, recommended by Golden Meadows Baptist Church of Garland; and Roddy Rodgers of Floresville, recommended by Harmony Baptist Church of Houston. Several of the above recommendations contained a request for Designated Funds if the missionary was not placed on salary.

Brother Bill Kuykendall of Calvary Baptist Church, Henderson and Missionary Roy Ramon of San Angelo expressed their thanks for the support given the work in San Angelo. They announced that the mission would organize into a New Testament Church on December 7, 1991.

Each recommended missionary or the sponsoring pastor was given an opportunity to present the needs of their work to the messengers and to field questions concerning their progress.

A motion and second carried to adjourn until 2:00 P.M. Brother Marc Schultz led the dismissal prayer.

2:00 P.M.

The Music Directors led the congregation in singing "The Solid Rock" and Brother Calvin Francis of Corsicana led the opening prayer. Sister Joyce Arden of Hobbs, New Mexico sang a special entitled "He Grew The Tree."

The balance of the missionaries and sponsoring pastors who did not have an opportunity to speak before dismissal for lunch spoke concerning their work.

Brother Darrel Owens, pastor of Landmark Baptist Church, Mt. Enterprise, expressed appreciation for the support given Missionary Wesley Veazey while working in Corpus Christi, Texas. He also announced that the church was searching for another missionary to go to Corpus Christi as Brother Veazey had accepted a church in Arizona.

Brother Calvin Francis made a motion to consider all those missionaries who were on the field last year as they came recommended this year. The motion received a second. Brother Marvin Gardner of Tyler made a substitute motion that each missionary be voted on separately. The substitute motion carried.

The following missionaries were recommended for full salary: Marlin Freeman, Tim Zepeda, Paul Hull, Jim Golden, and Frank Cooper. The following were recommended for half-salary: Larry Shelby, Danny Chappell, Jorge Cordero, and Roddy Rodgers. Brother Ron Hoover was not recommended for salary.

A motion and second carried to set the missionaries' salary the same as last year which was \$500.00 per week.

A motion and second carried to set the Secretary/Treasurer's salary the same as last year which was \$539.00 per week. A motion and second prevailed to set the Office Help salary at \$250.00 per month again.

The Auditor's salary was set at \$600.00 per year.

A motion and second carried to re-imburse the Trustees of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas for expenses incurred on their trip to Corsicana to take care of the business of the Office Building there.

A motion carried to set the housing allowance for the Secretary/Treasurer at a figure up to \$1000.00 per month and the mileage expense at the IRS allowable, plus expenses for meals and lodging away from home.

A motion and second carried to allow salaried missionaries up to \$1000.00 per month housing allowance.

Recommendations for missionaries on Designated Funds were called for and Brother George Goodman of Lockhart, recommended by Faith Mission-

ary Baptist Church of San Antonio spoke concerning his work. Brother Ron Hoover of Albuquerque, New Mexico was also recommended for Designated Funds. Both of these men were elected.

A motion prevailed to elect the Special Missionary Advisory Committee. There were no substitutions offered and the committee was reelected.

Brother B. A. Morris gave the Benevolence Report. A motion and second was made to adopt the report and it was spoken to by Brethren Earl Crosswhite, Superintendent of the Texarkana Baptist Orphanage, C. D. Walker Jr.; J. A. Lyles, speaking about Foster Home Care; Brother Leon Hawkins, speaking about the Mexican Orphans Home of Juarez, Mexico; and Brother Bill Pollard of Andrews, spoke as one who had received benevolent care.

Pastor James Slocumb of Rocky Springs Missionary Baptist Church, Dialville, gave the Texas Mission Development Report. After a motion and second to adopt, it was spoken to by Brother Slocumb and Brother Jerald Head, pastor of First Missionary Baptist Church of Duncanville. Brother Head expressed appreciation for the record-breaking offering of last quarter in the amount of \$10,557.00 which was given to their mission at Mabank, Texas. Missionary C. E. Patton was unable to attend but sent thanks on behalf of the mission. The report was adopted.

Pastor Leroy Smith of Sulphur Springs Missionary Baptist Church, Mt. Enterprise, gave the Texas Mission Builders report. In addition to Brother Smith's comments several pastors who had experienced the help given by TMB spoke, expressing appreciation for the money their church saved through the program. The report was adopted.

The Interstate/Foreign Missions Report was given by Brother Carroll Grigsby of Angleton. A motion and second to adopt was made and Brother Grigsby related a message from Secretary/Treasurer D. S. Madden who was unable to be present because of an illness. Brother Leon Hawkins of Del Rio also spoke before the motion carried.

Brother John Sanders of Faith Baptist Church, New Boston, read the Youth Report. It was discussed by Brother Gene Hoover of Pine Springs Baptist Camp; Brother Dwight Curtis of Bogg Springs Baptist Camp; Brother Kenneth Griffith of College Station concerning MBSF work; Brother Bill Lynch of San Antonio concerning the Mission Valley Baptist Camp; and Brother H. W. Coulter of Atlanta. The report was adopted.

Sister Joy Eddins of DeKalb gave the Women's Work Report. It was discussed by Sister Eddins and adopted.

Brother Larry Neeley of Hughes Springs gave the Music Ministry Report in the absence of Brother Jay Pollan. A motion and second carried to adopt the report.

Brother Charles Swilling gave the ABA Credit Union Report and it was adopted.

