Minutes of the Messenger Meeting

MBA of Texas Annual Messenger Meeting

November 18, 2025 – New Liberty Missionary Baptist Church,
Garland, TX (76th Session)

Tuesday Evening Session (7:00-9:12 PM) – 184 Attendees

The 2025 MBA of Texas Annual Messenger Meeting opened with a grand rendition of “To God Be the Glory” led by New Liberty Worship Pastor, Bro. Brad Rountree with full congregational singing. The musical presentation continued with the New Liberty Baptist Church Choir singing “The Joy.”

Bro. Daniel Moore, Pastor of Creekmont, La Porte, TX, read 1 Corinthians 10:13 and 1 Thessalonians 5:24 then led the Messengers in prayer.

Boy Scout Troop 1188 of Rowlett, TX presented the colors of the American flag, the Texas flag, and the Christian flag. Following the Color Guard presentation, the congregation sang the National Anthem arranged by Mary McDonald.

Bro. Matt Gholson, New Liberty Church Lead Pastor, welcomed the assembly to the 76th Meeting of the MBA of Texas and shared the excitement and privilege of hosting the state meeting for the first time since 1979.

Bro. Justin Gatlin, Moderator, Pastor of Alvin MBC in Alvin, recognized Bro. Mike Black, Pastor of Friendship Missionary Baptist Church, Clarksville, TX. On behalf of the Messengers, Bro. Mike Black gave the response and thanked New Liberty BC for their invitation, preparation, and service to the MBA of Texas in hosting the state meeting.

Bro. Justin Gatlin then proclaimed the 76th annual session of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas open and ready to conduct business. Bro. Luis Carillo, Immanuel Iglesia Bautista, Houston, TX, led in the opening prayer and asked God’s blessing upon the meeting and the Churches of the MBA of Texas.

Bro. Gatlin highlighted the Rules of Decorum. The Rules of Decorum are as follows: 1) It is important that each person present remember that this is a Christian Business Meeting, and each of us should conduct ourselves in a like manner; 2) If you wish to make a motion or speak to a motion, or make an announcement, please come to a microphone, address the moderator so everyone can hear you, and identify yourself so that the clerks may make proper record; and 3) All business should be conducted in an orderly and brotherly fashion.

Bro. Gatlin share his joy and honor at serving and being at the meeting.

Assistant Moderator, Bro. James Williams, Pastor of College Station MBC, addressed the assembly and invited Bro. Mike Pearson, Director of Texas Mission Development to introduce the Moderator, Bro. Justin Gatlin, for the annual Moderator's Address.

Bro. Mike Pearson shared how Bro. Gatlin has blessed his life and work. Sis. Kelly Meek then encouraged the congregation through her singing of "Defender" by Francesca Battistelli.

Moderator, Bro. Gatlin, spoke from Galatians 6:12-17, 1 Corinthians 15:31, and Luke 9:23 about "The Crucified MBA." A motion and second was made to include the Moderator's Address in the 2025 yearbook. The motion passed. Assistant Moderator, Bro. James Williams, extended the Right Hand of Appreciation and thanked Bro. Justin for his challenging address. He then recognized Bro. Justin Gatlin, to resume his moderation of the meeting. Bro. Gatlin then called for a motion and second to adopt the agenda for the 2025 meeting with explanation of the order and schedule of the agenda. A motion and second were made. The motion passed.

Bro. Justin Gatlin recognized Ernest Moyers and Greg Devine as the Enrollment and Finance Committee and reminded the Messengers to submit their church letter forms as soon as possible.

Bro. Michael Thompson was recognized for his 24 years of service in the Enrollment and Finance Committee. Bro. Gatlin presented him a plaque to thank him for his service, guidance, and relentless work for the association.

Bro. Gatlin instructed the Tellers to count the attendance for the evening session and report the numbers to the Clerks.

New Pastors were recognized. Out of state guests were then recognized. Guests were from Arkansas, Georgia, Florida, Louisiana, Indiana, Utah, New York, and South American country Colombia.

Bro. Gatlin reminded the Messengers that the list of reports was listed on the back of the agenda and that most reports are not read.

Bro. Mike Pearson, Texas Mission Development Director, was recognized to introduce the 2025 Annual Speaker, Bro. Chet Brake, Pastor of Pursley MBC, Purdon, TX. Bro. Pearson shared how he worked with Bro. Brake weekly and his passion for the Lord's work.

Before Bro. Brake brought the evening message, the trio Spoken For (Sis. Dawn Wills, Vicki Miller, and Charisse Jones) sang an acapella rendition of Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow.

Bro. Brake spoke from Nehemiah 1:1-4 about how the things we see should impact us yet also show us how God is working. Following the sermon, Bro. Danny Chappell, Pastor of Crestview MBC, Arlington, TX, offered Bro. Brake the Right Hand of Appreciation for being faithful to God's Word, challenging the messengers, and glorifying God in all he said.

The assembly then sang "Christ Is Able" as a hymn of response.

A motion and second was made to include the Annual Sermon in the minute book. The motion passed. (*The Sermon was not provided to the clerks.*)

Bro. Gatlin called for any other necessary business to be laid on the table. There was no business.

Prayer requests were shared with the assembly. Miscellaneous announcements were made. A QR Code was provided to the Messenger Body for submission to the Memorials to Preachers report.

A motion and second was made to adjourn the meeting until 9:30 Wednesday morning. The motion passed.

Sis. Jenn Keys and the New Liberty BC Worship Leading Choir blessed the assembly in a closing song, "Thank You Jesus for the Blood."

Bro. Hugh Roth, Alvin MBC, Alvin, TX, read from 1 John 3:1-3 and closed the session in prayer.

Wednesday Morning Session (9:30-11:50 AM) – 130 Attendees

New Liberty Baptist Church Worship Pastor, Bro. Brad Rountree, greeted the Messengers and welcomed them to the morning session. He shared a story about Fanny Crosby and then led in the singing of "Blessed Assurance." He was accompanied by Paula Pence, New Liberty BC member, and Bro. Aaron Bryan, Pastor of Fellowship Baptist Church, Conroe, TX. Bro. Bryan then played the piano while singing "The Prayer" to the delight of everyone gathered.

Moderator Bro. Justin Gatlin thanked the singers and musicians for a beautiful opening to the day's meeting. He then welcomed Bro. Leland Acker, Pastor of First Baptist Church of Hermleigh, TX. Bro. Acker spoke from Romans 1:16-17 and shared how God had worked mightily in his life.

Moderator Bro. Gatlin reminded the assembly of miscellaneous information and asked the Tellers to be ready to tally the voting.

Invitations for 2027:

Moderator Bro. Justin Gatlin asked for invitations for the 78th Messenger Meeting of the MBA of Texas. The Messengers were reminded that the 2026 Messenger Meeting will be held at Walnut Street BC in Hillsboro, Pastor Paul Clark.

Bro. Gatlin and Alvin MBC invited the MBA of Texas to Alvin, TX for the 2027 meeting. There were no other invitations. A motion and second were made to accept the invitation. The motion passed.

The Moderator called for nominations for the 2026 Annual Sermon (Tuesday evening) and the Missions Sermon (Wednesday evening).

A motion and second were made for the runner-up to serve as the alternate. The motion passed.

Nominations for Annual Sermon: Bros. Glen Moore, Pastor of Lifeway BC, Quero, TX; Ryan Youngblood, Pastor of Akin Grove MBC, Clarksville, TX; and Landon Barrios, Pastor of Hubbard MBC, Hubbard, TX. Bro. Ryan Youngblood was elected as speaker with Bro. Glen Moore serving as alternate.

Nominations for the Missions Sermon: Bros. Dean Grigsby, Pastor of Pinkham Memorial MBC in De Kalb; Pete Underwood, Pastor of Landmark MBC in Mt. Enterprise; and Todd Haneline, Church Planter of Restoration Hill BC in Kerrville. Bro. Pete Underwood was elected as the speaker with Bro. Todd Haneline serving as alternate.

Bro. Gatlin recognized Assistant Moderator, Bro. James Williams, Pastor of College Station BC, College Station, TX. Bro. Williams introduced and thanked Bro. Danny Mendoza, Secretary-Treasurer of Missions, for his hard work.

Mission Report:

Bro. Danny Mendoza, Secretary-Treasurer of Missions, was recognized to conduct the Missions section of the meeting and to bring the annual report. (The annual report can be seen in the appropriate sections of the State Minute Book.) Bro. Mendoza thanked the Messengers and Churches of the MBA of Texas for the many years of support, encouragement, and prayers for the work of the MBA of Texas.

Bro. Mendoza recognized the State Missionaries and projects requesting support for the upcoming fiscal year from the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas to speak to the Messenger Assembly sharing thoughts for their respective work.

Missionaries and Projects (in order of presentation):

Bro. Larry Watson, Landmark MBC, Rockdale, TX, thanked the Messengers and shared the growth that has happened over the last five years. The Church has been able to reach out to the community in more ways to meet and connect with the people around them. They love sharing the Gospel with the local community. The money sent from the MBA of Texas allows the Church. Bro. Watson shared that back in 2020, when the Church asked for help, the church was about to close its doors. The funds received that year were basically used to keep the doors, then fix things that were broken. Following that time of reinvestment, the Church shored up its doctrinal stance and teachings. After some stability was achieved, the Church began going out more and currently uses many of the funds for such as that. He asked for the Churches of the MBA of Texas to pray for the work. The work is sponsored by College Station Baptist Church, College Station, TX, with Bro. James Williams as Pastor. The request is for \$1,550.00 per month.

Bro. David Smith, Lifeline Baptist Church, Venus, TX, greeted the body and expressed his thanks for Bro. Monty Hilliard and Quaker Avenue BC for their vision and support. He shared that a number of souls have been saved with many more baptized and interested in the ministries of Lifeline BC. They had a special Easter event and concert which brought 120 people to their campus. It was an exciting and God-filled event. Following the concert, there were 78 people in attendance for worship services which created a standing-room-only situation. The Church is very diverse in ethnicity and languages and is attracting many different people. Bro. Smith also shared how he serves a chaplain which has resulted in many people coming to the Church. He thanked the MBA of Texas and other groups for the continual support and prayers. The work is sponsored by Quaker Avenue Missionary Baptist Church, Lubbock, TX, with Bro. Monty Hilliard as Pastor. The request is for \$2,185.00 per month.

Bro. Glenn McCarver, Borderland Ministries, El Paso, TX, shared about the faithfulness and help from so many for this work. He spoke about how they are ministering to many in the military which can be difficult at times. He asked for the body to pray for a young woman who was saved but has gone back to her old ways. He shared how it takes time for changes to occur, but he hopes they can continue to minister to her. Member, Bro. Pena, has also begun to help serve at the Church filling in for Bro. McCarver when he is absent. A member, Seth, has been asking about God's calling upon his life. He is currently in the military and is seeking God's will for his life. The work is sponsored by Northside Baptist Church, Snyder, TX, with Bro. Ron Davis as Pastor. The request is for \$2,250.00.

