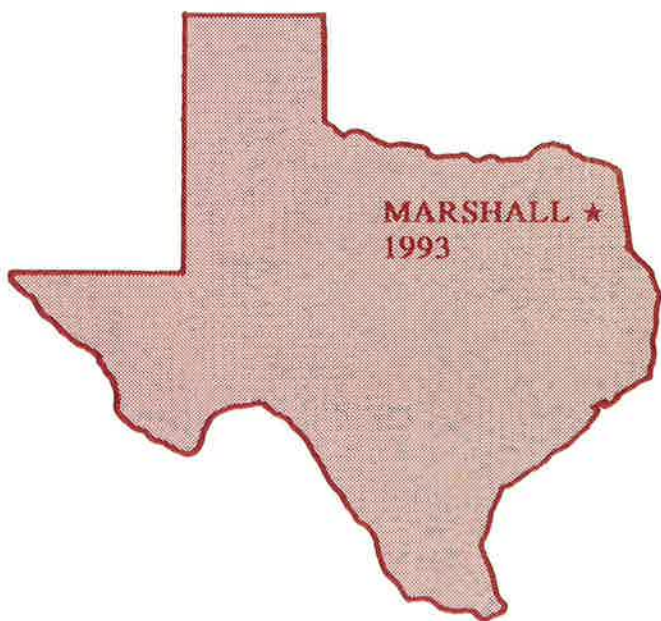

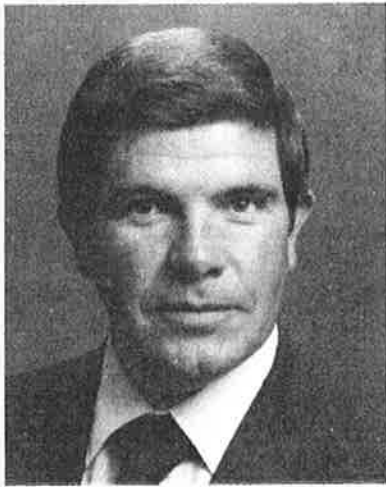

1942 - 1992

Paul T. Owens was born August 13, 1942 in Cushing, Texas. He died August 12, 1992. He was saved at the Sulphur Springs Missionary Baptist Church in Mt. Enterprise, Texas, where he later surrendered to preach at the age of 16.

After finishing Mt. Enterprise High School, he married Linda Rasberry from Laneville, Texas.

Bro. Paul was a graduate of Texas Baptist Institute and Seminary, receiving his Doctor's Certificate. He pastored Moss Hill Missionary Baptist Church, Mt. Bethel Baptist Church in Gary, Timpson Missionary Baptist Church and Walnut Street Baptist Church in Hillsboro. He spent the last 18 years as pastor of Walnut Street.

Bro. Paul served as Moderator for the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas for two years (1987, 1988). He was widely used as an evangelist, loved people dearly and was deeply involved in missions. His love for his family and church was excelled only by his love for the Lord.

Moderator's Address "Separation"

"Wherefore, come out from among them and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you and will be a Father unto you and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord Almighty." II Corinthians 6:17,18.

Christians are unique people! They are believers, in contrast to unbelievers; they are workers of righteousness in contrast to workers of unrighteousness; they are children of light and not children of darkness; they belong to Christ, and not to Belial, they are the temple of God and must have no part with idolatry.

Because of this, believers are to come out and be separate from those who do not love God and who deny Him and the great truths of His Word.

Separation is a very prominent Bible doctrine. It is emphasized from Genesis to Revelation. In creation, God saw the light that it was good and separated the light from the darkness. God instructed Abram to separate himself from his kindred and go into another land.

Why did God give Israel the ceremonial law? Why was a Jew forbidden to eat pork and certain other foods? Why was he not allowed to plow an ox and ass together, or to wear a garment made of wool and linen? All of these were given to teach the lesson of separation.

Separation touches every part of our lives. It touches our personal lives and our public lives. The principle of separation especially applies to our preaching and teaching in the churches where we serve.

Pleasures, habits, food, dress, hair style...these are all important as they relate to separation from the world. The books we read, the friendships we establish...all should be in line with God's call to "be ye separate."

Among people who call themselves preachers, and organizations who call themselves churches, there are those with whom fellowship should be avoided. "Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness and what communion hath light with darkness?" II Corinthians 6:14. What fellowship is there between the world's teaching of humanism and God's laws of right and wrong as presented in His holy Word? God separated light from darkness. How can those who are of the light fellowship with those who are in darkness? How can those who teach to satisfy "itching ears" have fellowship with those who preach "thus saith the Lord?"

God's call to His people, preachers, and churches is to separate themselves from men pleasers unto God. This is a call to the beloved

teachings of God's Word, such as salvation by grace through faith to everyone and anyone who hears God's Word, calls upon Him in unbelief, and turns from sin to salvation. This means separation from all other teachings, such as works for salvation, baptismal regeneration, and the false teaching that only a select few can be saved.

It is a call to separate from those who would teach baptism by any method other than immersion by the authority of a New Testament church, and for any purpose other than for obedience and the showing forth of the death, burial and resurrection of Christ.

Separate from those who would teach "personal authority" baptism, or "salvation by baptism."

God's people should separate themselves from those who would misuse the ordinance of the Lord's Supper that Christ gave to His local New Testament churches. This ordinance should be observed only by members of the church where it is being observed. It is not to be offered by individuals to other people in other places outside of an assembly of believers. It is not to be desecrated by the use of soda pop and saltine crackers.

God's people should separate themselves from those who would advocate the false teaching of a universal church, that is, that all the saved make up one church. The Bible clearly teaches the doctrine of the local, visible New Testament church, composed of saved people who have scriptural baptism and are capable of assembling together for the purpose of worship and carrying out the teachings of God's Word.

God's people in the past have been identified by the way the observed this Bible teaching. From the ministry of Christ with the establishment of His church, they have been identified as they practiced separation from false religions. May we, as His "peculiar people" of this century, be known for the strict observance of this Bible doctrine of separation. Our Lord's command to us remains the same: "Come out from among them and be ye separate."

Minutes Of The Messenger Meeting Of The Churches Of The Missionary Baptist Association Of Texas

**TUESDAY 7:00 P.M.
NOVEMBER 10, 1992**

The 1992 messengers opened the annual meeting by singing "All Hail The Power Of Jesus' Name." Brother Weeks DuBose of Odessa conducted the singing as Brother Doug McFarland of Marshall accompanied at the piano. Brother Mack Chambers of Hughes Springs led the opening prayer after the congregation sang "At The Cross."

Brother Roddy Jackson of Avery brought a devotional entitled, "The Significance of Our Contribution" and based it on Joshua 24:14-15 and 29-31.

Host Pastor Roy Ramon of Beacon Baptist Church, San Angelo, gave a hearty welcome from the host church. He then asked the West Texas pastors and their members to stand and say, "WELCOME!". Brother Royal Burt of Atlanta gave a response to the welcome. It was then discovered that Mayor Don Butts of the City of San Angelo was present. He was given an opportunity to express greetings from the city.

Moderator Billy Daniels asked the congregation to stand as he declared the 1992 session of the Messengers Meeting of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas open for business. Brother C. E. Patton of Mabank led in prayer.

Assistant Moderator Larry Neeley of Hughes Springs was asked to moderate as Brother Daniels gave the Moderator's Address. He read II Corinthians 6:14-18 and delivered an address entitled, "Separation." A motion to print the address in the minutes carried.

A motion and second carried to adopt the agenda as printed in the minutes.

The moderator appointed several committees and each chairman was asked to answer as their names were called.