Brother Carroll Williams read the Resolution Committee Report which contained a resolution from Carthage Missionary Baptist Church asking for the messengers to re-affirm their support of Doctrinal Statement Number Sixteen concerning the New Testament Church being a local, visible body. There was a motion and second to adopt. Brother Ralph Simmons of Brooks Chapel Baptist Church, Beckville, addressed the resolution and it carried with slight opposition.

Brother Steve F. Vaughn moved that the Trustees be instructed to draw up an instrument in keeping with the action taken earlier concerning the \$1000.00 housing allowances for the missionaries and authorizing the Trustees to sign the document. The motion carried.

Brother Donald L. Britton gave the History and Archives Committee Report. A motion and second was made to adopt the report. It was spoken to by Brother Britton and Brother J. W. A motion and second was made to dismiss until 7:00 P.M. Announcements were made and Brother Wade Duck of Overton led the dismissal prayer.

The Wednesday evening session was opened with a packed auditorium of messengers and visitors singing "Victory In Jesus" and "He Is Lord." The moderator asked special prayer on behalf of Vice-Moderator Larry Neeley who had been called home because of the death of a church member. Brother Coy Wylie led the opening prayer.

Host Pastor Gary Roberts made several acknowledgements and announcements. He then presented a choir from Nacogdoches Missionary Baptist Church under the direction of Brother Richard Chambers.

Brother Mike Evans of Timberlakes Baptist Church, Spring, introduced Brother Domingo Padernal of the Philippine Islands for the Evening Message. Brother Padernal is sponsored by the Timberlakes Church. Brother Terry Carlisle sang a special entitled "Walk On." Brother Padernal read

Matthew 6:19-21 for a message entitled "Laying Up Treasures." The moderator asked Brother P. A. Dubose to extend the right hand of appreciation on behalf of the congregation.

Brother Jack Blake of Angleton, a student at Texas Baptist Institute and Seminary, was asked to sing a special entitled "Thank You For Giving To The Lord," after which Brother Bill Kuykendall gave the Texas Baptist Institute and Seminary Report for Calvary Baptist Church of Henderson. There was a motion and second to adopt. The motion was spoken to by Brother Kuykendall and Brother Ray O. Brooks, then adopted.

Brother Ken Ashlock gave the Mexican Baptist Institute Report for New Liberty Baptist Church of Garland. A motion and second was made to adopt. Brother Ashlock, Brother Brad Mitchell, and Brother Al Valladares addressed the motion and it was adopted.

Brother Bill Simpson gave the West Texas Baptist Institute Report for Tall City Missionary Baptist Church of Midland. The motion to adopt was spoken to by Brother Simpson, Brother Mike Thompson, Brother Bill Pollard, and Brother Hoyt Chastain before being adopted.

Brother Mike Thompson gave the Enrollment and Finance Committee Report and it was received. The estimated attendance Wednesday evening was 400.

A motion and second carried to have a full page dedication in the minutes in memory of Brother James Albritton of Amarillo who passed away during the past year.

Brother David Wilson read a resolution of thanks to Host Churches. It carried with a rising vote of response.

The newly elected officers were given an opportunity to respond to their election.

A motion prevailed to give the missionaries and the Secretary/Treasurer, including the two missionaries going off the field, a Christmas Bonus in the amount of \$100.00.

Brother Hoyt Chastain made a motion which was duly seconded to purchase a reasonably good watch with the time of service engraved to be presented to Brother Harold Davis in appreciation of his twenty-nine years of service as a Recording Clerk. The Minute Funds are to be used for the purchase. The motion carried.

A motion was made to adjourn. Announcements and prayer requests were heard. Brother Mike Daniel of Austin led the dismissal prayer.

TEXAS BAPTIST INSTITUTE AND SEMINARY REPORT

Forty-three years have passed since Calvary Missionary Baptist Church following the leadership of the Spirit of God established the Texas Baptist Institute and Seminary. These have been years of growth and development. They have been years of testings and heartaches. But they have also been years of joys and blessings. Through all these years Calvary and TBI have worked together to accomplish God's purpose in the school. And while we worked, we depended on the Lord to use His churches to supply our needs. To all our supporting churches, we say, "Thank you for letting God use you to care for our needs. Thank you for giving—giving your money—giving your young men—giving your words of encouragement." Without you and your help, the work could never have been done. These have been a good forty-three years and we thank everyone who has had a part in making them so.

The 1990-91 school year ended May 20, 1991 with twenty-one diplomas of different levels of study being presented to nineteen students. Forty-four other students received Certificates of Merit. Fifty-six students enrolled for the first semester of the 1991-92 school year. The first semester was completed November 7 and classroom work began the following day. A few new students have enrolled for the second semester. Overall enrollment is down about ten percent from last year. This should encourage us all to pray the Lord to call many fine young men into His special service. Few weeks pass without some pastor or church asking where they can find a trained Music Director or an Educational Director. We need to pray about these needs also.

All of us are well aware of the fiscal stress being placed on our public schools. Our Missionary Baptist schools are not exempt. The financial needs of TBI continue to increase year by year. We have made some adjustments, but there are some areas over which we have no control. Special TBI Rally days continue to help some in caring for these increasing financial needs. Churches and associations holding these in the past year are New Liberty of Garland, Missionary of Angleton, Tri-County Association at Landmark of Athens, and Shelby County Association at Heritage of Center. Two TBI Rally days will be held on Saturday, November 23. Nedville MBC will host one for the Bethlehem Association churches beginning at 10:00 A.M. and the Landmark MBC of Athens will host one for the Tri-County Association churches at 7:00 P.M. The Anderson County Youth Fellowship will hold a TBI Rally at their November meeting with the Pleasant Grove MBC of Maydelle at 2:30 P.M. The annual TBI Rally by the Shelby County

Association churches will be hosted by the Heritage MBC of Center at 7:00 P.M. on Thursday the fifth of December. Other churches and associations of churches are encouraged to hold TBI Rallies. These will help all of us to become better acquainted while helping to meet the increasing needs of our school.