Bro. Todd Haneline, Restoration Hill, Kerrville, TX, greeted the body and shared his thankfulness for this opportunity to do God's work in the Texas Hill Country. He spoke about the current work and ministry opportunities due to the horrific, once-in-a-century flood that hit the Hill Country area in July 2025. He asked the Messengers to speak with him later about specifics and needs for that area. He also shared about the various outreach events and ministry work in Kerrville. The work is sponsored by College Station Baptist Church, College Station, TX, with Bro. James Williams as Pastor. The request is for \$3,750.00.

Bro. Greg Devine, Coastal Way Baptist Church, Lake Jackson, TX, thanked everyone for their support and shared how he was happy to be at the meeting this year. The work is growing and asking for a decrease in support due to the Church stepping up and giving more to the financial needs of the Church. Attendance continues to grow along with partnerships with area organizations that help people in need, such as pregnancy centers, men ministries, etc. There is an Impact Outreach coming to the Lake Jackson area with many Churches and believers coming to help impact the community through various outreach and ministry events. The work is sponsored

by Friendship Missionary Baptist Church, Clarksville, TX, with Bro. Mike Black as Pastor. The request is for \$3,000.00 per month.

Bro. Monty Hilliard, Pastor of Quaker Avenue MBC, sponsoring Church of Raider MBSF, spoke on behalf of Bro. Chris Roberson, Director, who is home sick. He shared how the Church has been ministering to students at Texas Tech for almost four decades. Currently, the MBSF is really gaining ground and is averaging 10-12 students on Monday nights. They have a Bible Study, worship, and fellowship which the students are thoroughly enjoying. Students are attending Church and involved with service projects. There is a strong movement in that age group. The building fund has just over \$225,000.00 to help with the building of a permanent MBSF Home for the students. The work is sponsored by Quaker Avenue Missionary Baptist Church, Lubbock, TX, with Bro. Monty Hilliard as Pastor. The request is for \$1,000.00 per month.

Bro. Joseph Rice, Shiloh MBC, San Antonio, TX, spoke to the Messengers and shared the various ministries of the Church. Several souls have been saved over the past year with an increasing weekly attendance. One local man has begun attending and has asked for help in his personal life. Another military man from California was sent to Shiloh when he was transferred. The Church continues to minister to the homeless and needy. The Church is also in need of a permanent location. They currently do not have a permanent home. The work is sponsored by Northside Baptist Church, Snyder, TX, with Bro. Ron Davis as Pastor. The request is for Designated Funds.

Landmark MBC in Rockdale, Pastor Larry Watson; College Station MBC \$1,550.00

The Secretary-Treasurer called for a vote of the Messenger Assembly for the Missionaries recommended for Missionary Baptist Association of Texas funds. The motion was seconded and passed.

Bro. Greg Devine – Approved.

Bro. Todd Haneline – Approved.

Bro. Glenn McCarver – Approved.

Bro. Joseph Rice – Approved.

Bro. David Smith – Approved.

Raider MBSF – Approved.

Landmark MBC – Approved.

A motion and a second were made to keep the Christmas bonus the same (\$300.00 per Missionary) as last year. The motion passed.

A motion and a second to keep the salary for Office Help (\$500.00) the same for the coming year. The motion carried.

A motion was made to increase the salary of the Office of Secretary-Treasurer of Missions by 3%. A second was made. An amendment to the motion was made by Bro. Shawn Findley, Pastor of Nevill's Chapel MBC, Mount Pleasant, TX, to increase the raise to 5%. A second was made. The amendment passed. The amended motion, to increase the salary by 5%, was then presented to the Messengers. The Messenger body unanimously approved the raise. (The current salary will be \$3,307.50.)

A motion and a second were made to adopt the entire Mission Report as presented. The motion carried.

Bro. James Williams invited all Missionaries present, regardless of location, to gather at the front so that the Messenger Body might pray over them and asked all present to stand. Bro. Gatlin prayed over the Missionaries and Bro. Danny Mendoza.

Publications:

Assistant Moderator, Bro. James Williams, recognized Bro. Nathan Luellen, Editor-in-Chief of Bogard Press, to speak to the Publications report. He then shared a video highlighting the 2026 VBS program.

Bro. Jim Crain, Business Manager of Bogard Press, thanked the Messengers for their support and use of the ABA printed literature. He shared there have been some challenges this year. The large offset press has shut down, and a new press costs approximately \$4,500,000.00. Since it cost prohibitive, Bogard Press has decided to pursue digital printing. The Bookstore currently operates at a loss each year. The printing side of the operation helps carry the bookstore. There has been research done in consideration of downsizing

the building and possibly saving \$200,000.00 per year. Bogard Press also owns seven acres.

A printed report was not available, so a motion and second was made to use the reports of Bros. Nathan Luellen and Jim Crain as the Publications Report. The entire Publications Report was adopted.

Seminaries:

Texas Baptist Institute & Seminary – TBI President, Bro. Steve Butler, shared exciting news about the school. Currently, there are 127 students with 27 faculty members. Many students receive financial aid, but there is always a need for more help. The school has some Masters-level and Doctoral-level students which is encouraging. There are many campus projects and plans. A motion and second were made to adopt the report. The motion passed.

Mexican Baptist Institute – MBI President, Bro. Al Valladares, shared that the school has 24 first-year students and 10 second- and third-year students. There are also 22 students enrolled in further education classes. That is a total of 66 students enrolled for this year. Bro. Al then shared about the purchase and remodeling of the land and permanent home for MBI. Some buildings have been torn down and new buildings are planned. He spoke about the new works that the graduates of MBI have started in just the last 12 months alone. He also invited the Messengers to visit MBI. MBI Sponsoring Pastor, Bro. Matt Gholson, spoke to the report and shared the excitement about the new property and facilities. A motion and second were made to adopt the report. The motion passed.

Heritage Baptist Institute – Bro. Michael Torres spoke on behalf of the President who is away officiating a wedding. In one location, the school has 8 students who are very excited to be learning. There are American, Colombian, and Mexican students attending the school. A motion and second were made to adopt the report. The motion passed.

Central Baptist Institute – President Juan Gallegos shared updates from the campuses in Mexico, Peru, Colombia, and Honduras. He asked for continued support and help with travel support. The school will resume construction on its facilities. Lecture week will be held on March 5-6, 2026, and everyone is invited to attend. A motion and second were made to adopt the report. The motion passed.

Interstate and Foreign Missions:

Bro. Justin Coburn, Secretary-Treasurer of Missions for the American Baptist Association, spoke to the report and shared the upcoming Thanksgiving Offering which is vitally important to the suc-

cess of the continued Missions Program of the ABA. There are 146 Missionaries serving in 22 states and 27 countries. He gave updates on many of the trips he made in the past few months visiting Missionaries and works around the world. He made at least six international trips and an untold amount of interstate trips in 2024-25. He has been from Maine to Washington and enjoyed seeing four Churches organize this year. A printed report was not available, so a motion and second was made to use the report of Bro. Justin Coburn as the Interstate & Foreign Missions report. The entire Interstate & Foreign Missions report was adopted.

A motion and a second were made to set a salary of \$1,200.00 per clerk along with a \$1,400.00 stipend for the clerk administering the website and layout of the Year Book. The motion passed.

A motion and second were made to set a salary of \$500.00 per Enrollment and Finance Committee member. The motion passed.

A motion and a second were made to receive the Wednesday night offering for Iglesia Buatista Betel to help pay off their building debt. The motion passed.

A motion and a second were made to reimburse the host church for meeting expenses. Bro. Matt Gholson shared that there were no expenses to be reported by New Liberty BC, Garland, TX, for hosting the MBA of Texas.

Chaplaincy Report:

Bro. Ron Davis, Pastor of Snyder MBC, Snyder, TX spoke to the report and shared how he is a Hospice Chaplain which allows him to minister to people and their families at the most sensitive times. Over the past year, he has seen 120 people accept Christ as Lord. He has seen an uptick in attendance at his Church due to this ministry. Bro. Davis also shared how it's not only a great opportunity to reach people but also a way that many Pastors can help supplement their income when needed. A motion and second were made to adopt the report. The motion passed.

A motion and second were made to adjourn. The motion passed.

Bro. Gatlin gave a few announcements before dismissal. Prayer requests were shared with the Messengers.

Bro. Teruha Tokuchi, TBI Student, was asked to read Scripture, Romans 1:16, and led the assembly in prayer.

Wednesday Afternoon Session (2:00-3:50 PM) – 80 Attendees

Bro. Brad Rountree, Worship Pastor of New Liberty BC, Garland, TX, along with members Paula Pence and Kyle Cole opened the afternoon session leading the congregation in singing “Glory to His Name” and “O How I Love Jesus.”

Bro. Jonathan Woodring, Pastor of The Refuge Church, Plainfield, IN, shared 1 Corinthians 9:19-23 and reminded the Messengers to do what they could to reach the lost. He then led in prayer.

Moderator, Bro. Justin Gatlin, called for the following reports for the afternoon session:

Texas Mission Development:

A motion and a second were made to adopt the report. Bro. Bennie Boles, Pastor of Rocky Springs MBC, Jacksonville, TX, sponsoring Church of TMD, shared the history of TMD and how it was patterned after a similar program in Oklahoma. The program was funded in 1972. This past year, TMD gave over \$134,000 this past year which averages to over \$33,000 per quarter. There are 130 Churches participating in the program down from a high of 160. The current Director is Tony Cline, member of Rocky Springs MBC. The motion passed.

Texas Mission Builders:

A motion and a second were made to adopt the report. Bro. Mike Pearson, Director of TMB, shared how he is honored to serve TMB and share good news about the program. He shared information about the work that was accomplished this past year. At least 11 projects were completed. Bro. Pearson spoke about Bro. Leroy Smith and the many years of service he gave TMB. The motion passed.

Youth Work:

A motion was made and seconded to adopt the report as printed. Bro. Ricky Lee, Manager of Pine Springs Baptist Camp in Laneville, spoke to the report. The camp was able to install a new front area to the cafeteria, all new covered pavilions, new benches, and is currently demolishing the old pool and building a new in the next 2-3 months at a cost of \$230,000.00-250,000.00. Bro. Lee also shared the new regulations from the State of Texas due to the tragedy that occurred in the Hill Country in July. Due to the wonderful evangelistic efforts and fruit from the camps, and especially due to the increased stress and regulation over Texas camps, Bro. Gatlin asked Bro. Steve Butler to lead a prayer for Pine Springs Baptist Camp. Bro. Butler shared his experience at camp, the first year of Bogg Springs, and how he was saved there and also answered the call to ministry there

later in his life. All three of his sons' salvation occurred at camp too. Bro. John Jacks, Manager of Bogg Springs Baptist Camp in Wickes, AR, spoke to the report. He shared that over 300 souls were saved this past year at Bogg Springs and how he would appreciate the extra prayers for the camp as well. He discussed the need for new cabins and how much they would cost. The camp is efficient and can continue running, but large donations are needed to make much needed improvements. Bro. Chris Cates, Pastor of Hughes Springs MBC, spoke to the report and shared the dates and information for Weekend 4 Jesus (W4J) retreat held January 1-3, 2026, at Pine Springs Baptist Camp. Pastor Jayden Durst, representing Bro. Landon Barrios, Pastor of Hubbard MBC, Hubbard, TX, one of the leaders for Revival Camp, spoke to reasons for developing this camp and how it hopes to accomplish various ministry goals. The camp will be held June 2-6, 2026. The motion passed.