The assistant moderator appointed the following brethren as Tellers: Mike Black of Houston, Chairman; Larry Thompson, Corsicana; David Proctor, Carthage; C. V. Sims, Jasper; Rodney Stevens, Richwood; and Kevin Clinton, Sherman.

Brother Daniels asked Brother Joe Stevens of Houston to introduce the speaker for the Annual Sermon. He introduced Brother Charles Swilling, pastor of Grace Missionary Baptist Church of Houston, for that

purpose. Brother DuBose introduced Brother John Clark, a student at Texas Baptist Institute and Seminary, who sang, "Rise Again." Brother Swilling read Hebrews 13:5-9 and entitled his message, "Encouragement For The Nineties." A motion and second to print the message failed after the clerks reminded the messengers that the size of the minute books was at the limit for the style of stapling used. The moderator asked Brother Ricky Knight of Grand Prairie to extend the right hand of appreciation to both Brother Jackson and Brother Swilling on behalf of the congregation.

Brother Ray O. Brooks of Long Branch asked that the speaker for the Wednesday evening message be elected in this session to allow the speaker more time to prepare. Brethren John Pace of Midland and David Smith of Florida were nominated. Brother Pace was elected.

Visitors from outside the State of Texas were recognized. They included Brethren David Smith, Terry Richards, Darvie Fenison, and Doug Wiersema of Florida; Vernon Lierly and Ron Hoover of New Mexico; David Bennett of the South Sea Islands; Ronnie Pandong of the Philippines; Ralph Hunnicutt and Dwight Curtis of Arkansas; David Dawson of Oklahoma; and Brother and Sister Earl Crosswhite of Texarkana. New pastors working in the state of Texas were also recognized.

A motion was made to adjourn until Wednesday morning. After announcements were made Brother Earl Crosswhite led the closing prayer.

WEDNESDAY MORNING 9:30 A.M.

Brethren DuBose and McFarland led the congregation in singing "Count Your Blessings" to open the morning session. Brother Kieth Tusing of Nacogdoches sang the National Anthem after which the congregation was led in the Pledge of Allegiance. Moderator Daniels made several remarks concerning the veterans of the military service who had fought for our freedom and special remembrance was asked for those who had given their lives for our country's freedom. The veterans of "The Faith" were also mentioned. Brother Ray O. Brooks led in prayer.

Brother Carroll Williams of Arp brought the morning devotional from Acts 4.

Brethren from the Publications and Missions office in Texarkana were recognized.

Sister Julie Davis and Brother and Sister Leroy Smith sang a special entitled "The Greatest Love of All."

Brother Sammy Eldredge of Timpson was elected to bring the Annual Sermon and Brother Johnny Williams of La Porte will serve as the alternate.

A moment of fun was enjoyed as Host Pastor Roy Ramon presented Moderator Daniels with an honorary "Doctor of Armadillology."

The Tellers were asked to distribute copies of the Auditor's Report. In the absence of Auditor Vaughn Brother Luther Crawford was asked to discuss the report.

Brethren DuBose and McFarland directed the congregation in singing "Send The Light" to open the afternoon session. Sister Jena Cobbs, wife of Missionary Joel Cobbs, sang, "People Need The Lord". Brother Hoyt Chastain of Richardson led the opening prayer.

Reports from the missionaries recommended for half-salary were then heard. Brother Bill Myrick of Harmony Baptist Church in Houston gave a report on behalf of Brother Roddy Rodgers working in Floresville.

Brother Marion Reed gave a report on behalf of Brother Jorge Cordero working with the Spanish speaking people in Garland.

Two missionaries were recommended for Designated Funds. Brother Bill Lynch of Faith Baptist Church in San Antonio spoke for Brother George Goodman working in Lockhart and Brother Ron Hoover, working in Albuquerque, New Mexico, spoke for himself. Brother Hoover is sponsored by the First Missionary Baptist Church of Hobbs, New Mexico.

The moderator called for a separate vote on each missionary in response to a request from a messenger.

The following brethren were recommended for full salary: Marlin Freeman, Paul Hull, Frank Cooper, Larry Shelby, and Jim Golden. A separate motion and second carried to add Brother Tim Zepeda to this list for full salary.

Those recommended for half-salary were Brethren Roddy Rodgers and Jorge Cordero. Brethren George Goodman and Ron Hoover were recommended for Designated Funds.

A motion carried to set the full salary for the missionaries at \$500.00 per week and the Secretary/Treasurer's salary at \$539.00. The salary for office help was set at the same as last year, \$250.00 per month.

A motion carried to set the Auditor's salary at \$600.00 per year.

A motion and second carried to give the salaried missionaries, including Brother Chappell, a \$100.00 Christmas Bonus. A substitute motion carried to include the two missionaries on Designated Funds.

A motion was made to retain the same Special Missionary Advisory

Committee with the privilege of substitution. The names of Brethren R. E. Cecil and Billy Daniels were nominated in the place of Brother Paul Owens. Brother Daniels was elected and then the entire committee as amended was elected.

Brother Harold Davis moved that the Secretary/Treasurer's Housing allowance be set at \$1000.00 per month and auto mileage expense at the IRS allowable. The motion was seconded and carried. A motion and second was then made to also allow \$1000.00 per month Housing allowance for each salaried missionary. A motion to allow \$250.00 per month Insurance Allowance for each salaried missionary was made. A substitute motion was made to include the Secretary/Treasurer in the allowance. The motion carried.

The Auditor's Report was adopted after it was noted that the funds received from the project of Brother Larry Shelby should be \$13,000.00 instead of \$1,300.00 as shown.

Brother Amon Langston of Odessa gave the Enrollment and Finance Committee Report and it was adopted after some discussion.

Brother John Sanders of New Boston gave the Publications Report. It was discussed by Brethren Ken Ashlock, Tom Sannes, Bill Johnson, Ray O. Brooks, and D. S. Madden. The report was adopted.

Brother Jim Slocumb gave the Texas Mission Development Report on behalf of the Rocky Springs Missionary Baptist Church of Dialville. The report was discussed by Brethren Slocumb and Paul Hull of Abilene and adopted.

The Youth Report was given by Brother Darrel Owens of Mt. Enterprise. Brethren Gene Hoover of Pine Springs Baptist Camp, George Goodman of Mission Valley Camp, and Dwight Curtis of Bogg Springs Baptist Camp gave reports of their respective camps and the report was adopted.

The Memorials To Preachers Report was given by Brother Sammy Eldredge of Timpson. The report called for a moment of silent prayer and then audible prayer in remembrance of the departed friends and for their families. Brother Amon Langston led the prayer. The report was adopted.

Brother Sammy Eldredge also spoke about a program to provide housing for retiring ministers. Brother Calvin Gould also discussed this program stating that several pastors were available to help in the building of suitable housing for retired pastors.

A motion carried to insert a suitable Memorial Page in the year book in memory of Brother Paul Owens.

Brother D. S. Madden spoke concerning the retirement apartments planned at Texarkana.

Brother Billy Daniels, the new pastor at Walnut Street Baptist Church, Hillsboro, expressed the appreciation of the Paul Owens family

for the many prayers, visits, cards, and flowers during Brother Paul's illness and death.

Brother Leroy Smith gave the Texas Mission Builder's Report on behalf of the Sulphur Spring Missionary Baptist Church of Mt. Enterprise. Brethren Smith, James Moon, and B. A. Morris spoke to the report before it was adopted.

The Interstate and Foreign Missions Report was given by Brother Mike Evans of Spring. A motion and second was made to nominate the current committee with the privilege of substitution. There were no substitutions and the current committee was reelected.

The ABA Credit Union Report was given by Brother B. A. Morris of Pasadena and adopted.