The food storeroom continues to be widely used. Some students would not be able to continue in school if it were not for this "grocery store without a cash register." This is a most rewarding project for Women's Auxiliaries, Youth Fellowships, and churches. Some churches and some church auxiliaries adopt student families and care for many of their personal needs. We recommend an enlargement of this practice. Those interested in adopting a student family may contact Brother Brooks at the school. The ladies of Calvary MBC of Henderson continue to be a special blessing to the student families at Christmas time. With the help of auxiliaries from many other churches huge Christmas baskets of food are given to all students. The Calvary ladies are very thankful for all who help in this project.

The A. J. Kirkland Memorial Lectures continue to be recognized as one of the top lecture programs in our ABA work. The 1991 series will be brought by Dr. Albert Garner, one of the outstanding writers and lecturers in our ABA fellowship. Brother Garner will speak each morning at 10:45 beginning on Tuesday, December 3rd and concluding Friday, December 6th. Tuesday will also be Visitor's Day. Services will begin at 9:30 a.m. with music and sermons prior to Brother Garner's message. Lunch will be served at the school. The afternoon will be open for a time of fine fellowship. The annual TBI Alumni Banquet will be held at 7:00 p.m. in the Henderson Community Center. Pastor Jim Slocumb of the Rocky Springs MBC will bring the message.

Finally, we wish to again acknowledge that without the help of our sister churches, Calvary MBC could never have brought TBI to the place of matured responsibility in associational Baptist work that she now holds. Please accept our heartfelt thanks for all you have done and continue to pray for us as we work and wait for our Lord's return.

On August 15, 1990 New Liberty Baptist Church assumed the sponsorship of Mexican Baptist Institute (formerly A.B.A. Mexican Baptist Institute). Since that time, there have been some difficult struggles as we attempted to pull the school, its workers and its work back together. After much work and prayer, we (New Liberty Baptist Church) feel that there is unity, and a singleness of purpose between the sponsoring church, school officials, faculty, as well as among other fellowhelpers and supporting churches. We want to use this opportunity to thank everyone who has supported the school during these difficult times. Your prayerful and financial support is greatly appreciated.

Although it seems impossible, we are nearing mid-semester of our first half of the '91-92 school year. We have 29 students enrolled as full-time students attending classes in Reynosa, Mexico. In addition to these, we also have 10 part-time students attending classes in McAllen. There is a total of 19 teachers helping us this year as instructors. We are excited about the possibilities of this school year, and we ask that you pray for our teachers and students as they continue this year of study.

Two churches have been organized recently as a result of mission efforts in Mexico. One church organized with 40 members, and is pastored by Bro. Francisco Ocanas, one of our current instructors and a graduate of the school. Another church organized with 39 members. Soon, we also look forward to the work in Saltillo, Coahuila organizing as a church. Bro. Jose Leos, also a graduate and an instructor, serves as the pastor of this work.

These reports simply show the value of our school in the Rio Grande Valley. Our school enables the Mexico brethren to receive quality Christian Education, and prepares them to share their knowledge of Christ with the people of their country. We pray that our outreach will continue to grow as we train men called by God to preach the gospel.

We are carrying an increased workload at Mexican Baptist Institute, and with the additional work come additional expenses. Currently we are in a budget crisis, as we have averaged about a \$2,000.00 loss per month recently in our general fund. We are praying for faithful supporters and additional helpers as we carry on this work for the Lord. Please consider Mexican Baptist Institute as your church plans its financial support of missions and Christian Education. We desperately need regular supporters to help us offset this monthly deficit.

There are several who are currently doing mission work that could use additional assistance as well. They are laboring with their hands, and using the small amount they receive to go and do His work. They are making great sacrifices for the Kingdom of God. If your church is interested in investing in Mexico missions, please feel free to contact our school, and the brethren will be happy to help in any way possible.

Please pray for Mexican Baptist Institute, and this great work in the Rio Grande Valley. You are a strength to us as we reach into a foreign field with the gospel of Christ. Come and visit our school first-hand if you are able. We would love for you to see the results of this ministry.

A. B. A. CREDIT UNION REPORT

The American Baptist Association Credit Union has been in existence since March 17, 1970. It was established as a savings and lending institution to help Missionary Baptist people and churches.

The membership is extended to ordained and licensed ministers and employees of the churches fellowshipping in the American Baptist Association and church members in New Mexico, Oklahoma, Arkansas, Louisiana, and Texas.

The interest rate is usually lower or comparable to other lending institutions. The Credit Life Insurance is paid by the Credit Union. The interest on loans is figured on the unpaid balance monthly. Dividends are paid quarterly on shares and a detailed statement of your account is mailed at the end of each quarter.

The American Baptist Association Credit Union is regulated by the laws of the State of Texas. All savings are insured to \$100,000 by National Credit Union Administration, a U. S. Government Agency.

As of September 30, 1991 there were 388 members with total assets of \$512,857 and loans outstanding in the amount of \$259,789.

The Credit Union office is located in Pasadena, Texas. The Board of Directors is made up of area men: Rev. C. H. McBryde, Rev. D. B. Wright, Rev. B. A. Morris, Rev. Charles Swilling, Rev. George White, Rev. Johnny Williams and Dave Dalton.