Missionary Baptist Student Fellowship:

A motion and a second were made to adopt the report. Bro. James Williams, Pastor of College Station BC in College Station, sponsoring Church of Texas A&M MBSF, spoke about the number of college students in the State of Texas – 1.6 million. To this date, there are two active MBSF groups in the State of Texas. Bro. Williams challenged the Messengers and Churches to step up and reach one of the largest demographics at a critical point in their life. He invited anyone interested in serving as MBSF Director to come see him. He also shared some of the growing MBSF groups in neighboring states. Bro. Monty Hilliard, Pastor of Quaker Avenue BC, Lubbock, TX, sponsoring Church of Raider MBSF, gave some history to the Tech MBSF and some state sponsored MBSF work. The motion passed.

Women's Conference:

A motion and a second were made to adopt the report. Sis. Kim Story, Ladies' Conference President, was recognized to speak to the Women's Ministry Report. The ladies held their meeting yesterday with a theme of Kindness, Love, and Unity. The Ruth Circle of New Liberty BC hosted the Conference. Sis. Story reported that \$10,789.37 of the \$12,000.00 goal has been received to date for the 2025 state project, Raider MBSF, sponsored by Quaker Avenue MBC, Lubbock, TX. Funds will continue to be received for this project until December 1, 2025. The 2026 goal is Restoration Hill BC, Ker-ville, TX, sponsored by College Station BC, College Station, TX. The goal is to raise \$12,000.00 for this project. Further information can be found in the printed report submitted by the Women's Conference of the MBA of Texas. Bros. James Williams, Monty Hilliard, and Justin Gatlin thanked the ladies and the amazing work they do for the State of Texas. The motion passed.

Worship Report:

A motion and second was made to adopt the report as printed. Bro. Brad Rountree, Worship Pastor of New Liberty BC, was asked to provide a time of musical worship. He shared some of his musical and ministry story then blessed the congregation with a thoughtful rendition of "One Day." The motion passed.

Media:

A motion and a second were made to adopt the report. Bro. Chris Meek spoke to the report and shared information about web-sites, social media, AI, and how technology is not an all or nothing situation. He reminded those assembled that technology should serve for the promotion of the Gospel. The motion passed.

ABA Credit Union:

A motion and second were made to adopt the report as printed. Bro. Justin Gatlin, a Board Member, spoke to the report and shared who can participate as a member of the ABA Credit Union. He spoke about how the money deposited with the Credit Union can help other churches obtain low-cost loans and save the Lord's churches money. You may go to abacu.org for more information. The motion passed.

Recovery Ministry:

A motion and second was made to adopt the report as printed. The motion passed.

Benevolence:

A motion and second were made to adopt the report. Bro. Ryan Smith, Assistant Administrator for the Texarkana Baptist Children's Home spoke to the report. Bro. Smith shared how it's a privilege to work with the children at this moment in time and the great need for so many children in need. All churches are asked to pray for the Home, salvation of the children, house parents, and other needs. Bro. Matt Gholson, Lead Pastor of New Liberty BC, Garland, TX, and Trustee and Texas Representative for the Texarkana Baptist Children's Home, spoke to the report and asked the Messengers to remember the staff and house parents. The motion passed.

Resolutions:

Whereas the members of New Liberty BC have provided excellent kindness and hospitality this week,

And whereas they have generously provided the use of their facilities to aid in the smooth operation of the 76th annual messenger assembly,

Be it therefore resolved,

That the messengers of the MBA of Texas express our profound thanks and gratitude to New Liberty and her pastor for their love and kindness in hosting the messengers this year.

Enrollment & Finance Committee:

A motion and second were made to adopt the report. Bro. Ernest Moyers gave the information for the meeting which will be included in the Yearbook.

A motion and second were made to adjourn until 7:00 PM for the last session of the 2025 Meeting.

Bro. Ron Witcher read from Psalm 133:1-3 and closed the session in prayer.

Wednesday Evening Session (7:00-8:40 PM) – 167 Attendees

The last session of the 2025 Missionary Baptist Association of Texas Annual State Meeting opened with a glorious time of worship led by Bro. Brad Rountree, Worship Pastor at New Liberty BC, and the Worship Leading Choir (WLC) of New Liberty BC. The assembly read various Scripture passages and was led in a powerful version of “Holy Forever.”

Bro. Aldwin Texas Baptist Institute & Seminary Student, read from 1 Corinthians 15:1-4 and led the assembly in prayer.

Moderator Bro. Justin Gatlin introduced Garland Mayor Dylan Hedrick. Mayor Hedrick welcomed the Messengers and thanked them for visiting this great city. He shared that he follows the 3 Fs – Faith, Family, and Fifth Street (location of City Hall). The assembly laughed and loved his greeting. He continued to share information about the city and asked that we might pray for him and the City of Garland leadership. His welcome was greatly appreciated with a loud round of applause.

Bro. Gatlin then spoke about an additional VIP that needed to be addressed at this time. He shared that today is Bro. Brad’s birthday. He then led the assembly in a fun singing of Happy Birthday. Thad Mills, Larry Chandler, James Brown, Horace Deaton, Leroy Smith, David Meyers, Samuel Reeves, Robert Hargrave, Charles Gray, Carol Grigsby, Thomas Milam, Don Vann, Bill Voss, James Bunger, Johnathon Ezernack, Ronald Shaw, Odis Bryan. A motion and second were made to adopt the report with the privilege for the Clerks to include any names overlooked. The motion passed. Bro. Cohurst led the assembly in prayer.

History & Archives:

Bro. Michael Thompson shared that the report is printed on the back of the Secretary-Treasurer of Missions report. He spoke to the meetings held by the Committee and that everyone is welcome to attend the open meetings. The Committee will hold a meeting on the Monday night before the MBA of Texas State Meeting next year in Hillsboro. Everyone is welcome to this pre-associational meeting which will probably be held in a restaurant environment. Bro. Thompson also reminded the Messengers of the upcoming 100th Meeting of the American Baptist Association in Hot Springs, Arkansas. A motion and second were made to adopt the report. The motion passed.

Bro. Gatlin asked Bro. John Bryant to introduce the speaker for the Missions Sermon. Bro. Bryant shared his love and admiration for Bro. Juan Gallegos. He shared his admiration for his dedication, his love for life, and for his friendship. Bro. Gallegos is a recommended Missionary, serves on the Standing Missionary Committee, and serves as Seminary President. He also is a fun guy who can make just about anyone laugh. Most of all, he is a saved man, a called man, and a Preacher of the Gospel.

Bro. Rountree and the WLC gave a mighty message through song with “Is He Worthy?”

Bro. Juan Gallegos preached an encouraging and challenging message from John 14:1-3 about “What do you do when things don’t go as you expect?” The assembly then sang “Turn Your Eyes Upon Jesus” as a hymn of response. Following the response song, Bro. Larry Albritton, Pastor of Good Shepherd BC, Shepherd, TX, offered Bro. Gallegos the Right Hand of Appreciation for being faithful to God and encouraging the assembly to always look to Jesus, regardless of what is happening.

The Officers of the MBA of Texas thanked the Messengers for their support and prayers.

Incoming Moderator Bro. James Williams called for prayer requests. Iglesia Bautista Betel thanked the Messengers for the generous offering.

Bro. Aaron Bryan, Pastor of Fellowship BC, Conroe, TX shared Lamentations 3:21-26 and encouraged the Messengers to carry forth the message of Jesus Christ until the end of the world. He then led the assembly in prayer.

Moderator Bro. James Williams closed the 2025 Messenger Meeting of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas, and the Messengers were adjourned until the 2026 Meeting or the Lord's return.

Moderator's Address **The Crucified MBA**

Tonight, I want to take you to a hill far away, where three crosses stand.

You can see it in your mind's eye, I am sure. The one in the middle, too horrible to gaze upon and too beautiful to look away. There is the Savior: His face is swollen from the blows of a reed, patches of beard ripped out, and His back sliced to ribbons. Worse still, the heavy circles under His eyes from a sleepless night of praying alone, when His disciples could not bear with Him one hour. Do you smell the stench? All of my sin is poured out on Him, like an oozing, putrid infection. Every ungodly thought, every idle word, and every selfish action piled together. Every sermon I've ever preached, prayer I've ever prayed or song of praise I've ever sung for the eyes of men instead of for the glory of God is there on Him - the reek of the hypocrisy is almost too much to stand. And that's just my sin! Time would fail us to speak of the bloody hands of Cain, the smelting oven of Aaron, the ropes of Delilah, and the coin purse of Judas.

How could we bear to gaze on this any longer? But wait. The darkness is not all. Blazing there in the midst is the Light of the World. This is no senseless tragedy. The nail-pierced hands are not helpless; they are the hands of the great High Priest of our confession, and His blood and tears make a garment far more glorious than all of the finest robes of Caiaphas. Like a beautiful painting, when our eyes adjust to the scene, we can see that the black streaks are merely outlines marking out the real subject. Have you ever seen such love? The spotless, sinless son of God, willingly taking my place and yours. Take an-

other breath - the stench of the sin momentarily masked the Rose of Sharon, achingly beautiful and amazingly potent. Our hearts break and are full at the same time. Do you know the hymn?

When I survey the wondrous cross
One which the Prince of Glory died
My richest gain I count but loss,
And pour contempt on all my pride

What else could we do before such a sight? Consider the third verse

See from His head, His hands, His feet
Sorrow and love flow mingled down!
Did e'er such love and sorry meet,
Or thorns compose so rich a crown?

What can we do but worship?

But break away with me for a moment, to consider the two other crosses. The two thieves, who have stolen what doesn't belong to them and who are receiving what they deserve. You've read about them in Luke's gospel, but I want to show them to you in Galatians.

Galatians 6:12–17

¹² As many as desire to make a fair shew in the flesh, they constrain you to be circumcised; only lest they should suffer persecution for the cross of Christ.

¹³ For neither they themselves who are circumcised keep the law; but desire to have you circumcised, that they may glory in your flesh.

¹⁴ But God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world.

¹⁵ For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision availeth any thing, nor uncircumcision, but a new creature.

¹⁶ And as many as walk according to this rule, peace *be* on them, and mercy, and upon the Israel of God.

¹⁷ From henceforth let no man trouble me: for I bear in my body the marks of the Lord Jesus.

There are three crosses in this text. The cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, in the middle, is the only source of glory. On one side, there is the penitent sinner, dying to never die again. On

the other is the world, breathing its last in rebellion and with blasphemy in its teeth.