Brother Earl Crosswhite of Texarkana gave the Benevolence Report and after giving a report on the Texarkana Baptist Orphanage it was adopted.

A motion prevailed to adjourn until 7:00 p.m. and Brother Marion Reed of Garland dismissed the body in prayer.

WEDNESDAY EVENING 7:00 P. M.

The services were opened with a program presented by a choir made up of members of West Texas Churches and directed by Brother Weeks DuBose of Odessa.

The moderator asked Brother Rex Reynolds of Hermleigh to introduce the speaker for the evening message. Brother Reynolds introduced their missionary, Brother John Pace, Pastor of New Life Baptist Chapel in Midland for the message. Brother DuBose introduced Sister Thelma Duval, a member of the mission, who brought a special in song entitled, "To God Be The Glory." Brother Pace read Philippians 4:1-9 as a basis for a message entitled, "Don't Worry." Brother Dayton Carter of Hermleigh was asked to extend the right hand of appreciation on behalf of the congregation.

Brother Steve Butler of Henderson gave the Music Report and a motion carried to adopt the report.

The Men's Ensemble of Texas Baptist Institute and Seminary sang, "Come, Christians, Join To Sing" just before Brother Bill Kuykendall, Pastor of Calvary Baptist Church of Henderson, gave the TBI Report. The report was addressed by Brother Kuykendall and Brother Ray O. Brooks and adopted.

Brother Ken Ashlock, Pastor of New Liberty Baptist Church of Garland, gave the Mexican Baptist Institute Report. A motion to adopt carried after Brethren Ashlock, J. L. Mitchell, and Al Valladares spoke to the report.

Brother Bill Simpson, Pastor of Tall City Missionary Baptist Church of Midland, gave the West Texas Baptist Institute Report. Brethren Simpson and Rex Reynolds addressed the report before its adoption.

The Resolutions Committee Report was read by Brother Roy Culley of Tatum which referred to two proposed resolutions. One dealt with the subject of tax-supported abortions which was presented by Bethel Baptist Church of Tatum and the other dealt with abortion and homosexuality in the military service presented by Faith Baptist Church of San Antonio. A motion carried to set the Clerks and Publicity Director's salaries the same as last year.

A motion carried to give the host church \$250.00 for their expenses.

A motion carried to instruct the clerks to send President-elect Bill Clinton copies of the two resolutions concerning abortion and homosexuality.

Brother Hoyt Chastain spoke concerning self-financing by buying and selling homes

Brother Amon Langston of Beacon Baptist Church in Odessa gave a word of thanks for the Texas Mission Development offering of last quarter.

A motion carried to give out-going moderator Billy Daniels a rising vote of thanks.

Each newly elected officer was given an opportunity to express a word of thanks and Brother Daniels presented the Harper gavel to the new moderator, Brother Larry Neeley.

A motion to adjourn until next year's session carried and Brother George Crawford of Longview led the dismissal prayer.

TEXAS BAPTIST INSTITUTE AND SEMINARY REPORT

Calvary Missionary Baptist Church continues to count herself doubly blessed. In the first place, she feels greatly blessed of our God that He has permitted her the privilege of sponsoring this great school for the past forty four years. She also feels very blessed that so many of her sister churches have permitted our God to use them in helping to supply the needs of our growing and developing school. Only eternity will be able to reveal the amazing good accomplished through this team effort.

The 1991-92 school year ended May 15, 1992 with seventeen diplomas being presented to graduates in seven different areas of study. The 1992-93 school year began August 12, 1992 with an enrollment of sixty-four. The first semester was completed November 5th with only three withdrawals. Second semester classroom work began November 6th with our enrollment back up to sixty four. Enrollment is good but far below what is needed to supply the growing need for prepared ministers. Our people are encouraged to pray earnestly that God will call many more men into His service.

Because of her sensitivity to the needs of our churches, TBI has begun a new department of study designed to prepare men for working with both the youth and the "golden agers" of our churches. We expect this to be a growing department. Ten students were enrolled for the first semester. Also, TBI is inviting all interested brethren to join us in an open forum to discuss changes and additions she might need to make to help meet the demands of pastoring in the twenty-first century. This forum will be held at 1:30 p.m., December 1st in connection with The A.J. Kirkland Memorial Lectures. This day is also set aside as a Visitor's Day with the noon meal provided. Please plan to join us for a day of fellowship and feasting.

General Fund finances continue to be a concern. Our budgeted monthly needs in this fund are \$21,286.00 of which only about 40% is for faculty salaries. Our new department of study and an overload on Dean Roy Culley necessitated our adding two new faculty members, Dr. J.R. Alexander and Brother Doug McFarland. We encourage our supporting churches to consider a small increase in General Fund offerings. Also, churches that have not been supporting this fund are encouraged to consider the great good TBI has been to them and the whole of our association of churches. When you do, we think you will agree--both blessings and responsibilities should be shared.

TBI Rallies by both churches and associations of churches continue to be a great blessing to all involved. These are great times of worship

and fellowship that profit both the school personnel and those hosting the rallies. The Shelby County Association TBI Rally has taken on the air of a homecoming. Their fourth will be hosted by Pastor Marlin Freeman and the Heritage MBC of Center on Thursday evening, December 10th. Pastor Larry Fondren and the Landmark MBC of Athens will be hosting the third annual TBI Rally of the Tri-County Association on Saturday evening, November 21st. Pastor Carl Fitzgerald and the Nedville MBC will be hosting their second annual TBI Rally for the churches of the Bethlehem Association. We have already enjoyed three great TBI Rallies this school year. Pastor Randy Penny and the College Boulevard MBC of Denison hosted the second annual Grayson County Association TBI Rally. Two McAllen churches hosted their own: North Bethel MBC, Pastor Tim Zepeda and First Missionary, Pastor Brad Mitchell. Other churches and associations of churches are encouraged to host TBI Rallies.

Both the food and the clothes storerooms have just about become necessities. Some students could not continue their schooling without them. These are very rewarding projects for all of our church auxiliaries. Some churches and some auxiliaries adopt student families and provide much of their personal needs. This is a fine work worthy of enlargement. The ladies of Calvary MBC of Henderson continue to be a special blessing to all student families at Christmas time. With the aid of many other auxiliaries, they present each student with a huge food basket. The Calvary ladies are very thankful for all who help in this project.

We encourage all brethren to attend the A.J. Kirkland Memorial Lectures December 1-4. Dr. J. Oscar Phillips, ABA president, will be the visiting lecturer. Tuesday, December 1st, will be filled with good things--an introductory message, Brother Phillips lecturing on "The Battle for the Bible," noon meal, TBI open forum, and the Alumni Banquet with Pastor Hiram Melton's message. Please plan to join us in enjoying all of these activities.

Finally, Calvary MBC wishes to thank all of our supporting churches, auxiliaries, and individuals for helping us carry on the great work which is affectionately called TBI. Without your help, the work would be an impossible task. We pray God's richest blessings upon each of you knowing that He will make it all worthwhile when we meet Him at the Judgment Seat of Christ.

MEXICAN BAPTIST INSTITUTE REPORT

New Liberty Baptist Church is happy to report that our leaders in the work of the Institute have been able to bring harmony among the faculty, former faculty, and missions and churches working in the Institute. At present all are working in the Institute as teachers or they are invited to come in for lectures to the students. One of our main boosters is the former sponsoring church, Fairhaven Baptist Church. One of their members, Brother George Poole, is one of our trustees. We thank all who are helping us financially or with your prayers.

Shortly, on December 11th, we shall finish our first semester of the 1992-1993 school year. We have 26 students enrolled in our regular classes in Reynosa, Mexico. In addition, we have 14 part-time students attending classes in McAllen. We have a total of 17 teachers assisting us in these classes. Also, we have had 6 pastors to lecture for us thus far this year. We look forward to a very successful year.