The annual meeting for the membership is held the last Friday night in February each year. You are urged to become a member and start a savings account with YOUR credit union.

“Unto thee, O God, do we give thanks, unto thee do we give thanks: for that thy name is near thy wondrous works declare” (Psalm 75:1). We continue to give thanks for the way God provides our needs here at the orphanage. We especially want to say thanks to our churches, trustees and all others who have supported in any way. You have made it possible for us to touch the lives of 68 children during this past year. We hope their lives have been made better for having been here.

Our average number of residents has varied this year with a maximum of 44 last spring and a minimum of 31 at this time. We had two seniors to graduate, one boy to go to the army, and several children have been able to return to their home communities.

We continue to have problems with the child care agencies. They prefer to take children and place them in homes with no regard for the child's spiritual training. We feel that if our churches would become more aware of the needy children in their areas before the agencies become involved, we would have more opportunities to help the children of our state. You have provided a good facility, and we want to use it for those needing help and for God's glory.

There have been several improvements to our facilities this year. We have continued to make needed repairs to our buildings and have purchased a double wide mobile home for our relief houseparents. We believe we now have the nicest children's home in our state.

Not only has God provided our physical needs this year, He has also given us a complete staff of houseparents to better care for the children. This is the first time that this has been possible. Our staff includes 4 couples plus an extra for relief when they take their 5 days a month off. We can now provide each child with not only food, clothing and shelter, but also a new family that will receive them, love them and show them that God loves them just as they are. We believe that the family is the foundation that God uses to begin healing of young lives that have been broken.

The full staff has required that our budget be increased. We feel this is justified because of the additional individual care provided for our children. Past problems in keeping houseparents has been due to overloading and double duty that has been required because of too few workers. We hope you can understand our need for the full crew and will help us meet our budget needs.

During this past year we have had 17 children saved and united with our church. We believe this makes all the expenses, labor and problems worthwhile.

Again, we want to say thanks to all who have had a part in helping with our children's spiritual lives. We thank God for your concern for these unfortunate children. Remember us in your prayers that God might use us in a greater way this coming year to help more children.

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT MBA OF TEXAS

1. We believe in the plenary verbal inspiration and inerrancy of the whole Bible as originally written, and that the Bible is the all-sufficient rule of faith and practice, (Psalm 119-160; II Tim. 3:16-17).
2. We believe in the personal triune God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, equal in divine perfection, (Matt. 28:19).
3. We believe in the Genesis account of creation, (Gen. 1, 2).
4. We believe that Satan is a fallen angel, the archenemy of God and man, the unholy god of this world and that his destiny is the eternal lake of fire, (Isa. 14:12-15; Ezek. 28:11-19; Matt. 25:41; II Cor. 4:4; Eph. 6:10-17; Rev. 20:10).
5. We believe in the virgin birth and sinless humanity of Jesus Christ, (Matt. 1:18-20; II Cor. 5:21; I Peter 2:22).
6. We believe in the Deity of Jesus Christ, (John 1:1, 14; 10:30; 14:9; II Cor. 5:19).
7. We believe that the Divine Administrator for Jesus Christ in His churches is the Holy Spirit (Luke 24:49; John 14:16, 17; 16:13; Act 1:4, 5, 8), whose work as such began on the first Pentecost after the resurrection of Jesus Christ with the Baptism of the Holy Spirit, which event occurred only once and is not repeated, (Acts 2).
8. We believe that the miraculous gifts of the Spirit listed in I Cor. 12:8-10 were done away when the Bible was completed (I Cor. 13:8-10), that the gift of apostleship ceased with the death of the last chosen directly by the Lord Jesus (Eph. 2:20), and that the abiding gifts adequately equip the churches for service to God, (Rom. 12:13; I Cor. 13:1-3; Eph. 4:7-16; I Peter 4:10, 11; II Tim. 3:16, 17). (See explanatory note at the end of this doctrinal statement.)
9. We believe that man was created in the image of God and lived in innocence until he fell by voluntary transgression from his sinless state, the result being that all mankind are now sinners, (Gen. 1:26; 3:6-24; Rom. 5:12, 19).

10. We believe the substitutionary suffering and death of Jesus Christ was sufficient to propitiate for the sins of all humanity, thus making salvation available for all mankind, (Isa. 53:6; Heb. 2:9; I Peter. 2:24; 3:18; II Peter. 3:9; I John 2:2).
11. We believe in the bodily resurrection and ascension of Christ and the bodily resurrection of His saints, (Matt. 28:1-7; Acts 1:9-11; I Cor. 15:42-58; I Thess. 4:13-18).
12. We believe in the pre-millennial, personal, bodily return of Christ as the crowning event of the Gentile Age. We further believe at His coming the righteous dead shall be raised, the living saints shall be changed and both shall be caught up to meet the Lord in the air. We also believe after the Millennial Reign of Christ on earth the unrighteous shall be resurrected unto eternal punishment in the lake of fire, (John 14:1-6; I Thess. 4:13-18; II Thess. 2:8; Rev. 20: 4-6, 11-15; 21:8).
13. We believe the depraved alien sinner is saved wholly by grace through faith in Jesus Christ and the requisites to regeneration are repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ (Luke 13:3, 5; John 3:16, 18; Acts 20:21; Rom. 6:23; Eph. 2:8, 9), and the Holy Spirit convicts sinners and regenerates, seals, secures, and indwells every believer, (John 3:6; 16:8, 9; Rom. 8:9-11; I Cor. 6:19, 20; Eph. 4:30; Titus 3:5).
14. We believe all who trust in Jesus Christ for salvation are eternally secure and shall persevere in Him and shall not perish, (John 3:36; 5:24; 10:27-30; Rom. 8:35-39; Heb. 10:39; I Peter 1:5).
15. We believe God deals with believers as His children, chastises the disobedient, blesses the obedient in this life and reserves rewards for the future, (Matt. 16:27; 25:14-23; John 1:12; Heb. 12:5-11; II John 8; Rev. 22:12).
16. We believe Jesus Christ , during His personal ministry, established His Church, which is a local, visible assembly of scripturally baptized believers in covenant relationship, to carry out the Commission of the Lord Jesus Christ. We further believe each church is an independent, self-governing body over which no other ecclesiastical body may exercise authority. We believe Jesus Christ gave the Great Commission to New Testament churches only, and promised the perpetuity (Matt. 4:18-22; 16:18; 18:15-18; 28:19-20; Mark 1:14-20; John 1:35-51; Eph. 3:21).