The title of my address this evening is, "The Crucified Association." Christ died once for all, never to die again. But we must take up our cross and die daily (1 Corinthians 15:31, Luke 9:23).

As individuals, to live with Christ, we must be crucified with Him. You see it in verse 12 - the legalists wanted the people to be circumcised to avoid the shame of the cross. We can do good works that the world will approve of, lead people to change their behavior without changing their hearts and try to hide from the scandal of the cross. But you cannot have the beauty of the light without the sting of the darkness. There is no good news without first facing the bad news. Superficial changes avoid the shame of the cross - the tragedy that you and I can never earn our way to God, and our only hope is pure grace. We are so sinful that it took the blood of the Son of God to make us whole, and so loved that He willingly gave it.

What is true for individuals is true for the MBA as well. We have to die to the desire to make a fair show in the flesh, impressing the world with numbers or flair. We must be crucified to the things the world prizes: political influence and piles of income. Those things are dead. They cannot go into the new world - they can only be left here to rot with the wood of the crossbeam. That's true even within our meeting: jockeying for position, bragging about the differences in our churches, and tearing down our brothers over trivial disputes. Nail them to the cross! Grumbling and gossip alike need to be bound to the tree to be left behind.

Matthew 20:25–28

²⁵ But Jesus called them *unto him*, and said, Ye know that the princes of the Gentiles exercise dominion over them, and they that are great exercise authority upon them.

²⁶ But it shall not be so among you: but whosoever will be great among you, let him be your minister;

²⁷ And whosoever will be chief among you, let him be your servant:

²⁸ Even as the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give his life a ransom for many.

In our meeting this week, and when we return to our churches, can we truly say that the world has been crucified to us and we to the world? Or do we still carry the trappings of the flesh with us? We can avoid the shame of the cross by bringing up our own pride, but if we see Jesus rightly, we will smother it in contempt.

Paul said:

Galatians 6:14

¹⁴ But God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world.

To glory is to boast. The word can refer to things like jewelry - ornaments of beauty to draw attention to the status or success of the owner (Ezekiel 16:17 LXX). What baubles do we wear? How could anything compare to the cross of Christ? What greater glory could we have than that Christ died for us? But - inexplicably - we try. We pin costume jewelry on our chest, all sparkle and no substance. We have our traditions, our positions, and our spectacle. We want prestige and we want attention, as if anything we do could be mentioned in the same breath as the price Christ paid for us.

Paul cared about correct doctrine, but he didn't glory in believing the right things about church and baptism. Paul cared about mission work - the scars in his own body proved that beyond any doubt - but that isn't what filled his breast with pride. No, he resolved to only know one thing: Christ and Him crucified, and God forbid that he should glory in anything else. There is only one glory, and that is what everything else rests on. Paul cared about his works - he said that he labored more than all of the other Apostles (1 Corinthians 15:10) - but he knew where the source was: Only in the cross.

It is not our strength but His! The life I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God who loved me and gave Himself for me (Galatians 2:20). The power of our association is in seeing our weakness, so the power of Christ rests upon us.

Do we glory in our weakness? Do we, through prayer and tears, sow the seeds of the gospel until there is a harvest only God can get the credit for? Or do we hold back and only attempt things that we can accomplish on our own, with a ve-

neer of holy language? Our God is greater than that. But it means that our pride and plans must die. We must take up the hammer and drive it in deep. Paul could say with boldness - God forbid that I should glory in anything else - the world is dead to me and I am dead to it. This fallen creation has its cross, and I have mine, and all that matters is our relationship to the one between us.

That's the heart of the matter, isn't it? The crux, if you can tolerate the wordplay. Jesus crucified, risen, and coming again comes between us and the world, but the siren song that leads to the grace is never fully drowned out. The world can tempt us to use worldly methods to reach people, or worldly excuses and self-righteousness for why we don't. But there is no room for either. Our only ornament is the cross - not a charm on a silver chain, but the blood-soaked, splintered wood of shame, pain, and death. We can only boast in our weakness, because it is in our weakness that God's love is put on full display.

The externals do not matter. We cannot settle for anything less than a miracle.

Galatians 6:15

¹⁵ For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision availeth any thing, nor uncircumcision, but a new creature.

People who are alike gather and fellowship. There is no miracle there. People who like horses gather together - they call it a rodeo. People who like a certain kind of music gather together - they call it a concert. That's not divine power, it's just convenience. Conservatives gather with other conservatives, and liberals gather with other liberals. Old people gather together, it's called Cracker Barrel. Young people gather together, rich people gather together; there are book clubs, social clubs, and service clubs. But none of those showcases divine power. No, neither circumcision nor uncircumcision is anything. The only thing that accomplishes anything is being made new in Christ Jesus. The only power that changes communities is the blood of the Lamb. The only way to have a great Association is to crucify it.

“Forbid it, Lord,” Watts wrote, “that I should boast
save in the death of Christ, my God!
All the vain things that charm me most,
I sacrifice them through his blood.”

May the world die and I die with it. May all of the pleasures and treasures of this world be burned. Through the blood of Christ, we kill the oxen and burn the plow.

Turn to verse 17.

Galatians 6:17

¹⁷ From henceforth let no man trouble me: for I bear in my body the marks of the Lord Jesus.

This is, I think, my favorite verse in the letter, although I have to admit that as I preached through Galatians this year, I had a different favorite verse every week. Paul, the faithful Apostle to the Gentiles, faced criticism and attacks at every hand. I know that many of you have come to this meeting battered and bruised, with more knife holes in the back of your shirt than the front. We all do. But we could learn something from Paul's response: don't trouble me any more, because I bear in my body the marks of the Lord Jesus.

Don't trouble me, not because I can't take it anymore - he could do all things through Christ who strengthened him. Don't trouble me, not because I deserve better - he knew better than most that all he deserved was the hell prepared for the devil and his angels. Don't trouble me because I am a branded man. In the ancient world, slaves were branded with the marks of their master. They belonged to the one who made the marks, and to trouble the slave was to offend the master. From this horrible, dehumanizing custom, Paul found glory. He warned them not to trouble him because he knew who he belonged to.

Maybe he meant the curved lines on his back, where he had been scourged. Maybe he meant the stretch marks on his skin, where he was starved and then finally nourished again. Maybe he meant his feeble eyes, probably ruined by malaria while taking the gospel where Christ was unknown. But the point is clear: his opponents pointed to their circumcision as the mark of God, but Paul said to leave that to the side; he bore the marks of a willing servant to a good Master. Because, of course, many slaves bear scars for their master, but only this Master has scars for His slaves.

Oh, brothers and sisters, we ought to serve a God like that. Our lives, our families, our churches, and our association are a small speck compared to the price paid for us. But do people

see the marks of the Lord Jesus in us? Have we suffered for Him, or merely given a sip of our wealth and abundance? Do our church budgets give to missions and to outreach until it hurts, or do we only give what we think we can comfortably spare? David said that he would not give his Lord what cost him nothing, and checks sent without prayers are the kind of self-righteousness that mixed our God's blood with the Judean dirt. Do my tires bear the worn tread of going to see missionaries? Do our fingers have calluses from writing cards and making calls? Are the knees of our clothes worn thin from laboring in prayer for the lost? If no one is going to beat us, can we still bear the marks of the Lord Jesus? I know I fall so short of this, and the guilt of my conscience as I wrote this was heavy. But thanks be to God who gives us the victory. He died for those sins, so I could live for Him. Many Christians worry they will get to Heaven and have no crowns. That's fair enough. But - my dear friends - I am afraid that many of us will make it without any scars.

May this association be crisscrossed with the whips of the world and of worldly men, even those who name the name of Christ. May our hands and feet be pierced in the house of our friends, and still open wide to them. May our generosity, our service, and our humility embrace the scandal of the cross so completely that relationships will be reconciled, sins will be forsaken, and sacrifices made at this meeting. May we outdo one another in showing honor so much that no guest would know who is chief among us and who is least. May we glory in the cross with such unconscious abandon that all of our other treasures fall to the ground, turned in our eyes from diamonds to gravel.

When the MBA is crucified like that, we will live.

When the MBA glories only in the cross of Christ, crucified on one side of Him, while the world dies on the other, we will begin to bring Jesus the praise He is due.

Is He worthy?

Oh yes.

Were the whole realm of nature mine,
that were a present far too small
Love so amazing, so divine,
demands my soul, my life, my all



Robert Hargrave



Thomas Milam



David Myers




Army. He was an avid Dallas Cowboys fan and enjoyed playing 42, fishing, vegetable gardening, playing music, and singing.

Seminary Reports

Heritage Baptist Institute

The school began its new semester by implementing in-person lecture at Iglesia Bautista Betel. Several members from host church registered and we have reaped the rewards of the impact that these studies have on our people. At BETEL we are offering New Testament Survey which is taught by Bro. Michael Torres. With the addition of Bro. Juan Rodriguez, we are offering Homiletics as well. Aside from these in-person classes, we have several teachers imparting classes via ZOOM. To the date we are excited and privileged to have 2 new men who have answered the call to the gospel ministry connect with us through ZOOM. They are very grateful for the opportunity given to them. They too now have the ability to take up classes and connect with HBI where no other training can be found at their present localities.

This is the first semester for myself and for Bro. Gabriel Sanchez who, aside from teaching, have been challenged to serve in the roles of President and Dean. We are looking forward to continue to build up the school. The student's preparation and their realization of service in God's Kingdom shall be our reward.

Texas Baptist Institute

Thank you for your prayers for the leadership, faculty and students at Texas Baptist Institute & Seminary. Your prayers and

encouragement are very appreciated and needed. We are at 121 students in enrollment and expect more students when our Extension Learning Centers are all meeting. We have 121 students taking 110 courses attempting 800 credits being taught by over 20+ faculty members not including Learning Centers.

It is very beneficial that all classes are taught in three modalities: on campus sitting in class, live streamed from the classrooms, and all are recorded for individual reasons. Thank you, Dub West, for keeping this possible. Another benefit is teaching classes in Extension Learning Centers. Currently we have these Centers at six sites. More ELC's can be opened as we put the time in to do so. More sites will open in the Fall which we are grateful for.

Another interesting fact is our current low tuition cost. Regular tuition is \$225 per semester hour. This is low tuition cost. Students recommended in good standing with an ABA church for three months or longer receive a 50% discount on tuition cost. This is tremendous but creates difficulty with finances. What must be thought through is the challenge of teaching only one student in a classroom who is a member of an ABA church and receives the discount. This means the tuition payment does not cover the instructor's salary. A plan for tuition is being prepared to be submitted to the Board of Trustees.

Our newest degree programs have been well received. These include Women's Ministry and Children's Ministry. Another new program of study is Church Revitalization taught by Glen Moore. This is needed by every pastor of our ABA churches. The Preaching Program taught by David Proctor will also continue to grow in interest.

We analyze all our current degrees regularly. Our degree programs are well put together and do equip students. We are currently evaluating all our degrees and preparing to make potential changes in the Fall of 2028. We want to make the best decisions possible in preparing students for ministry. Students completing degrees are EQUIPPED!