Three more churches have been organized since our last report. We organized the mission in Saltillo, Mexico where Brother Jose Leos is pastor with 49 charter members. Then we organized the church in Monterrey where Brother Humberto Aguirre is pastor with 22 charter members. We also organized the church where Brother Valentin Ocanas is pastor in Monterrey with 27 charter members. He is a teacher and former student. Brother Leos and Brother Aguirre are graduates of the Institute. The outreach continues to grow. This is the fruit of the Institute and shows the value of all of our efforts together.

To show the workload of the Institute we need to take a look at what a vast change has come in Mexico. Practically everything in Mexico is as expensive or more expensive than here. As we operate mainly in Mexico, this affects the cost of operation. Having just returned from a trip there, note these differences. Where it used to cost less than \$1.00 to cross the border and return, it now costs \$3.00. We go sometimes twice a day. Gasoline is \$1.65 a gallon. Our rent has increased tremendously. Food is very expensive. A motel, small, where I used to stay for \$21.00 a day is now \$74.00. This demonstrates our challenge. On this trip in the northern part of Mexico we passed by to see 12 buildings, nice, that our missions and churches have. Due to time, we passed up many. This was only in three states. We are in many of the 31 states in Mexico. God is blessing.

We have graduates who are doing mission work, working to support themselves, who could use, wisely, some help in their endeavors. If you are interested in helping one of them, let us hear from you.

We need additional financial help for the operational expense of the Institute. Please consider this work of His for support. Come to see us.

ABA CREDIT UNION REPORT

The American Baptist Association Credit Union has been in existence since March 17, 1970. It was established as a savings and lending institution to help Missionary Baptist people and churches.

The membership is extended to ordained and licensed ministers and employees of the churches fellowshipping in the American Baptist Association and church members in Texas, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Louisiana.

The interest rate is usually lower or comparable to other lending institutions. The Credit Life Insurance is paid by the Credit Union. The interest on loans is figured on the unpaid balance monthly. Dividends are paid quarterly on shares and a detailed statement of your account is mailed at the end of each quarter.

The American Baptist Association Credit Union is regulated by the laws of the State of Texas. All savings are insured to \$100,000 by National Credit Union Administration (NCUA), a U. S. Government agency.

As of September 30, 1992 there were 381 members with total assets of \$632,979 and outstanding loans in the amount of \$237,618.

The Credit Union office is located in Pasadena, Texas. The Board of Directors is made up of area men: Rev. C. H. McBryde, Chairman; Rev. D. B. Wright, Vice-Chairman; Rev. George White, Treasurer; Rev. Charles Swilling, Secretary; Rev. B. A. Morris, Rev. Johnny Williams and Rev. Paul Cleveland.

The annual meeting for the membership is held the last Friday night in February each year. You are urged to become a member and start a savings account with YOUR credit union.

It is only by the dedicated and tireless work of our trustees that we remain free of some of the undesirable regulations of the state. Please remember our trustees during the next session of the legislature. They will need your prayers and support.

We have had a total of forty-nine children in the home this year. We presently have thirty-six children, twenty-two boys and fourteen girls. Thirty-four of these children are in school. There are three seniors, and the others range from kindergarten to the eleventh grade. We are most happy to report that fifteen of these children have accepted the Lord as their Saviour this year, and all but one have united with our church and received baptism.

The children have had a wonderful summer. Many have visited their sponsors, all attended Vacation Bible School, and the older children attended one or two weeks of church camp. The staff and children greatly appreciate those that make summer so much fun.

The Lord has truly blessed us this year with dedicated houseparents and support staff. Two of our houseparents are only temporary, and will be leaving in late December. We will be needing houseparents for our younger girls when they leave. We have some very good prospects at this time, but pray for us as we seek out the people God would have to fill these positions.

We have made many improvements on our facilities during the past year. The planned remodeling of our porch and the canopy between the boys' and girls' dorms will complete our present needs.

We have had a good year for our animals and gardens. Lots of food has been frozen and canned. Our hay barns are full also.

We want to express our appreciation to Unity Missionary Baptist Church for their love and help with our children. Our church is a great part of our lives.

We need your continued support and prayers that we will adhere to God's will in caring for these little ones.

Whereas President-elect Bill Clinton promised action to reverse the Bush Administration regulations against abortions in U. S. Military Medical Facilities and to seek taxpayer funded abortions for poor women, and

Whereas President-elect Bill Clinton has publicly proposed to seek to unite Americans and avoid divisive policies, and

Whereas there is no more divisive and emotionally charged issue of public policy in America than the matter of abortion, and

Whereas a public policy which forces taxpayers, who oppose abortion to become paying partakers by means of their taxes of the very act which they abhor will be most divisive, (For us abortion is an act violating deeply held beliefs of conscience. To force us to help fund it is an assault of the government upon our personal religious faith because of its direct violation of the sixth commandment.), and

Whereas a large majority of taxpayers who voted for President-elect Bill Clinton or for Mr. Perot have demonstrated by their vote that they do not hold such convictions of conscience against abortion;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT the messengers representing the churches of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas respectfully request our new President to:

1. Instruct the Department of Internal Revenue to provide an entry on all income tax returns whereby taxpayers with conscientious objections to participating in the funding of elective abortions may register their objection;

2. Instruct the Secretary of the Treasury that so far as it is possible that the taxes of those who choose to register as conscientious objectors will be considered as allocated to other expenses of the Federal Government and not fund abortions. (It is not requested nor considered necessary that these Executive orders establish any new accounting for the income and expenses of the Federal Government to assure compliance, for the Federal Government expenses for such abortions will be but a small part of the taxes of those who have no conscientious objection to their being performed.)

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT we submit copies of this resolution to our U. S. Representatives and Senators and respectfully request that they urge President-elect Bill Clinton to implement this conciliatory relief for those who oppose tax funded abortion, and that they seek to incorporate similar instructions into every proposed legislation dealing with tax funded abortion in the future.

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

MBA OF TEXAS

1. We believe in the plenary verbal inspiration and inerrancy of the whole Bible as originally written, and that the Bible is the all-sufficient rule of faith and practice, (Psalm 119-160; II Tim. 3:16-17).
2. We believe in the personal triune God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, equal in divine perfection, (Matt. 28:19).
3. We believe in the Genesis account of creation, (Gen. 1, 2).
4. We believe that Satan is a fallen angel, the archenemy of God and man, the unholy god of this world and that his destiny is the eternal lake of fire, (Isa. 14:12-15; Ezek. 28:11-19; Matt. 25:41; II Cor. 4:4; Eph. 6:10-17; Rev. 20:10).
5. We believe in the virgin birth and sinless humanity of Jesus Christ, (Matt. 1:18-20; II Cor. 5:21; I Peter 2:22).
6. We believe in the Deity of Jesus Christ, (John 1:1, 14; 10:30; 14:9; II Cor. 5:19).
7. We believe that the Divine Administrator for Jesus Christ in His churches is the Holy Spirit (Luke 24:49; John 14:16, 17; 16:13; Act 1:4, 5, 8), whose work as such began on the first Pentecost after the resurrection of Jesus Christ with the Baptism of the Holy Spirit, which event occurred only once and is not repeated, (Acts 2).
8. We believe that the miraculous gifts of the Spirit listed in I Cor. 12:8-10 were done away when the Bible was completed (I Cor. 13:8-10), that the gift of apostleship ceased with the death of the last chosen directly by the Lord Jesus (Eph. 2:20), and that the abiding gifts adequately equip the churches for service to God, (Rom. 12:13; I Cor. 13:1-3; Eph. 4:7-16; I Peter 4:10, 11; II Tim. 3:16, 17). (See explanatory note at the end of this doctrinal statement.)
9. We believe that man was created in the image of God and lived in innocency until he fell by voluntary transgression from his sinless state, the result being that all mankind are now sinners, (Gen. 1:26; 3:6-24; Rom. 5:12, 19).