17. We believe there are two pictorial ordinances in the Lord's churches: baptism and the Lord's Supper. Scriptural baptism is the immersion of penitent believers in water, administered by the authority of a New Testament church in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. We further believe the Lord's Supper is a memorial ordinance, restricted to the members of the church observing the ordinance, (Matt. 28:19, 20; Acts. 8:12, 38; Rom. 6:4; I Cor. 5:11-13; 11:1, 2, 17-20, 26).

18. We believe there are two divinely appointed offices in a church, pastor and deacon, to be filled by men whose qualifications are set forth in I Tim. 3:1-16; Titus 1:5-9.

19. We believe all associations, fellowships, conventions, boards, and their committees are servants of the churches, (Matt. 20:25-28).

20. We believe in the complete separation of churches and state (Matt. 22:21) and affirm our belief in civil obedience unless the laws and regulations of civil government run contrary to the Holy Scriptures (Rom. 13:1-7; I Peter 2:13-15; Acts. 5: 29).

Footnote: "I suggest this explanation: 'The apostles and prophets were the inspired agents through whom the New Testament revelation was given. When that revelation was complete, there was no further need for the office of apostle and prophet; thus, the apostleship ceased with the death of the last apostle chosen directly by the Lord Jesus.'"— James Kirkland.

STATEMENT OF MISSION POLICY

SECTION I

The messengers of the churches of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas will not recommend any man to the mission field unless he has first been elected or endorsed by the church of his membership, said church being associated with and subscribing to the principles and practices of the churches of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas.

SECTION II

Each church recommending a missionary from their membership to the churches of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas in annual session is requested:

1. To submit in writing, hereafter, to the Secretary-Treasurer's Mission Office, the endorsement of any missionary, whether salaried or on designated funds, and/or a mission project of any sponsoring church, by the fifteenth (15th) day of September prior to each messenger meeting.
2. To submit for public reading a brief summary of the ministerial activities of the recommended missionary.
3. To give a statement as what their plans are concerning their support of the missionary being recommended.
4. To give the location of the area where the recommended missionary will devote his labor.

This information concerning the recommended missionary, his abilities, training and work will greatly aid the messengers from the churches in making their decision about individual missionaries.

SECTION III

We recognize that a missionary elected by his local church, if it be a Scriptural church, is a Scriptural missionary, without recommendation of the messengers from the churches of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas.

SECTION IV

Any messenger may request an individual vote on any name recommended for endorsement to the messengers in annual session.

SECTION V

We recognize as Scriptural the right of the messengers in annual session to recommend stipulated salaries for the missionaries.

We also recognize the responsibility of the sponsoring church and the mission to aid in raising the missionary's salary. Therefore, the corresponding Secretary-Treasurer shall not be permitted to pay over 80 (eighty) percent of the missionary's salary.

SECTION VI

All missionaries of the churches working as State Missionaries under the recommendations of the messengers shall:

Make duplicate monthly reports to their endorsing church and Secretary-Treasurer.

1. These reports shall tell of the work done during the month and shall list all money, material and monetary gifts collected on the field. All money collected on the field shall be counted as salary, unless the money is designated to some special church or mission project, with the following exceptions:

- a. **MATERIAL GIFTS**

Missionaries shall have the same privilege as pastors in receiving material gifts above their salary and shall not be required to report them as salary.

Material gifts are defined as items (or money for them) as:

Clothing

Automobile accessories

Household goods

- b. **MONETARY GIFTS**

Monetary gifts are defined as such gifts as pastors receive for:

Weddings

Funerals

At Christmas season

Honorariums

etc.

- c. **REVIVALS**

The missionaries and the Secretary-Treasurer may hold as many as two revivals each year without reporting the funds received for the revivals.

- d. **VACATIONS**

The missionaries and the Secretary-Treasurer may have two weeks paid vacation each year in addition to two revival meetings.

2. All reports shall be made available to the churches and a yearly report published in the minutes.
3. The endorsing church is requested to provide a report annually for the messengers assembly regarding:
 - a. The amount and nature of all material and monetary gifts.
 - b. An assessment is requested as to whether there has been any abuse of this privilege on the part of the missionary.

SECTION VII

State Mission work shall be defined as follows:

1. Work in cities where we have no Missionary Baptist Churches, or in cities large enough to have two or more churches.
2. Work with weak pastorless churches, to aid them in growing and securing a pastor.
3. Although we look with favor on revival meetings, revivals in established churches with regular pastors, should not be counted as mission work.
4. A month's work should include at least 160 hours actually spent in constructive mission work.