School expenses continue to escalate. We must be careful to understand that current fees for today WILL NOT meet expenses for the future. Salaries, supplies, travel expenses, etc. continue to grow. We have begun to address this issue. It is a blessing to have extremely low tuition, but we must always evaluate, address and adjust if necessary. Gifts of offerings continue to “pull us through”. We must prepare for the future. Please help us to learn about individuals, businesses, and churches that will give strong offerings.

Several big events which invite guests to attend are scheduled for Spring. EQUIP TO SERVE will be held on Saturday, March 7 all day. This has been proven to be a well-attended event and will serve well again. MISSION AND CHURCH PLANTING will be held March 31 – April 2. Faculty member Glen Moore will speak on CHURCH REVITALIZATION. This is a much-needed topic for all our churches. We pray for strong attendance.

At the end of this semester, we will have our CELEBRATION BANQUET on Friday, May 8, and COMMENCEMENT on Saturday, May 6. We need you to attend. Please keep praying for TBI. Come to see us at TBI.

Central Baptist Institute Report

The past two months have been filled with travel, remarkable experiences, and wonderful results. As many of you know, a significant portion of our ministry extends beyond the local field. God has graciously opened doors for us to minister outside the United States and Mexico, allowing us to meet pastors, laymen, and women from various countries who share a deep desire to learn and serve the Lord more

The Central Baptist Seminary now has students enrolled from Mexico, the United States, Peru, Colombia, Honduras, Ecuador, and Belize. This growing international presence has created the need to travel periodically to meet with our students and strengthen the bond between them and our institution.

This year, I had the blessing of traveling to Iquitos, Peru, with Bro. Doug Clements to meet with some of our students. We spent a week teaching and preaching in several churches. From there, we traveled to Colombia, where I met students who have been studying with CBS for several years, as well as new prospects. I was able to teach for several days and share about the ministry of the seminary.

From Colombia, we continued to Honduras, where we met with our students and several pastors from the northern region, particularly in the towns of Veracruz and Agua Caliente. We gathered with approximately twenty pastors, teaching during the mornings and preaching in the evenings at the church in Agua Caliente. The town is nestled high in the surrounding mountains, and one evening, Bro. Doug and I rode in the back of the pastor's truck while it rained—a simple yet memorable experience that reminded me of my childhood.

The trip was a great success. In every place we visited, several individuals expressed a desire to join the ministry of the Central Baptist Seminary and begin their studies. We are grateful to report that we began the first semester with a total of seventy-seven registered students. Upon returning home, I resumed my work in the mission field and coordinated with our faculty and staff to incorporate the new students for the year.

A few weeks later, I traveled to Mexico City. Several years ago, I met brethren there who were interested in joining the seminary. During that first visit, I stayed a few days to lecture and get to know them better, and ten of them enrolled in our program. Not all have continued, but those who did have remained faithful in their studies.

This year's trip had two main purposes. First, to present diplomas to five students who completed their Bachelor's in Theology. Second, to meet new prospects for CBS. By God's grace, both goals were accomplished. A few new students enrolled during this visit, and I also had the privilege of preaching, where four individuals accepted Christ as their personal Savior.

We thank God for every opportunity He gives us to serve. We also want to thank you for your faithfulness throughout these years. Your prayers and financial support have made it possible for us to continue the work God has called us to do.

Mexican Baptist Institute

We started our first semester with 24 first year students, 10 second and third year students, 10 students online, and 22 in a further education class for pastors, missionaries, and church leaders. This gives us a total of 66 students enrolled for this year. At MBI, we not only teach them theory and theology, but we actually take them on the mission field, where we assist one of our former students, and the students plan all the activities, from door-knocking, evangelism, VBS, music, and preaching service. After they graduate, they go on to do a year of service in ministry work. It is then that they receive a diploma.

We bought property for new MBI facilities. We demolished an old house on the property and remodeled another house. We are currently meeting in this remodeled house, temporarily. We will be laying the foundation for the new MBI facilities in the next 3 to 4 months. Of course, we will be seeking churches to partner with us in this endeavor. We covet your prayers as we begin this new phase at the MBI. Pastor, Matt Gholson and myself will gladly come to your church to present this project to your congregation. Call us to set up a date when we can visit your church.

Many exciting things are happening at MBI, but the most exciting news is that every year our graduates go on to open new mission works or fill empty pulpits. Just in 2025, three new mission works have been started by three of our graduates. Two of these missions are in Yucatán, and another one in the state of Veracruz. We are excited of what the Lord is doing in this part of his vineyard. Please consider joining us on a trip to Mexico to see this. Mission works, and the possibilities, of your church getting involved and helping a missionary erect a church building. As brother Brad Mitchell used to say, we never lay the first stone until we have living stones present.

Our annual lecture week will be this coming February, the 23rd and 24th. It will be in Reynosa Mexico, and we are inviting your church, your pastor to join us at this special location. Meet our students, our faculty, and Mexican missionaries that will come up for this occasion. Our Lord Jesus, may just speak to your heart about getting involved in great commission work in Mexico.

We think the churches of Texas for your continued support of MBI. We pray for you often and give thanks to the lord for your prayers and financial support. Come and visit us, and keep us in your prayers.

Youth Report

“Those who believed what Peter said were baptized and added to the church that day—about three thousand in all.”

Acts 2:41

For the first time in decades, younger adults and Gen Z are now the most regular church attendees, averaging 1.9 weekends per month, according to recent Barna research. This matters because it reveals a growing spiritual curiosity and a renewed desire for belonging among young people. The youth are coming back. And this moment places a new importance on youth ministry. Churches that provide authentic connection, spiritual mentoring, and genuine belonging can nurture this renewed interest into lasting faith. So how can we take hold of this opportunity as youth leaders?

1. Make prayer central. (Eph. 6:18) Pray daily for your students—that their hunger for God would deepen and that this movement of revival in young hearts would continue.

2. Empower students with real responsibility. (1 Tim. 4:12)

Shane Pruitt says, “If you treat students like they’re too young to do anything significant for the Kingdom of God, they will believe you. But if you treat them like they’re the church right now, called to do significant things, they will believe you.” Students rise to the level of expectation and trust we place in them.

3. Create a culture of discipleship and evangelism. (Matt. 28:19–20) Evangelism brings students in, but discipleship keeps them in. We cannot expect lasting attendance if we reach them but do not walk with them. And we cannot expect them to walk through our doors if we are not willing to go where they are. One way God has allowed us to be effective is by meeting youth on their own turf. In Longview, TX, we launched a Ride For God location—holding weekly Bible studies at the skate park and building real relationships. Through this, we have witnessed revival firsthand. One young man walked 20 miles just to attend Bible study; he was saved that night and baptized weeks later. Skaters are now attending youth services, and one young man even started a ministry to serve the homeless community. I’m not saying every leader needs to grab a skateboard—that could get dangerous fast.

But I am saying that God often uses shared interests, skills, and experiences to open doors with the youth we're called to reach. Like Jesus, we must meet people where they are.

This is a unique moment. If we pray faithfully, empower boldly, disciple intentionally, and show up consistently, we won't just witness what God is doing in this generation—we'll help shape it.

Worship Report

When David finally brought the Ark of the Covenant into Jerusalem he was moved to do what the Bible calls "Worship". I'm often times surprised by how contentious the subject of worship can be. There are arguments about forms of worship, styles of worship, places of worship, "Do we raise our hands?", "Do we need instruments?", "I thought the singing hour was worship". Well God in his lovingkindness knows how easily we can fall into pitfalls. He has given us two things to help guide us to a proper understanding. Firstly, he made sure that there were MULTIPLE Hebrew words that all mean worship (And sometimes in different ways), and secondly, he's given us a plethora of examples of "Worship" in his word. We'll be using David as our example.

1 Chronicles 16 1-3

1 And they brought in the ark of God and placed it inside the tent which David had pitched for it, and they offered burnt offerings and peace offerings before God. **2** When David had finished offering the burnt offering and the peace offerings, he blessed the people in the name of the LORD. **3** Then he distributed to everyone of Israel, both men and women, to everyone a loaf of bread, a portion of *meat*, and a raisin cake.

Avodah is what we see here, one of the Hebrew words for worship and it means to serve, work or provide worship through sacrifice. David when standing before the Ark embraces his first desire to worship God through seeking to honor

him with burnt offerings and then to seek fellowship with him through freewill peace offerings. How awesome is it to be able lay what we have been given down to the Holy and Righteous God who graciously gives us all things? Before the presence of God David first commits his resources and the work of his hands to God by worshiping him not through lip service alone but through service that is born from a devotion to and acknowledgement of the God that keeps him and his people.

1 Chronicles 16: 4-7

4 He appointed some of the Levites *as* ministers before the ark of the LORD, to celebrate and to thank and praise the LORD God of Israel: **5** Asaph the chief, and second to him Zechariah, *then* Jeiel, Shemiramoth, Jehiel, Mattithiah, Eliab, Benaiah, Obed-edom, and Jeiel, with *musical* instruments, harps, *and* lyres; also Asaph *played* loud-sounding cymbals, **6** and the priests Benaiah and Jahaziel *blew* trumpets continually before the ark of the covenant of God.

7 Then on that day David first assigned Asaph and his relatives to give thanks to the LORD.

Halal is what we see next, it's another Hebrew word for worship that means to celebrate, to boast or make much of with loud exaltation. David invites the people of Israel, God's chosen people to celebrate with him and join with him in this moment of worship. He feeds them, and as a Baptist, I know that as soon as someone mentions that there is going to be food at a gathering, it's gonna be a good time. He then appoints some of the Levites to stand before the Ark with instruments, not to offer additional sacrifices on behalf of the people, not to recount the history of their people to those outside the tent but to sing praise to God!!! To sing of the goodness of God and call others to look, think and sing about the Glory of him who holds all things in the palm of his hands, the one who withholds no good thing from those who walk in his ways and the one who works ALL THINGS together for the good of those whom he loves and are called according to his purpose. This is one of the greatest blessings God allows us to partake in because to declare his majesty to the rest of creation is at the heart of the Great Commission and pleases God.

Whether it is in word or deed, Worship is meant to be the things we intentionally do to bring God honor and glory simply because he is truly worthy of it. He is worthy of every song we could ever sing and every breath that we ever breathe, no matter how high the mountain or how dark the valley he remains worthy of our service and our song. So truly take heart, set it in your hearts to honor God and worship him for who he is and what he does.

1 Chronicles 16 8-11

8 Give thanks to the Lord, call upon His name;
Make His deeds known among the peoples.

9 Sing to Him, sing praises to Him;
Speak of all His wonders.

10 Boast in His holy name;

Media Report

When I was asked to prepare this report, I was spending a week at the House of Mouse in Orlando, Florida. I'll invite you to hold your opinion on the mouse's employer and think of them as a study in technology application. From the moment you book a reservation, every aspect of the park experience—reservations, entry, rides, dining—becomes integrated, enhancing entertainment, easing friction, and maximizing profits. In light of the myriad ways the secular world uses technology to promote sin and offense, I often wonder how we might "plunder Egypt" and leverage technology to maximize our effectiveness in spreading the Gospel?