10. We believe the substitutionary suffering and death of Jesus Christ was sufficient to propitiate for the sins of all humanity, thus making salvation available for all mankind, (Isa. 53:6; Heb. 2:9; I Peter. 2:24; 3:18; II Peter. 3:9; I John 2:2).

11. We believe in the bodily resurrection and ascension of Christ and the bodily resurrection of His saints, (Matt. 28:1-7; Acts 1:9-11; I Cor. 15:42-58; I Thess. 4:13-18).

12. We believe in the pre-millennial, personal, bodily return of Christ as the crowning event of the Gentile Age. We further believe at His coming the righteous dead shall be raised, the living saints shall be changed and both shall be caught up to meet the Lord in the air. We also believe after the Millennial Reign of Christ on earth the unrighteous shall be resurrected unto eternal punishment in the lake of fire, (John 14:1-6; I Thess. 4:13-18; II Thess. 2:8; Rev. 20: 4-6, 11-15; 21:8).

13. We believe the depraved alien sinner is saved wholly by grace through faith in Jesus Christ and the requisites to regeneration are repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ (Luke 13:3, 5; John 3:16, 18; Acts 20:21; Rom. 6:23; Eph. 2:8, 9), and the Holy Spirit convicts sinners and regenerates, seals, secures, and indwells every believer, (John 3:6; 16:8, 9; Rom. 8:9-11; I Cor. 6:19, 20; Eph. 4:30; Titus 3:5).

14. We believe all who trust in Jesus Christ for salvation are eternally secure and shall persevere in Him and shall not perish, (John 3:36; 5:24; 10:27-30; Rom. 8:35-39; Heb. 10:39; I Peter 1:5).

15. We believe God deals with believers as His children, chastises the disobedient, blesses the obedient in this life and reserves rewards for the future, (Matt. 16:27; 25:14-23; John 1:12; Heb. 12:5-11; II John 8; Rev. 22:12).

16. We believe Jesus Christ , during His personal ministry, established His Church, which is a local, visible assembly of scripturally baptized believers in covenant relationship, to carry out the Commission of the Lord Jesus Christ. We further believe each church is an independent, self-governing body over which no other ecclesiastical body may exercise authority. We believe Jesus Christ gave the Great Commission to New Testament churches only, and promised the perpetuity (Matt. 4:18-22; 16:18; 18:15-18; 28:19-20; Mark 1:14-20; John 1:35-51; Eph. 3:21).

17. We believe there are two pictorial ordinances in the Lord's churches: baptism and the Lord's Supper. Scriptural baptism is the immersion of penitent believers in water, administered by the authority of a New Testament church in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. We further believe the Lord's Supper is a memorial ordinance, restricted to the members of the church observing the ordinance, (Matt. 28:19, 20; Acts. 8:12, 38; Rom. 6:4; I Cor. 5:11-13; 11:1, 2, 17-20, 26).

18. We believe there are two divinely appointed offices in a church, pastor and deacon, to be filled by men whose qualifications are set forth in I Tim. 3:1-16; Titus 1:5-9.

19. We believe all associations, fellowships, conventions, boards, and their committees are servants of the churches, (Matt. 20:25-28).

20. We believe in the complete separation of churches and state (Matt. 22:21) and affirm our belief in civil obedience unless the laws and regulations of civil government run contrary to the Holy Scriptures (Rom. 13:1-7; I Peter 2:13-15; Acts. 5: 29).

Footnote: "I suggest this explanation: 'The apostles and prophets were the inspired agents through whom the New Testament revelation was given. When that revelation was complete, there was no further need for the office of apostle and prophet; thus, the apostleship ceased with the death of the last apostle chosen directly by the Lord Jesus.'" -- James Kirkland.

STATEMENT OF MISSION POLICY

SECTION I

The messengers of the churches of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas will not recommend any man to the mission field unless he has first been elected or endorsed by the church of his membership, said church being associated with and subscribing to the principles and practices of the churches of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas.

SECTION II

Each church recommending a missionary from their membership to the churches of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas in annual session is requested:

1. To submit in writing, hereafter, to the Secretary-Treasurer's Mission Office, the endorsement of any missionary, whether salaried or on designated funds, and-or a mission project of any sponsoring church, by the fifteenth (15th) day of September prior to each messenger meeting.
2. To submit for public reading a brief summary of the ministerial activities of the recommended missionary.
3. To give a statement as what their plans are concerning their support of the missionary being recommended.
4. To give the location of the area where the recommended missionary will devote his labor.

This information concerning the recommended missionary, his abilities, training and work will greatly aid the messengers from the churches in making their decision about individual missionaries.

SECTION III

We recognize that a missionary elected by his local church, if it be a Scriptural church, is a Scriptural missionary, without recommendation of the messengers from the churches of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas.

SECTION IV

Any messenger may request an individual vote on any name recommended for endorsement to the messengers in annual session.

SECTION V

We recognize as Scriptural the right of the messengers in annual session to recommend stipulated salaries for the missionaries.

We also recognize the responsibility of the sponsoring church and

the mission to aid in raising the missionary's salary. Therefore, the corresponding Secretary-Treasurer shall not be permitted to pay over 80 (eighty) percent of the missionary's salary.

SECTION VI

All missionaries of the churches working as State Missionaries under the recommendations of the messengers shall:

Make duplicate monthly reports to their endorsing church and Secretary-Treasurer.

1. These reports shall tell of the work done during the month and shall list all money, material and monetary gifts collected on the field. All money collected on the field shall be counted as salary, unless the money is designated to some special church or mission project, with the following exceptions:

a. *MATERIAL GIFTS*

Missionaries shall have the same privilege as pastors in receiving material gifts above their salary and shall not be require to report them as salary.

Material gifts are defined as items (or money for them) as:

Clothing

Automobile accessories

Household goods

b. *MONETARY GIFTS*

Monetary gifts are defined as such gifts as pastors receive for:

Weddings

Funerals

At Christmas season

Honorariums

etc.

c. *REVIVALS*

The missionaries and the Secretary-Treasurer may hold as many as two revivals each year without reporting the funds received for the revivals.

d. *VACATIONS*

The missionaries and the Secretary-Treasurer may have two weeks paid vacation each year in addition to two revival meetings.

2. All reports shall be made available to the churches and a yearly report published in the minutes.

3. The endorsing church is requested to provide a report annually for the messengers assembly regarding:

a. The amount and nature of all material and monetary gifts.

b. An assessment is requested as to whether there has been any abuse of this privilege on the part of the missionary.

SECTION VII

State Mission work shall be defined as follows:

1. Work in cities where we have no Missionary Baptist Churches, or in cities large enough to have two or more churches.
2. Work with weak pastorless churches, to aid them in growing and securing a pastor.
3. Although we look with favor on revival meetings, revivals in established churches with regular pastors, should not be counted as mission work.
4. A month's work should include at least 160 hours actually spent in constructive mission work.