SECTION VIII

We recommend:

1. The missionaries seek fields in sections of the state where we have no churches.
2. The missionaries should seek out a church to sponsor the mission that is consistent in their support of missions, and that is of sufficient strength to fulfill the responsibility of a sponsoring church, and that the sponsoring church adopt a policy concerning the mission that would not allow it to be organized into a church until it becomes self-supporting in every respect, including a full-time pastor on the field.
3. That the missionaries begin teaching leading newly organized missions and churches to support all phases of mission work and that they begin immediately to give support to the missionaries' salary and that such support be increased regularly as the work grows. The missionary and mission should work toward a goal of being able to support a pastor within five years. That this be done by seeking to support 20 percent of the missionary's salary within the first year, 40 percent within the second, 60 percent within the third, 80 percent within the fourth and within the fifth year of being able to support a full time pastor. The missionary should remain with the mission until it becomes self-supporting.
4. That the missionaries seek to lead the newly organized churches to adopt and put to proper use, a good Sunday School record system and plan of Sunday School organization.
5. That the missionaries lead the newly established churches to follow a definite plan of organized visitation evangelism.
6. That the missionaries not be used as supply preacher in our established churches where pastors are on the field.
7. That missionaries not pastor a church that is recognized as a self-supporting church, regardless of how much of his salary they might pay.
8. That the missionaries should not be elected to an office of the Association.

SECTION IX

The trustees of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas are authorized to relocate old mobile church units and locate new ones between sessions of the association under the following guidelines:

1. State Missionaries of this association on stipulated salary be given priority for usage of mobile units;
2. State missionaries of this association on designated offerings be eligible for mobile units when need by a salaried missionary is not imminent;
3. The trustees shall not relocate an old unit or locate a new one within the sixty days just prior to an associational meeting, but they shall refer the matter to the messenger assembly;
4. A mobile unit may be recalled by the messenger assembly in any annual session or called session.

SECTION X

May the statements of this policy never be interpreted as binding laws upon churches or missionaries, but as goals and guidelines.

SECTION XI

GUIDELINES FOR THE USE OF MOBILE UNITS:

- I. It is agreed that the churches of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas will:
 - A. Provide the mobile unit;
 - B. Pay for moving the unit;
 - C. Pay for relocating the unit;
 - D. Pay for major repairs brought on by physical damage outside the control of those using it, such as storm damage, vandalism and-or mechanical failure.
- II. It is agreed that the mission and-or sponsoring church will:
 - A. Provide the location for the unit;
 - B. Pay for all connections, such as water, gas, electricity, sewage;
 - C. Keep unit in good state of repair while in custody of mission and-or sponsoring church;
 - D. Pay for any and all repairs needed while in their use except those covered in Part I, Section D;
 - E. Pay for relocating or resetting unit while in their use;
 - F. Make no alterations in physical structure of unit without approval of trustees.
- III. After the unit is located and all connections made, the Mission Secretary, in company with the missionary and at least one member of the mission and-or sponsoring church, shall inspect the unit. The inspection shall reveal the condition of the unit at the time the mission

begins using it. A written record of such findings shall be signed by both parties and a copy of same provided for both parties.

- IV. A similar inspection called for in Part III shall be conducted before the unit is disconnected from the utilities at the time of moving from the custody of any mission and-or sponsoring church. The results of this inspection shall be recorded and signed by both parties.

SECTION XII

GUIDELINES FOR THE MBSF REPRESENTATIVE

1. The MBSF representative will meet the same qualifications and requirements of the missionaries as set forth in Sections I and II. The endorsing church should take the initiative in seeing that the representative abides by these guidelines.
2. He will receive the same salary as the missionaries.
3. He will be reimbursed for travel expenses related to the MBSF work outside his local area of residence at a rate prescribed by the messenger assembly.
4. Section VI of the Mission Policy shall apply to the MBSF Representative as well as to the missionaries.
5. He may use the mailing permit through the office of the Secretary-Treasurer for state-wide projects.
6. He will work with college and university students and not just serve as a supply preacher.
7. He will visit with and encourage MBSF groups already begun, aiding them in their programs and outreach.
8. He will seek to establish new campus MBSF chapters under the direction of a sponsoring church which works in the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas. No chapter will be organized without such a sponsoring church. It is recognized that each MBSF chapter is under the direction of a local church.
9. He will seek to develop a spirit of loyalty to Christ, to the Bible, to the local church and to the Missionary Baptist principles of faith and practice. He will neither promote nor participate in activity which compromises Missionary Baptist doctrinal positions, disturbs the lawful order of the citizenry or displays immorality. He will seek to encourage all chapters to function within the framework of school regulations.
10. He will publicize the MBSF work of this association and of the American Baptist Association, seeking to keep both mutually informed.

ARTICLE VII—Funds

Section 1. All funds of this Association shall be raised by voluntary donations secured solely upon the merits of the cause in the interest of which appeals are made for gifts: provided, this is not to prevent the use of any income or any property that may be acquired by donation or by purchase.

Section 2. Distribution of funds shall be authorized by an act of this Messenger Assembly, or by an act of properly authorized committees of this assembly hereinafter provided for; but in no instance shall the assembly or any committee of it use means in violation of the expressed preference of the donor.

ARTICLE VIII—Officers

Section 1. The officers of this Messenger Assembly shall be a moderator, and assistant moderator, two (2) recording secretaries and a corresponding secretary-treasurer.