Multimedia technology—graphics, livestreaming, audio/video—adds depth to our church services. MacTech (Travis Robinson, <https://www.macedonianms.org/mactech-technology-ministry>), ABATech (Brandon Jones, <https://abatech.org>), and ABAMedia (Jonathan "Dub" West, <https://abamedia.org>) help outfit churches with audio/video systems and livestreaming setups. At my home church in Alvin, TX, such systems help the

elderly, the hearing/vision impaired, and distractible ADHD-types follow along, and our livestream keeps the homebound, sick, and traveling members connected. You don't need expensive equipment, either—some churches use a cell phone. For graphics, Crazy Faith Designs (Chad Helton, <https://www.crazyfaithdesigns.net/>) creates engaging content for our highly visual culture. Tools like Canva and Adobe Express make DIY graphics easy as well. When it comes to websites, there's an easy rule: if you want to reach strangers, you need some kind of presence on the web. People looking for a church will visit your website before visiting a service. Most of the ministries mentioned above help with website creation, and services like Weebly, Wix, and Squarespace are popular choices for even the not-so-tech-savvy to build their own sites. As for apps, I can personally attest to their utility, seeing as I am the developer for the Oral Bible App (a tool for distributing oral bible translations). Apps can be very expensive, however, and most churches should prioritize other uses of technology. Instead, communication tools like GroupMe, Flocknote, and private Facebook/WhatsApp groups can help everyone stay up-to-date with church events and share urgent prayer requests.

I would be remiss not to mention AI. I know many people find it intimidating, but I feel strongly that you cannot afford to ignore AI. If you're overwhelmed by the options, tools like Perplexity and ChatGPT are proving useful for research, while Gemini and Midjourney are popular choices for images and graphics. Free versions have most features, so subscriptions are rarely necessary. For the tech-savvy, AI can be used for website and app development: Faith Bible Institute is not only using AI for translating course video and written material into potentially dozens of languages, but their development team (which I am personally involved with) is using a team of AI agents to accelerate development, providing bible students in foreign fields with access to affordable, college-level Bible education only available to English-speakers (<https://fbiclass.com/>).

If you take nothing else away from this report, take this: technology isn't all-or-nothing. It's perfectly acceptable to get a few ideas, use the easy ones, and add over time. Ask for help within your own congregation, and tap into these ministries that

are using technology to serve churches. The word 'technology' comes from Greek words meaning 'the knowledge of how to make things'. Genesis 1:1 records God's first action in the world: to create. His instruction to Adam and Eve was to make fruit and multiply. Jesus' last instruction to His Church was to make disciples. The image of God in us is that of a maker. Digital technology is merely one aspect, but it is one we would be wise not to neglect.

The American Baptist Association Credit Union was established as a savings and lending institution in March of 1970 to help the people and churches in fellowship with the American Baptist Association. Membership is extended to ordained and licensed ministers and their families; ABA Churches, their organizations and employees; as well as members of ABA Churches located in New Mexico, Oklahoma, Louisiana, Arkansas and Texas.

The interest rates on savings and loans are comparable to other lending institutions. Dividends are paid quarterly on shares and a detailed statement of your account is mailed. The dividend paid for the 3rd quarter of 2025 was 0.50% for deposits under \$100,000, 0.75% for deposits from \$100,000 to \$150,000 and deposits greater than \$150,000 was 1.0%. All savings are federally insured to at least \$250,000.00 and backed by the full faith and credit of the United States Government, (NCUA) National Credit Union Administration (NCUA) a US Government Agency.

On September 30, 2024 there were 390 members with total assets of \$1,763,935.82. We pray that our membership continues to increase. Joining the Credit Union is how you can help us in getting closer to our goal of being able to help ABA Churches.

Although two of these children have since moved to Texas, SIX of these children continue to come to church each Sunday with us to Northern Hills Baptist Church. They remain actively involved in the teen and children's departments and are attending Bogg Springs Camps.

We have had four new children come to our Home. We have had three salvations and 2 baptisms. And two of our current children are available for adoption.

One area we are hoping to advance is adoption. We believe adoption is very biblical, and we believe our churches in the ABA can really help move the needle for so many kiddos in our state waiting to find forever families. We are NOT an adoption agency, but we are working to unify sibling groups in our Home who are currently separated and living in different foster homes.

In September we received a sibling group of three. It was the first time they have all lived together since coming into foster care. These two brothers and sister are available for adoption and looking for their new forever family. Please join us in prayer for this sibling group and the other two kiddos in our care who are needing to be adopted.

September 21, 2025 was our inaugural kickoff for R.O.C.K. Sunday. R.O.C.K. Sunday (Remember Our Children’s Home Kids Sunday) is an annual day of prayer the third Sunday of September each year for our churches to collectively pray for the Children’s Home. Churches are encouraged to utilize this day as a day of prayer for our kiddos, to pray for the addition of more house parents, and to keep their congregations updated and informed of this needful ministry to children. We were very thankful for the response we had received from churches from many different states.

Guidelines for Hosting Messenger Meeting

Things To Do Before Coming To The Meeting:

Unless your church has a very large sanctuary, you will need to make arrangements with a motel or civic center that can provide two large meeting rooms on Tuesday. What about rental fees? Will a room or hall be available for displays, with tables and ample electrical outlets? A motel that can provide up to 75 rooms with a quoted and locked in rate. This could be more than one motel, but they should be close to each other. How far is it to a good, clean RV Park? What about the airport? Shuttle service, taxi, or church van to and from?

Things To Do After You Have Been Selected As Host:

- Secure a meeting room with a capacity of 150 for Pastor's and Laymen's Council for Tuesday. Piano and/or organ, PA system with floor microphones required.
- Provide a room for about 150 for Ladies' Auxiliary meeting on Tuesday, same requirements. These rooms should be far enough apart so that they do not disturb each other. Ladies will need tables for registration, clerks, etc. Nursery for small children helpful. Host Ladies Auxiliary is responsible for Program during session.
- Will coffee, donuts, cookies, juice, etc. be provided? Food store might donate these. • The Chamber of Commerce may provide lists of restaurants, maps, interesting sites.

The Main Sessions:

- Meeting room for the messenger meeting that can seat 350 or more.
- Sound and recording system, floor microphones.
- Piano and/or organ, two tables and podium on stage area.
- Coffee, cookies, nursery for small children (who will staff?), stage decorations.
- Song sheets or hymnals, CD player connected to sound system for background accompaniment. Wednesday night special music must be held to allotted time.
- Will city, county, officials appear for welcome?
- A welcome letter to clerks for inclusion in Minute Book.
- Contact motel manager to assure that plans agreed on early are intact.
- Send letters of welcome and info to each church, two to three months in advance. • Two months in advance send articles to The Baptist Monitor.

Doctrinal Statement of the MBA OF TEXAS

1. We believe in the plenary verbal inspiration and inerrancy of the whole Bible as originally written, and that the Bible is the all-sufficient rule of faith and practice, (Psalm 119-160; 2 Tim. 3:16-17).
2. We believe in the personal triune God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, equal in divine perfection, (Matt. 2&19).
3. We believe in the Genesis account of creation, (Gen. 1, 2).
4. We believe that Satan is a fallen angel, the archenemy of God and man, the unholy god of this world and that his destiny is the eternal lake of fire, (Isa. 14:12-15; Ezek. 2&11-19; Matt. 25:41; 2 Cor. 4:4; Eph. 6:10-17; Rev. 20:10).
5. We believe in the virgin birth and sinless humanity of Jesus Christ, (Matt. 1:18-20; 2 Cor. 5:21; 1 Peter 2:22).
6. We believe in the Deity of Jesus Christ, (John 1:1, 14; 10:30; 14:9; 2 Cor. 5:19).
7. We believe that the Divine Administrator for Jesus Christ in His churches is the Holy Spirit (Luke 24:49; John 14:16, 17; 16:13; Act 1:4, 5, 8), whose work as such began on the first Pentecost after the resurrection of Jesus Christ with the Baptism of the Holy Spirit, which event occurred only once and is not repeated, (Acts 2).
8. We believe that the miraculous gifts of the Spirit listed in 1 Cor. 12:8-10 were done away when the Bible was completed (1 Cor. 13:8-10), that the gift of apostle-ship ceased with the death of the last chosen directly by the Lord Jesus (Eph. 2:20), and that the abiding gifts adequately equip the churches for service to God, (Rom. 12:13; 1 Cor. 13:1-3; Eph. 4:7-16; 1 Peter 4:10, 11; 2 Tim. 3:16, 17). The apostles and prophets were the inspired agents through whom the New Testament revelation was given. When that revelation was complete, there was no further need for the office of apostle and prophet; thus, the apostleship ceased with the death of the last apostle chosen directly by the Lord Jesus.

9. We believe that man was created in the image of God and lived in innocency until he fell by voluntary transgression from his sinless state, the result being that all man- kind are now sinners, (Gen. 1:26; 3:6-24; Rom. 5:12, 19).

10. We believe the substitutionary suffering and death of Jesus Christ was sufficient to propitiate for the sins of all humanity, thus making salvation available for all man- kind, (Isa. 53:6; Heb. 2:9; 1 Peter. 2:24; 3:18; 2 Peter. 3:9; 1 John 2:2).

11. We believe in the bodily resurrection and ascension of Christ and the bodily resurrection of His saints, (Matt. 2&1-7; Acts 1:9-11; 1 Cor. 15:42-58; 1 Thess. 4:13-18). 12. We believe in the pre-millennial, personal, bodily return of Christ as the crowning event of the Gentile Age. We further believe at His coming the righteous dead shall be raised, the living saints shall be changed and both shall be caught up to meet the Lord in the air. We also believe after the Millennial Reign of Christ on earth the unrighteous shall be resurrected unto eternal punishment in the lake of fire, (John 14:1-6; 1 Thess. 4:13-18; 2 Thess. 2:8; Rev. 20: 4-6, 11-15; 21:8).

13. We believe the depraved alien sinner is saved wholly by grace through faith in Jesus Christ and the requisites to regeneration are repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ (Luke 13:3, 5; John 3:16, 18; Acts 20:21; Rom. 6:23; Eph. 2:8, 9), and the Holy Spirit convicts sinners and regenerates, seals, secures, and indwells every believer, (John 3:6; 16:8, 9; Rom. &9-11; 1 Cor. 6:19, 20; Eph. 4:30; Titus 3:5). 14. We believe all who trust in Jesus Christ for salvation are eternally secure and shall persevere in Him and shall not perish, (John 3:36; 5:24; 10:27-30; Rom. &35-39; Heb. 10:39; 1 Peter 1:5).

15. We believe God deals with believers as His children, chastises the disobedient, blesses the obedient in this life and reserves rewards for the future, (Matt. 16:27; 25:14-23; John 1:12; Heb. 12:5-11; 2 John 8; Rev. 22:12).