SECTION VIII

We recommend:

1. The missionaries seek fields in sections of the state where we have no churches.
2. The missionaries should seek out a church to sponsor the mission that is consistent in their support of missions, and that is of sufficient strength to fulfill the responsibility of a sponsoring church, and that the sponsoring church adopt a policy concerning the mission that would not allow it to be organized into a church until it becomes self-supporting in every respect, including a full-time pastor on the field.
3. That the missionaries begin teaching leading newly organized missions and churches to support all phases of mission work and that they begin immediately to give support to the missionaries's salary and that such support be increased regularly as the work grows. The missionary and mission should work toward a goal of being able to support a pastor within five years. That this be done by seeking to support 20 percent of the missionary's salary within the first year, 40 percent within the second, 60 percent within the third, 80 percent within the fourth and within the fifth year of being able to support a full time pastor. The missionary should remain with the mission until it becomes self-supporting.
4. That the missionaries seek to lead the newly organized churches to adopt and put to proper use, a good Sunday School record system and plan of Sunday School organization.
5. That the missionaries lead the newly established churches to follow a definite plan of organized visitation evangelism.
6. That the missionaries not be used as supply preacher in our established churches where pastors are on the field.
7. That missionaries not pastor a church that is recognized as a self-supporting church, regardless of how much of his salary they might pay.

8. That the missionaries should not be elected to an office of the Association.

SECTION IX

The trustees of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas are authorized to relocate old mobile church units and locate new ones between sessions of the association under the following guidelines:

1. State Missionaries of this association on stipulated salary be given priority for usage of mobile units; 2. State missionaries of this association on designated offerings be eligible for mobile units when need by a salaried missionary is not imminent;

3. The trustees shall not relocate an old unit or locate a new one within the sixty days just prior to an associational meeting , but they shall refer the matter to the messenger assembly;

4. A mobile unit may be recalled by the messenger assembly in any annual session or called session.

SECTION X

May the statements of this policy never be interpreted as binding laws upon churches or missionaries, but as goals and guidelines.

SECTION XI

GUIDELINES FOR THE USE OF MOBILE UNITS:

I. It is agreed that the churches of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas will:

- A. Provide the mobile unit;
- B. Pay for moving the unit;
- C. Pay for relocating the unit;

D. Pay for major repairs brought on by physical damage outside the control of those using it, such as storm damage, vandalism and-or mechanical failure.

II. It is agreed that the mission and-or sponsoring church will:

- A. Provide the location for the unit;
- B. Pay for all connections, such as water, gas, electricity, sewage;
- C. Keep unit in good state of repair while in custody of mission and-or sponsoring church;

D. Pay for any and all repairs needed while in their use except those covered in Part I, Section D;

E. Pay for relocating or resetting unit while in their use;

F. Make no alterations in physical structure of unit without approval of trustees.

III. After the unit is located and all connections made, the Mission Secretary, in company with the missionary and at least one member of

the mission and-or sponsoring church, shall inspect the unit. The inspection shall reveal the condition of the unit at the time the mission begins using it. A written record of such findings shall be signed by both parties and a copy of same provided for both parties.

IV. A similar inspection called for in Part III shall be conducted before the unit is disconnected from the utilities at the time of moving from the custody of any mission and-or sponsoring church. The results of this inspection shall be recorded and signed by both parties.

SECTION XII

GUIDELINES FOR THE MBSF REPRESENTATIVE

1. The MBSF representative will meet the same qualifications and requirements of the missionaries as set forth in Sections I and II. The endorsing church should take the initiative in seeing that the representative abides by these guidelines.

2. He will receive the same salary as the missionaries.

3. He will be reimbursed for travel expenses related to the MBSF work outside his local area of residence at a rate prescribed by the messenger assembly.

4. Section VI of the Mission Policy shall apply to the MBSF Representative as well as to the missionaries.

5. He may use the mailing permit through the office of the Secretary-Treasurer for state-wide projects.

6. He will work with college and university students and not just serve as a supply preacher.

7. He will visit with and encourage MBSF groups already begun, aiding them in their programs and outreach.

8. He will seek to establish new campus MBSF chapters under the direction of a sponsoring church which works in the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas. No chapter will be organized without such a sponsoring church. It is recognized that each MBSF chapter is under the direction of a local church.

9. He will seek to develop a spirit of loyalty to Christ, to the Bible, to the local church and to the Missionary Baptist principles of faith and practice. He will neither promote nor participate in activity which compromises Missionary Baptist doctrinal positions, disturbs the lawful order of the citizenry or displays immorality. He will seek to encourage all chapters to function within the framework of school regulations.

10. He will publicize the MBSF work of this association and of the American Baptist Association, seeking to keep both mutually informed.

ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT

ARTICLE I -- Name

This association shall be known as the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas.

ARTICLE II -- Object

The object of this Association shall be to awaken a deeper interest in the welfare of the churches, to cultivate a closer fellowship among the churches, and to encourage and perpetuate the very greatest possible activity in missionary, educational and benevolent enterprises.

ARTICLE III -- How Composed

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of such regular independent Missionary Baptist Churches as may voluntarily choose to cooperate in carrying out the object of this Association.

Section 2. The Messenger Assemblies of this Association shall be composed of messengers elected by the churches composing it.

Section 3. Each church choosing to represent in this Association shall be entitled to three messengers.

Section 4. Each church shall be the sole judge of the qualification of her messengers.

ARTICLE IV -- Nature

The Messenger Assembly of this Association shall be, in nature, formed as a council in matters pertaining to missionary, education and benevolent work.

ARTICLE V -- Principles

The Messenger Assembly of this Association shall recognize the freedom of speech as essential to the highest achievement in its work. It shall stand or fall on its own conformity to the truth. It shall exercise no ecclesiastical authority, but it shall, by every precaution recognize the independence and sovereignty of every individual church. It shall also encourage on the part of the church and the messengers the greatest possible freedom of expression in discussing matters pertaining to its work.

ARTICLE VI -- Powers

The action of the Messenger Assembly shall be limited to the work of awakening enthusiasm in missionary, educational and benevolent enterprises and receiving and distributing funds for the same.

ARTICLE VII -- Funds

Section 1. All funds of this Association shall be raised by voluntary donations secured solely upon the merits of the cause in the interest of which appeals are made for gifts: provided, this is not to prevent the use of any income or any property that may be acquired by donation or by purchase.

Section 2. Distribution of funds shall be authorized by an act of this Messenger Assembly, or by an act of properly authorized committees of this assembly hereinafter provided for; but in no instance shall the assembly or any committee of it use means in violation of the expressed preference of the donor.

ARTICLE VIII -- Officers

Section 1. The officers of this Messenger Assembly shall be a moderator, and assistant moderator, two (2) recording secretaries and a corresponding secretary-treasurer.

Section 2. All officers of this assembly shall be chosen annually, and shall hold their offices until their successors are elected and the same shall be true of all members of standing committees. All officers shall be elected by a majority of the messengers voting. No moderator shall succeed himself more than one year.

Section 3. The duties of all officers shall be as may be directed by the Messenger Assembly, unless otherwise directed by the churches.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the corresponding secretary-treasurer to take charge of money and valuables not specifically entrusted to someone else and to dispose of same as he may be directed by this Messenger Assembly. He shall make an annual report to this assembly of all monies received and disbursed.

Section 5. The recording secretaries, in addition to keeping the records of this Association, will superintend the printing and distribution of minutes of such regular meetings as the messengers may direct.

ARTICLE IX -- Committees

Section 1. The missionary committee shall be composed of one representative of each church choosing to be represented. The duty of the

committee shall be to meet quarterly, or as directed by the Messenger Assembly, in the interest of all the work. It shall be empowered to fill vacancies of regular offices between sessions of the Messenger Assembly and to call a special meeting of a Messenger Assembly when needed.

Section 2. The following officers of the Assembly shall be the trustees of the association: Namely, the moderator, assistant moderator, two recording secretaries and secretary-treasurer, subject to the direction of the Messenger Assembly, and they are empowered to act in legal capacity as trustees of the Association.