Section 2. All officers of this assembly shall be chosen annually, and shall hold their offices until their successors are elected and the same shall be true of all members of standing committees. All officers shall be elected by a majority of the messengers voting. No moderator shall succeed himself more than one year.

Section 3. The duties of all officers shall be as may be directed by the Messenger Assembly, unless otherwise directed by the churches.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the corresponding secretary-treasurer to take charge of money and valuables not specifically entrusted to someone else and to dispose of same as he may be directed by this Messenger Assembly. He shall make an annual report to this assembly of all monies received and disbursed.

Section 5. The recording secretaries, in addition to keeping the records of this Association, will superintend the printing and distribution of minutes of such regular meetings as the messengers may direct.

ARTICLE IX—Committees

Section 1. The missionary committee shall be composed of one representative of each church choosing to be represented. The duty of the committee shall be to meet quarterly, or as directed by the Messenger Assembly, in the interest of all the work. It shall be empowered to fill vacancies of regular offices between sessions of the Messenger Assembly and to call a special meeting of a Messenger Assembly when needed.

Section 2. The following officers of the Assembly shall be the trustees of the association: Namely, the moderator, assistant moderator, two recording secretaries and secretary-treasurer, subject to the direction of the Messenger Assembly, and they are empowered to act in legal capacity as trustees of the Association.

ARTICLE X—Missionaries

We hold that the authority for execution of the Great Commission was given to the New Testament Church and the authority must remain forever with the churches. Therefore, the right and privilege of every church of this Association to endorse, set apart or send out missionaries of its own choosing and the act of one church in sending out missionaries can in no way bind or obligate any other church. The churches shall be free and their support of missionaries shall be voluntary on their part.

ARTICLE XI—Meetings

The regular meetings of the Church Messengers shall be at such time and place as the assembled messengers may appoint.

ARTICLE XII—Amendments

The Messenger Assembly shall have no power to change the Articles of Agreement. Any church desiring a change shall send to the annual meeting a copy of the proposed change; the Messenger Assembly will then submit the proposed change to each cooperating church; if two-thirds of the cooperating churches vote for the change, then the Article of Agreement shall be amended to conform to the proposed change. Two-thirds of the churches representing in assembly in the previous year shall be the number determining the results.

PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

THIS IS THE HOUR

Proverbs 31. What is a virtuous woman? Using God's Word as a guide and using a good dictionary, we find it means a woman possessing and maintaining moral excellence, righteous living, and basically having a good report always. These teachings and sayings found in Proverbs were sometimes called "The Alphabetical Poem of A Virtuous Woman." No matter who penned or collected these words of wisdom they are sound instructions for us to heed. Just as most Bibles say, these teachings were taught by King Lemuel's mother. Most of us were taught the same text.

What kind of clothing are *strength* and *honor*? Do we need a special sewing machine to make this garment? Strength is the material which stands any test of endurance. It is having and keeping Faith against any storm of life. Adorning Honour is perhaps the most attractive attire a Christian woman could acquire. This includes a wholesome character, a good name and Jesus in her heart.

Missionary Baptist ladies and visitors, this is the hour to take an inventory of our life, shedding all unrighteousness, and assuming the position God intended us to fill. We must help in the fight against the enemy. God has given us the ability and power to lead people, especially young people, from the hands of Satan.

The majority of this congregation were taught to grow up to be a good wife, a caring mother and to be a loving woman. After the presentation this morning, we all know homes are in danger across our nation. It appalls us to think homes are not the safe haven where a child can find help and Christianity. Conclusion: Since God is good and loves me and wants the best for me, I can say a whole hearted “Yes” to whatever God calls me to be or do.

Our ultimate goal must be the same as Paul's. It can only be accomplished with the strength and honour accumulated from righteous and clean moral living. This is the hour to determine to stretch our arms longer and expand our hearts to the fullest. We can reach further in love with abundant care and concern to the large and the small, to the black and white, to the rich and poor. We can, with the strength of God, open their eyes, and turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan unto Jesus Christ.

STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES TEXAS STATE WOMEN'S AUXILIARY

ARTICLE I—Name

The name of the organization shall be Women's Auxiliary of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas.

ARTICLE II—Definition

The Auxiliary shall be composed of messengers of the local auxiliaries of the churches which compose the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas.

ARTICLE III—Purpose

The purpose of this State Auxiliary shall be to encourage the women of the local churches to be active in all phases of the work in which they have the scriptural right to participate and to encourage the establishment of auxiliaries in all our churches where none exist.

ARTICLE IV—Time and Place

The State Auxiliary shall meet annually at 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday before the annual session of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas. The place of each meeting shall be determined by the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas messengers.

ARTICLE V—Officers

The officers of the State Auxiliary shall be: (1) President, (2) First Vice President, (3) Second Vice President, (4) Recording Secretary, (5) Assistant Recording Secretary, (6) Treasurer, (7) Assistant Treasurer, (8) Corresponding Secretary, (9) Bible and Tract Distributor, (10) Parliamentarian, (11) Girls' Auxiliary Promotional Director, (12) Assistant Girls' Auxiliary Promotional Director (to be appointed by the Director), (13) Advisory Council of 3.

ARTICLE VI

All officers shall be elected annually by nomination and majority vote and must be a member of an auxiliary. No officer shall succeed herself more than once consecutively except the Advisory Council, G. A. Promotional Director and Bible and Tract Distributor.