16. We believe Jesus Christ , during His personal ministry, established His Church, which is a local, visible assembly of scripturally baptized believers in covenant relationship, to carry out the Commission of the Lord Jesus Christ. We further believe each church is an independent, self-governing body over which no other ecclesiastical body may exercise authority. We believe Jesus Christ gave the Great Commission to New Testament churches only, and promised the perpetuity (Matt. 4:18-22; 16:18; 1&15-18; 2&19-20; Mark 1:14-20; John 1:35-51; Eph. 3:21).

17. We believe there are two pictorial ordinances in the Lord's churches: baptism and the Lord's Supper. Scriptural baptism is the immersion of penitent believers in water, administered by the authority of a New Testament church in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. We further believe the Lord's Supper is a memorial ordinance, restricted to the members of the church observing the ordinance, (Matt. 2&19, 20; Acts. &12, 3& Rom. 6:4; 1 Cor. 5:11-13; 11:1, 2, 17-20, 26).

18. We believe there are two divinely appointed offices in a church, pastor and deacon, to be filled by men whose qualifications are set forth in 1 Tim. 3:1-16; Titus 1:5-9.

19. We believe all associations, fellowships, conventions, boards, and their committees are servants of the churches, (Matt. 20:25-28).

20. We believe in the complete separation of churches and state (Matt. 22:21) and affirm our belief in civil obedience unless the laws and regulations of civil government run contrary to the Holy Scriptures (Rom. 13:1-7; 1 Peter 2:13-15; Acts. 5: 29).

Statement of Mission Policy

SECTION I

We hold, as Churches composing the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas, that the authority for execution of the Great Commission was given to the New Testament Church, and the authority must remain forever with the churches. Therefore the right and privilege of every church of this Association to endorse, set apart, or send out missionaries is wholly within the rights of each church regardless of the opinions or vote of the messengers.

SECTION II

The Messengers of churches of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas will not consider requests for mission support unless it is a church associated with, and sub- scribing to, the principles and practices of the churches of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas.

SECTION III

- I. State Mission work shall be defined as that which is used to assist churches to fulfill the Great Commission:
1. Reach the Lost,
 2. Baptize the saved,
 3. Teach the baptized church member.

These works may consist of:

Work to establish a new church.

Work with existing church to prevent its demise.

II. Special mission projects that do not include all three points of the Great Commission may be considered for designated funds. (E.G. = missionary helpers, church or mission ministries)

We recommend that churches seek fields in sections of the state where we have no churches.

SECTION V

Each church requesting support for a missionary or mission project must submit to the office of the Secretary Treasurer of Missions, by September 15th, a detailed report of the plan of the church for its establishment of a new church or its plans for aiding in the turnaround of an existing church., or in special mission endeavors. We request a detailed report of the missionary including his age, his family living at home, his education and experience in mission work. The report must provide how the church plans to use the requested support and their financial involvement in all areas of mission work.

SECTION VI

We recognize that a missionary elected by his local church, if it be a scriptural church, is a scriptural missionary.

SECTION VII

Each request will be considered individually for the requested amount of support. If the MBA of Texas funds decline to \$20,000, the Secretary/Treasurer will be permitted to use his discretion to prorate the funds or offering proportionately for all request and all salaries, (with the exception of the Secretary/Treasurer because they have no direct church sponsorship). Reimbursements will not be implemented until the balance of the MBA of Texas reaches \$25,000. If a missionary is incapacitated either by an accident or illness and has to resign the mission field, his salary may continue up to six months upon request by the sponsoring church. In the event of the death of a missionary, his salary request will be given to his widow or dependent children for the ensuing six months upon request by the sponsoring church.

SECTION VIII

Each church receiving support for their mission work shall provide the Secretary/Treasurer a monthly progress report. Support for the month will not be mailed by the Secretary/Treasurer if a report has not been received.

SECTION IX

Compensation for the Secretary-Treasurer shall be determined annually by the messengers, but the officers of the Association shall be authorized to designate a portion of that compensation as a ministerial housing allowance.

SECTION X

In the event the messengers are not able to meet in the annual meeting, no new recommended missionaries will be added and the current missionaries per their church recommendations, will continue to receive their support for one additional year. The current salaries will be paid with no raises added, pursuant to the terms of Section VII.

Articles of Agreement

ARTICLE I -- Name

This association shall be known as the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas.

ARTICLE II -- Object

The object of this Association shall be to awaken a deeper interest in the welfare of the churches, to cultivate a closer fellowship among the churches, and to encourage and perpetuate the very greatest possible activity in missionary, educational and benevolent enterprises.

ARTICLE III

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of such regular independent Missionary Baptist Churches as may voluntarily choose to cooperate in carrying out the object of this Association.

Section 2. The Messenger Assemblies of this Association shall be composed of messengers elected by the churches composing it.

Section 3. Each church choosing to represent in this Association shall be entitled to three messengers.

Section 4. Each church shall be the sole judge of the qualification of her messengers.

ARTICLE IV -- Nature

The Messenger Assembly of this Association shall be, in nature, formed as a council in matters pertaining to missionary, education and benevolent work.

ARTICLE V -- Principles

The Messenger Assembly of this Association shall recognize the freedom of speech as essential to the highest achievement in its work. It shall stand or fall on its own conformity to the truth. It shall exercise no ecclesiastical authority, but it shall, by every precaution recognize the independence and sovereignty of every individual church. It shall also encourage on the part of the church and the messengers the greatest possible freedom of expression in discussing matters pertaining to its work.

ARTICLE VI -- Powers

The action of the Messenger Assembly shall be limited to the work of awakening enthusiasm in missionary, educational and benevolent enterprises and receiving and distributing funds for the same.

ARTICLE VII -- Funds

Section 1. All funds of this Association shall be raised by voluntary donations secured solely upon the merits of the cause in the interest of which appeals are made for gifts: provided, this is not to prevent the use of any income or any property that may be acquired by donation or by purchase.

Section 2. Distribution of funds shall be authorized by an act of this Messenger Assembly, or by an act of properly authorized committees of this assembly hereinafter provided for; but in no instance shall the assembly or any committee of it use means in violation of the expressed preference of the donor.

ARTICLE VIII -- Officers

Section 1. The officers of this Messenger Assembly shall be a moderator, and assistant moderator, two (2) recording secretaries and a corresponding secretary treasurer.

Section 2. All officers of this assembly shall be chosen annually, and shall hold their offices until their successors are elected and the same shall be true of all members of standing committees. All officers shall be elected by a majority of the messengers voting. No moderator shall succeed himself more than one year.

Section 3. The duties of all officers shall be as directed by the Messenger Assembly, unless otherwise directed by the churches.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the corresponding secretary treasurer to take charge of money and valuables not specifically entrusted to someone else and to dispose of same as he may be directed by this Messenger Assembly. He shall make an annual report to this assembly of all monies received and disbursed.

Section 5. The recording secretaries, in addition to keeping the records of this Association, will superintend the printing and distribution of minutes of such regular meetings as the messengers may direct.

Section 6. In the event a host church or churches would not be able to fulfill an invitation for any circumstance, the trustees of the Association shall be authorized to seek out an alternate meeting place. The trustees shall follow the rule of ARTICLE IX -- Committees, Section 1 in selecting a new meeting place.

In the event that a cancellation occurs within three months of the next scheduled meeting, the trustees may be empowered with the responsibility to act in an emergency to secure another meeting location. In the event of but not limited to a national emergency, pandemic or other unforeseen event that places the messengers in danger for assembling, the trustees in counsel with the host church, by means of telephone or video conference, may have authority to cancel an annual meeting if there is a majority vote.

ARTICLE IX -- Committees

Section 1. The missionary committee shall be composed of one representative of each church choosing to be represented. The duty of the committee shall be to meet quarterly, or as directed by the Messenger Assembly, in the interest of all the work. It shall be

empowered to fill vacancies of regular offices between sessions of the Messenger Assembly and to call a special meeting of a Messenger Assembly when needed. Section 2. The following officers of the Assembly shall be the trustees of the association: Namely, the moderator, assistant moderator, two recording secretaries and secretary-treasurer, subject to the direction of the Messenger Assembly, and they are empowered to act in legal capacity as trustees of the Association.

ARTICLE X -- Missionaries

We hold that the authority for execution of the Great Commission was given to the New Testament Church and the authority must remain forever with the churches. Therefore, the right and privilege of every church of this Association to endorse, set apart and send out missionaries of its own choosing and the act of one church in sending out missionaries can in no way bind or obligate any other church. The churches shall be free and their support of missionaries shall be voluntary on their part.

ARTICLE XI --Meetings

The regular meetings of the Church Messengers shall be at such time and place as the assembled messengers may appoint.

ARTICLE XII -- Amendments

The Messenger Assembly shall have no power to change the Articles of Agreement. Any church desiring a change shall send to the annual meeting a copy of the proposed change; the Messenger Assembly will then submit the proposed change to each cooperating church; if two-thirds of the cooperating churches vote for the change, then the Article of Agreement shall be amended to conform to the proposed change. Two-thirds of the churches representing in assembly in the previous year shall be the number determining the results.

President's Address

KINDNESS, LOVE AND UNITY

Good afternoon, ladies. it is such a blessing to be together with each of you. The ladies of the Ruth class at New Liberty have done an excellent job taking care of our needs today. Thank you for that ladies. Let's give them a hand.

I always spend much time in prayer as I prepare for our women's conference. I am confident in the message that our lord wants me to share with you today. Have you ever been discouraged? have you felt like you wanted to hide in a corner and not have to deal with people or problems any longer? Has someone hurt you so badly that it was hard to catch a breath? Have you felt completely deflated? like you just want to quit? no, that's not right. you don't want to quit, yet you wonder if you have a choice. You simply do not think you can continue to put yourself out there for god just to be knocked down. Are you one who has cried yourself to sleep because of a vicious verbal attack from someone in church who you should have been safe with? Do you wonder why you work so hard for Jesus and for his church just to be knocked down? Is it you who has prayed hard, long into the night, trying to figure out how on earth you could keep serving our lord through his church? If you have never felt or wondered some or all of the things I mentioned, then you are the exception, not the norm. Bow your head right now and thank father that you have not been hurt terribly by your brothers and sisters in Christ. your brothers and sisters... have you wondered why? Why people aren't kind? Why do churches split and split again, then many close their doors? They become another church lost because someone, somewhere, sometime began a system of selfishness, hurt and lack of compassion that destroyed the unity that God calls us to. The outcome of giving way to our flesh is always destruction. Let me say that again. The outcome of giving way to our flesh is always destruction. Some churches filled with human desire and self centeredness keep their doors open yet they can't grow. A few new people join once in a while but growth never lasts in these churches. Have you ever wanted to be the person that changes the course of destruction but you just do not know how to affect a change? That is what

God put on my heart to share with you today. We are going to talk about a virtuous woman today. no, we won't just be looking at the virtuous woman that we all think of in proverbs 31, although there is much to gain from that study and we will look at a couple of verses from this favorite passage. We are also going to talk about kindness and unity. I ordered a book that I am going to read to you today to begin this address. The book is titled, "I am kind with God." Let's jump right in and see what Mia, our leading lady in the book, is up to. You may be wondering why I read to you from a child's book. I do know that you aren't children. However, I have learned a few things in my years as a pastor's kid, a pastor's wife and a missionary wife. One of the things I have learned is that, unfortunately, there is a serious lack of kindness among many christians in God's churches. Before we go any further, let me assure you that I do not think that you are unkind. I realize I am sharing this day and this message with "the cream of the crop, " and that I am speaking to "the choir." You love Jesus and his church. Because of this, you are the perfect audience for my little book and for this president's address.