ARTICLE X -- Missionaries

We hold that the authority for execution of the Great Commission was given to the New Testament Church and the authority must remain forever with the churches. Therefore, the right and privilege of every church of this Association to endorse, set apart or send out missionaries of its own choosing and the act of one church in sending out missionaries can in no way bind or obligate any other church.

The churches shall be free and their support of missionaries shall be voluntary on their part.

ARTICLE XI --Meetings

The regular meetings of the Church Messengers shall be at such time and place as the assembled messengers may appoint.

ARTICLE XII -- Amendments

The Messenger Assembly shall have no power to change the Articles of Agreement. Any church desiring a change shall send to the annual meeting a copy of the proposed change; the Messenger Assembly will then submit the proposed change to each cooperating church; if two-thirds of the cooperating churches vote for the change, then the Article of Agreement shall be amended to conform to the proposed change. Two-thirds of the churches representing in assembly in the previous year shall be the number determining the results.

PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

“Storms Of Life”

Psalms 107:21-30

This past spring and summer was a very stormy one in the Northeast Texas area. Following one storm in which quite a lot of damage was done in our community, a young neighbor related to me how that she had been afraid of storms all her life because she was reared in a home where she was rushed to the storm cellar every time it thundered.

After Jana married and had a family, her mother continued to call her every time she heard on the weather scanner of an approaching storm. She said that finally one day, she told her mother to please quit calling her every time it came up a cloud because she was trying to learn not to be afraid and wanted to teach her girls not to be afraid of storms.

Well, following this particular storm back in June, Jana got up that morning, looked out her window and saw a rather large tree lying in her front yard only a few feet from her house. She told me that she immediately called her mother and said, “Why didn’t you call and warn me?”

We laughed together about this, recognizing how fickle we human beings can be. After Jana went home, I sat outside a few minutes looking over the storm damage and I began to think about the storms that people have to face during a life time, and the seed was planted and I knew this was what I wanted to speak about today.

There are numerous storms that are faced by people, although we may not all face the same stormy situations in life. Some have to ride out more storms than do others. Some face more intense storms than others. But I think it would be safe to say that everyone has had to face some very difficult situations in life at one time or another.

It’s hard to know just where to begin, because there are so many stormy situations that face people today. Perhaps one of the most prevalent storms in our society, at the present time, is the storm of divorce. Yes, even among Christians. Even among those who faithfully attend one of the Lord’s churches. Even among those who are considered leaders in the churches...deacons, Sunday School teachers, preachers. If not they themselves, then their children or grandchildren.

It may begin with just one little word spoken in anger. It may begin with an unspoken word. It may begin with an attitude problem on the part of one or both marriage partners. It may begin when children come along. Or when they reach their teen years. Or when they come BACK home. Whatever the cause, it is a stormy time in the lives of those who

are affected by it, and it is an especially stormy time for a Christian when this ill wind blows their family apart.

I'm not going to attempt to offer solutions. That is not my purpose. I couldn't, even if I tried, because I simply do not have the knowledge or wisdom to do so. I only know that so many, many lives are damaged or completely destroyed by this storm every day.

As I sit writing this (August 1992), there is an ABC News Special on TV, called "Twenty Something" with Barbara Walters that addresses a relatively new storm that has arisen in our present society. Ms. Walters reports that there are now more than 42,000 people IN THEIR 20'S that have AIDS.

Perhaps when we first heard of AIDS we thought, "this will never affect me or my family!" How wrong we were! It has spread like wildfire and unless God intervenes and a cure is found, it will eventually affect every family in our nation. It is no longer a so-called "gay disease." It already affects everyone to the extent that it has put fear in our hearts and lives...fear of stopping to render aid to accident victims; fear of helping a bleeding child on the school ground; fear of using public restrooms; fear of receiving "bad blood" in a hospital when facing surgery. All these, plus many other fears have come about because of this terrible storm that has hit our world in the past ten or twelve years.

Besides these storms that confront our society, and affect us personally, there are many other storms that come slamming in on us, often without warning. One of these is sickness...it is no respecter of persons; it comes to the rich, the poor; the good, the bad; the saved, the lost. We each have had to deal with this in one way or another. You've experienced it...everything is going along smoothly, then one day the phone rings and you get the news that a family member, maybe your mother or your dad, your son or your daughter, your spouse, or a good friend, or church member, has been stricken with some dreaded illness, cancer, heart attack, stroke. And your whole life is changed as this hurricane comes crashing in on you, wreaking havoc on your life and the lives of those you love.

And along with this storm, many times comes an even greater storm, as you stand at the bedside and watch a loved one slip slowly, and perhaps painfully, into eternity. And your heart is torn asunder with sorrow. You think that you will never be the same again. That "things" will never be the same again.

Parents are often crushed by the storms that arise in the rearing of their children. A son who goes astray and rebels against all the moral principles that his godly parents have worked so hard to instill within him. A daughter who denies her Christian upbringing and becomes involved in the things of the world. Or just simply the very frustration that a two-year old or a thirteen-year old can cause.

Other storms that affect the lives of Christians include the many cases of child abuse and wife abuse. It seems this storm is gathering

momentum as each day passes. And, of course, the storm of hurricane proportions that is sweeping, not only America, but the whole world, drug abuse. It has devastated families, broken up homes, affected our churches and our schools. And there seems to be no rainbow in the sky.

Depressing? Yes. So how can a Christian cope with such dire circumstances, with such dark despair when these storms come raging and threaten our very being?

The 27th chapter of Acts is one of my very favorite passages of scripture. Here we have the record of Paul's journey to Rome, a place he had longed to go for many years. But his dream was not realized until he was carried there bound with chains as a prisoner. Bad enough? Yes. A big storm had hit Paul, even as he was serving the Lord with all his heart, soul, and body. But then as he sailed to Rome, a literal storm hit, a tempestuous wind that threatened to destroy the ship and all the passengers, including Paul and his missionary companion, Luke.

It's interesting to read verses 14-20 and see the various measures the crew and other passengers took to try to save themselves from this storm. But all the time, Paul was communicating with God. I don't know what part of the ship he was in. I don't know how long he prayed or if others were praying with him. But I do know that he fully believed God would see him through this storm safely.

Oh, yes, Paul felt the effects of this storm. He felt the cold wind blowing, the salt water stinging his eyes, the hunger and thirst, the weariness of the flesh after so many days at sea, the frustration of trying to comfort those with whom he travelled. He did not escape the effects of the storm. **BUT HE BELIEVED GOD WOULD SEE HIM THROUGH IT.** Why? Because God told him He would.

As we face the storms of adversity, difficulties, sickness, death, pain, sorrow, heartache, let us remember Paul and the words the angel of God spoke to him..."Fear not, Paul; thou must be brought before Caesar." And God speaks to us today, and He says, "Fear not, child; I will bring you through safely."

John said, "This is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith." We must have faith. We must believe God. We must trust Him. Yes, we will feel the effects of these storms that come in our lives and we will feel the crushing blow of the mighty winds that would seem intent upon destroying both soul and body. But God has said, "I will never leave you, nor forsake you." And as Paul said to his fellow travellers, "I believe God." He will see us through. This is the only hope we have. This is the only hope **WE NEED.** I would like to close with the words from the old hymn, "Stand By Me."

STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES TEXAS STATE WOMEN'S AUXILIARY

ARTICLE I -- Name

The name of the organization shall be Women's Auxiliary of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas.

ARTICLE II -- Definition

The Auxiliary shall be composed of messengers of the local auxiliaries of the churches which compose the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas.

ARTICLE III -- Purpose

The purpose of this State Auxiliary shall be to encourage the women of the local churches to be active in all phases of the work in which they have the scriptural right to participate and to encourage the establishment of auxiliaries in all our churches where none exist.