ARTICLE VII—Duties of Officers

SECTION I—President

The duties of the President shall be:

- (a) To preside over all state meetings;
- (b) To appoint committees as

directed by the Messenger Body; (c) To call special meetings when necessary; (d) To be active in looking after the welfare of the work.

SECTION II—Vice Presidents

The duties of the First Vice President shall be:

(a) To preside over the meetings in the absence of the President or when called upon by the President; (b) To perform the duties that usually devolve upon such officers; (c) Shall be Chairman of the Committee to Stimulate Interest.

The duties of the Second Vice President shall be:

(a) To preside over the meeting in the absence of the President and First Vice President or when called upon; (b) Shall be the Chairman of the Program Committee; (c) To perform the duties that usually devolve upon such officers.

SECTION III—Secretary

The duties of the Secretary shall be:

(a) To keep a record of the proceedings of the meetings; (b) To announce special meetings; (c) To prepare and read reports as instructed by the Messenger Body; (d) To perform such other duties as may be necessary in carrying on the work of this office.

SECTION IV—Treasurer

The duties of the Treasurer shall be:

To receive and disburse funds as designated by the donors.

SECTION V—Corresponding Secretary

The duties of the Corresponding Secretary shall be:

(a) To correspond about necessary matters with the officers of the State Organization; (b) To report through our religious papers on the activities of Women's Work; (c) To correspond with the State Officers of other State Auxiliaries with regard to work and meetings; (d) To keep a mailing list of Auxiliaries over the state, both active and inactive; (e) To send copies of the State Women's Auxiliary program to each auxiliary before the state meeting; (f) To mail a report to all Auxiliaries in April and at the end of the year, when programs are mailed, concerning the State Project in an effort to encourage the help of all Auxiliaries in reaching our goal.

SECTION VI—Bible and Tract Distributor

The duties of the Bible and Tract Distributor shall be: (a) To purchase and maintain an ample supply of tracts and Bibles; (b) Supply a list of available tracts to all auxiliaries in the state of Texas. Supply a sample pack to any auxiliary requesting it for the price of postage and handling; (c) Encourage all auxiliaries to support the Bible and Tract fund on a regular basis; (d) Accept contributions and disburse funds as needed for postage, purchasing, and publicity; (e) To chair a committee of 2 or 3 from her local area. This committee would assist the distributor in any way she needs and would be responsible for any publicity needed to make the district and local auxiliaries aware of the Bible and Tract program.

SECTION VII—Parliamentarian

The duties of the Parliamentarian shall be:

To advise the presiding officer on points of parliamentary law and also to give similar advice to the body when they request it.

SECTION VIII—G. A. Promotional Director

The duties of the G. A. Promotional Director shall include:

(a) The promotion of existing G. A.'s; (b) Help in organizing new auxiliaries; (c) Publication of the G. A. Newsletter as needed.

ARTICLE VIII—Membership

Each church shall be entitled to three messengers who have been chosen by her Auxiliary and approved by the church.

ARTICLE IX—Contributions

SECTION I—All contributions to this Auxiliary shall be raised by voluntary offerings and shall be given to the Treasurer for proper disbursement.

SECTION II—At each annual meeting, the messengers shall select, by majority vote, a special project within the confines of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas, for the coming year. (a) Individual or District Auxiliaries who shall desire to nominate a project shall be encouraged to send a copy of the proposal to the Corresponding Secretary by September 1 so that she may include such information in a publicity letter to auxiliaries over the state before the State Meeting; (b) Individual or District Auxiliaries who nominate a project should be prepared to present adequate information concerning the project; (c) All project offerings shall be given to the Treasurer for proper disbursement.

SECTION III—The Bible and Tract Distributor shall receive funds for the Bible and Tract program and make proper disbursements.

ARTICLE X—Reports

SECTION I—This Auxiliary shall make an annual report of work accomplished by the combined Ladies Auxiliaries to the messengers of the churches which compose the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas when they are convened in annual session.

POSTER RULES

1. Each auxiliary circle is encouraged to bring one poster.
2. Each girl's auxiliary circle is allowed an entry.
3. We encourage the practice of lettering on all posters being done by members of the auxiliary. A person should not be hired for the job.
4. The posters are to be representative of the work which has been carried on throughout the past year. Pictures, facts or details should be given on the poster, making sure the project idea is carried over clearly.

5. New projects which have been underway need to be presented on the poster.
6. The posters should be of a uniform size — 22 inches by 28 inches.
7. The name and location of the church can be placed on the front of the poster.
8. The posters will not be judged, but are for the purpose of sharing new ideas and projects with other ladies' auxiliaries.

3. Visits to Shut Ins—Any visit to a person confined at home or nursing home because of permanent sickness or disability.
4. Comfort Visits—Any personal visit made in time of death or adverse circumstances.
5. Telephone Calls—Any telephone call made on behalf of your church or to show Christian concern or encouragement.
6. Cards and Letters Sent—Any card or letter sent on behalf of your church or to show Christian concern or encouragement.
7. Bibles, Tracts or Literature Distributed—Bibles, tracts or literature given out other than in a class situation.
8. Soul Talks—Personal talks given with the intent of soul-winning or spiritual growth.
9. Flowers or Gifts Sent—Flowers or gifts sent in Christian love.
10. Food Gifts Sent—Food sent in time of need or to help or to encourage.
11. Christian Deeds Performed—Any deed performed in Christian love, outside of your regular church duties.
12. Conversions Witnessed—Seeing the fruit of salvation in a field that you helped cultivate.
13. Daily Bible Reader.