ARTICLE IV -- Time and Place

The State Auxiliary shall meet annually at 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday before the annual session of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas. The place of each meeting shall be determined by the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas messengers.

ARTICLE V -- Officers

The officers of the State Auxiliary shall be: (1) President, (2) First Vice President, (3) Second Vice President, (4) Recording Secretary, (5) Assistant Recording Secretary, (6) Treasurer, (7) Assistant Treasurer, (8) Corresponding Secretary, (9) Bible and Tract Distributor, (10) Parliamentarian, (11) Girls' Auxiliary Promotional Director, (12) Assistant Girls' Auxiliary Promotional Director (to be appointed by the Director), (13) Advisory Council of 3.

ARTICLE VI

All officers shall be elected annually by nomination and majority vote and must be a member of an auxiliary. No officer shall succeed herself more than once consecutively except the Advisory Council, G. A. Promotional Director and Bible and Tract Distributor.

ARTICLE VII -- Duties of Officers

SECTION I -- President

The duties of the President shall be:

(a) To preside over all state meetings; (b) To appoint committees as directed by the Messenger Body; (c) To call special meetings when necessary; (d) To be active in looking after the welfare of the work.

SECTION II-- Vice Presidents

The duties of the First Vice President shall be:

(a) To preside over the meetings in the absence of the President or when called upon by the President; (b) To perform the duties that usually devolve upon such officers; (c) Shall be Chairman of the Committee to Stimulate Interest.

The duties of the Second Vice President shall be:

(a) To preside over the meeting in the absence of the President and First Vice President or when called upon; (b) Shall be the Chairman of the Program Committee; (c) To perform the duties that usually devolve upon such officers.

SECTION III-- Secretary

The duties of the Secretary shall be:

(a) To keep a record of the proceedings of the meetings; (b) To announce special meetings; (c) To prepare and read reports as instructed by the Messenger Body; (d) To perform such other duties as may be necessary in carrying on the work of this office.

SECTION IV-- Treasurer

The duties of the Treasurer shall be:

To receive and disburse funds as designated by the donors.

SECTION V-- Corresponding Secretary

The duties of the Corresponding Secretary shall be:

(a) To correspond about necessary matters with the officers of the State Organization; (b) To report through our religious papers on the activities of Women's Work; (c) To correspond with the State Officers of other State Auxiliaries with regard to work and meetings; (d) To keep a mailing list of Auxiliaries over the state, both active and inactive; (e) To send copies of the State Women's Auxiliary program to each auxiliary before the state meeting; (f) To mail a report to all Auxiliaries in April and at the end of the year, when programs are mailed, concerning the State Project in an effort to encourage the help of all Auxiliaries in reaching our goal.

SECTION VI-- Bible and Tract Distributor

The duties of the Bible and Tract Distributor shall be:

(a) To purchase and maintain an ample supply of tracts and Bibles; (b) Supply a list of available tracts to all auxiliaries in the state of Texas. Supply a sample pack to any auxiliary requesting it for the price of postage and handling; (c) Encourage all auxiliaries to support the Bible and Tract fund on a regular basis; (d) Accept contributions and disburse funds as needed for postage, purchasing, and publicity; (e) To chair a

committee of 2 or 3 from her local area. This committee would assist the distributor in any way she needs and would be responsible for any publicity needed to make the district and local auxiliaries aware of the Bible and Tract program.

SECTION VII-- Parliamentary

The duties of the Parliamentarian shall be:

To advise the presiding officer on points of parliamentary law and also to give similar advice to the body when they request it.

SECTION VIII-- G. A. Promotional Director

The duties of the G. A. Promotional Director shall include:

(a) The promotion of existing G. A.'s; (b) Help in organizing new auxiliaries; (c) Publication of the G. A. Newsletter as needed.

ARTICLE VIII -- Membership

Each church shall be entitled to three messengers who have been chosen by her Auxiliary and approved by the church.

ARTICLE IX -- Contributions

SECTION I-- All contributions to this Auxiliary shall be raised by voluntary offerings and shall be given to the Treasurer for proper disbursement.

SECTION II-- At each annual meeting, the messengers shall select, by majority vote, a special project within the confines of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas, for the coming year. (a) Individual or District Auxiliaries who shall desire to nominate a project shall be encouraged to send a copy of the proposal to the Corresponding Secretary by September 1 so that she may include such information in a publicity letter to auxiliaries over the state before the State Meeting; (b) Individual or District Auxiliaries who nominate a project should be prepared to present adequate information concerning the project; (c) All project offerings shall be given to the Treasurer for proper disbursement.

SECTION III-- The Bible and Tract Distributor shall receive funds for the Bible and Tract program and make proper disbursements.

ARTICLE X -- Reports

SECTION I-- This Auxiliary shall make an annual report of work accomplished by the combined Ladies Auxiliaries to the messengers of the churches which compose the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas when they are convened in annual session.

SECTION II-- Reports of local and district auxiliary work (Personal Service Reports and other reports of work accomplished) shall be made at each annual session of this Auxiliary as provided for in the program of that meeting.

ARTICLE XI -- Committees

SECTION I -- Committees shall be appointed by the President except when the President requests that they be elected.

SECTION II -- A program committee shall be appointed by the President to work with the entertaining church in preparation of the program material for each annual meeting.

SECTION III -- A Bible and Tract Committee shall be appointed by the Bible and Tract Distributor.

ARTICLE XII -- Amendment

These articles of agreement shall not be changed or amended unless the change of amendment be offered in writing during the morning session and permitted to lay over until the afternoon session. It may then be adopted only by a vote of two-thirds of the messengers.

POSTER RULES

1. Each auxiliary circle is encouraged to bring one poster.
2. Each girl's auxiliary circle is allowed an entry.
3. We encourage the practice of lettering on all posters being done by members of the auxiliary. A person should not be hired for the job.
4. The posters are to be representative of the work which has been carried on throughout the past year. Pictures, facts or details should be given on the poster, making sure the project idea is carried over clearly.
5. New projects which have been underway need to be presented on the poster.
6. The posters should be of a uniform size -- 22 inches by 28 inches.
7. The name and location of the church can be placed on the front of the poster.
8. The posters will not be judged, but are for the purpose of sharing new ideas and projects with other ladies' auxiliaries.

CHRISTIAN OUTREACH REPORT

We recommend the use of this report for encouragement of ourselves as auxiliaries in evaluation of our individual service to our Lord, our churches and others.

Explanation of "Christian Outreach Through Ladies' Auxiliary"

1. Personal Visits -- Any personal visit on behalf of your church or function of your church.

2. Hospital Visits and Visits to Sick -- Any visit to a person in the hospital or visit to sick in home.

3. Visits to Shut Ins -- Any visit to a person confined at home or nursing home because of permanent sickness or disability.

4. Comfort Visits -- Any personal visit made in time of death or adverse circumstances.

5. Telephone Calls -- Any telephone call made on behalf of your church or to show Christian concern or encouragement.

6. Cards and Letters Sent -- Any card or letter sent on behalf of your church or to show Christian concern or encouragement.

7. Bibles, Tracts or Literature Distributed -- Bibles, tracts or literature given out other than in a class situation.

8. Soul Talks -- Personal talks given with the intent of soul-winning or spiritual growth.

9. Flowers or Gifts Sent -- Flowers or gifts sent in Christian love.

10. Food Gifts Sent -- Food sent in time of need or to help or to encourage.

11. Christian Deeds Performed -- Any deed performed in Christian love, outside of your regular church duties.

12. Conversions Witnessed -- Seeing the fruit of salvation in a field that you helped cultivate.

13. Daily Bible Reader.