You might be asking yourself, why are we the perfect audience to hear about kindness. I will tell you why. because the ministry of kindness has to start somewhere. I know, I know that you care about how God works through you. I know that you care about the future of the churches you serve. I know that some of you look around on Sundays and wonder what the church you serve is going to do to survive when the precious gray haired saints you serve today are gone from this world.

I have a saying that I find fits many situations. too often I have to use my phrase, "play nice in the sandbox." I use this phrase when I am working with children, whether I am teaching Sunday School, bible school or even piano or voice lessons. I use this phrase when I am rehearsing the adult choir or directing a play. I have said "play nice in the sandbox" while working with adults far more often than you would imagine possible. This concerns me. Why? Come with me on a journey, a journey to the holy city of Jerusalem. stay close. The city is very crowded. we cannot take a step without bumping into someone. oh, my goodness. I saw that man bump you against the wall. Are you alright? Can you walk? good. We really must keep mov-

ing. Standing still will likely get us trampled. Everyone is in such a hurry. people's arms are full of packages. The spices that will make a family's passover meal delicious and compliant to the law smell strong when wrapped in paper and carried through the city. I have noticed you stifling a gag as hordes of rushing humanity pass us by. What is that other odor? The one that makes my eyes tear up and forces my hand over my nose. sweat. that's it. The air is heavy with sweat. It hangs like a curtain that is impossible to pierce. there is no relief from it. there is no place to go to take a sweet breath of fresh air. It seems the city is void of it. We travel to Jerusalem so seldom. We always come for Passover, though. I have always enjoyed the beautiful, stone streets. You and I still walk on dirt in our village. As we continue walking today, my feet rebel. They are hurting terribly from the unevenness of the cobblestones. you, too? here. hold my hand. we must stay together.

In spite of strong scents and a sea of people, there is so much excitement and some trepidation in the city. Passover is such a special time for our people. Moses, a hero among the Israelites, led God's chosen out of Egypt after the very first passover. God told Moses to have us put blood on the door posts of our houses. If our ancestors obeyed, the death angel would pass over them. Since you and I walk these streets today, they must have obeyed. Tonight will be my 20th passover. 20? how is that possible...Oh, my goodness! my ears! The shopkeepers are barking out information about their wares, begging us to come inside and spend a bit of our money. no, that's not correct. They want us to spend all of our money.

As interesting as everything happening around us is, we are in the market today for a different reason than most. our lamb is ready for the evening meal, spices and bitter herbs are ready. I hope we make it back before shabbat begins. we will be in so much trouble if we are not. I am glad we came to market today, hoping to catch a glimpse of the man who heals the lame, causes the blind to see, even raises the dead to life again. I would be happy just to see some of his followers but, oh, how it would thrill my heart to see Jesus. Jesus! the man who is both loved and hated. It was such a glorious day when he and his followers came through our village.

Everyone was abuzz with excitement. We had heard of Jesus. We knew that he could heal our sick. His teachings fed my soul in a way nothing else ever had. I determined to find him if he is here this week. Even if I only get a quick look at his face. I want to see his eyes again, so full of love yet somehow so sad. There! Those are some of his followers! Quick! let us follow them. Maybe they will lead us to Jesus! stay back a bit. we do not want them to see us and tell us to go away. They seem a little nervous. shhh... be quiet. oh, good idea. Yes, let's tip-toe. How far away are they going? we aren't going to be at aunties in time for passover. we are going to be in so much trouble. Hmm... I wonder why they are stopping here? This is such a plain house. There is nothing exceptional about it at all. oh, look. There are more of Jesus' followers. They are all going into that house. Surely Jesus is with them. How can we find out? Hey, do you see that small window? If we can climb those steps we might be able to see what is happening. mmm...the smells coming from this place are wonderful. delicious lamb and bitter herbs. Do you smell them? Yes, I agree. heavenly. Maybe those stone steps will get us close enough to see into the room. There are just enough of them to raise us close to the window. Whew. here we are. That was a bit of a climb. look at the table. They have already finished their passover meal. oooo... the cushions on the floor beckon with beauty and comfort. Some of them appear to be made of fine silk. how i would love to recline on one for a bit. There he is! that is Jesus! I could never forget his face. Can you see him? good. Look, he is wearing a towel. That is strange. Now he is... why is he kneeling down before one of his students? Jesus is washing his feet! Why on earth would a master wash his student's feet? They should be serving him! maybe we should go right in and offer to wash Jesus' feet. Okay, I get it. You're right. There is no way we would be allowed into their passover. wait. listen. he is telling them something. I think he is teaching them. While he washes their feet?! Ah, this student has it right. He does not want his master washing his feet. "Lord, dost thou wash my feet?" "What I do thou knowest not now; but thou shalt know hereafter." I wonder what Jesus means by that. now the student is speaking again. "Thou shalt

never wash my feet.” Hmmmm...Jesus isn't giving his student the bowl and the towel. What is he saying? “Unless I wash you, you have no part with me.” I agree with this disciple. Wash all of me, Lord! Oh, listen to Jesus' voice. He speaks with such authority and kindness. “Know ye what I have done to you? Ye call me master and lord: and ye say well; for so I am. If I then, your lord and master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another's feet for I have given you an example, that ye should do as I have done to you. Verily, verily, I say unto you, the servant is not greater than his lord; neither he that is sent greater than he that sent him. If ye know these things, happy are ye if ye do them.” I am so glad you came with me. Do you have any idea what Jesus is talking about? Why is he, their master, our messiah serving his disciples? I need to understand. We all need to understand the principle Jesus was teaching his disciples on his last night alone with them. Washing feet is a beautiful symbol, but what does it mean? Jesus modeled washing his disciple's feet out of love and sacrifice. The teacher served his students. Jesus, of whom it was said, “Come now, and let us reason together, saith the Lord: though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be white as snow; though they be red like crimson, they shall be as wool.” (Isaiah 1:18) Jesus, who shed his very blood hours after the passover meal we just visited, left some very important last minute messages with his followers, with us. “How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of those who bring good news, who proclaim peace, who bring good tidings, who proclaim salvation, who say to Zion, “your god reigns!” Jesus washed the very feet of his followers who he was equipping to share the gospel after his death and resurrection. Have you thought about it like this? You and me, all believers in Jesus Christ are called to share the good news. All believers are called to the ministry of reconciliation. Yep, that is you and me. What Jesus has taught us about our responsibility to evangelize the world and make disciples, teaching them to observe his every commandment is this: we cannot be effective if we are not in the business of serving, loving, being kind and unified. Have you ever seen two animals who fight every time they are together? They become each other's enemy. They are not focused on doing anything together. They are focused

on coming out on top. This is what I am broken hearted over, ladies. Way too often we watch brothers and sisters in Christ who are solely focused on winning. Having it their way. Coming out on top, for them, not for Christ. Not for the welfare of their brothers and sisters. Not even for the purpose of reaching lost souls and bringing them to Christ. This should never be in the body of Christ, yet, in many churches this is the prevailing attitude. When the dust settles from an outburst or a hurtful business meeting, people wonder why there is a mere handful attending services. They don't know how they will pay their bills or provide for their pastor. Many churches end up without a pastor or without members to the point that they cannot keep their doors open. Another church bites the dust. and another. and another. What a sad testament. Ladies, it does not have to be this way. To quote a dear friend of mine, Terry Hilliard, at one of her last MBA of Texas state meetings, "We've got to do better." We've got to teach better. I told you we would look at a virtuous woman and talk about kindness and unity. I plan to keep that promise. I will start with the definition of a virtuous woman from Proverbs 31:26, "She openeth her mouth with wisdom; and in her tongue is the law of kindness." We have two defining words here, wisdom and kindness. When you open your mouth are you using wisdom from God? Are you kind? If you can say yes to this question then kudos. Praise God! You are already setting the kind of example that others need to see in you. Do you realize that one of the attributes of God is kindness? Nehemiah 9:17, "...but thou art a God ready to pardon, gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and of great kindness..." If we are not being kind to our brothers and sisters then we are not letting God grow us up in him. If you can say you are kind, then halleluiah! You are becoming a mature Christian. We are recipients of God's kindness. We should offer kindness to others. Psalm 31:21, "Blessed be the Lord; for he has shown me his marvellous kindness." God's kindness is a comfort to us. "Let...thy merciful kindness be for my comfort..." Psalm 119:76. Even barbarians offer kindness according to Paul, "and the barbarous people showed us extraordinary kindness for they kindled a fire and welcomed us because it had begun to rain and was cold."

” The barbarous showed kindness. Many in God's churches fail to do so. You might ask why I keep bringing up kindness. I do so because it is impossible to have unity without we being kind to one another. If we are not unified, what is the opposite of that? Divided. Split. Exactly where a church, a group of saved, baptized believers who are covenanted together to carry out the great commission does not want to be. We cannot be together and be divided. We cannot be together and be split. We cannot be together without kindness.

I asked Bro. Danny Mendoza if he knew how many churches associating with the MBA of Texas closed their doors in the past year. He shared with me that he does not have an exact number but that at least 4 or 5 churches fellowshiping with us closed their doors this year. I submit to you that this number is 4 or 5 too many. Those of you who are active in the Lord's churches know that churches close their doors every year. We get a prayer request or a phone call announcing another church has closed her doors and I weep. Do you? I know many of you do. What if someone had decided years ago to show kindness to brothers and sisters in those churches? What if someone had decided that it was not about them winning or coming out on top? What if someone had decided that the lost needing churches to be lighthouses in this world was more important than that someone's personal opinion or ideas? What if the very person who can save your church from shutting her doors some day down the road is you?

Jesus prayed in the garden before his arrest. “Neither pray I for these alone, but for them also which shall believe on me through their word; that they all may be one; as thou, father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be one in us: that the world may believe that thou has sent me. And the glory which thou gavest me I have given them; that they may be one, even as we are one: I in them, and thou in me, that they may be made perfect in one; and that the world may know that thou hast sent me, and hast loved them, as thou hast loved me.” John 17: 20-23. Paul, under inspiration from holy spirit, “I therefore, the prisoner of the lord, beseech you that ye walk worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called, with all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another in love; endeavoring to keep the unity of the spirit in the

bond of peace.” ladies, if we take these verses from the word of god to heart and live by them, we will see churches moving from closure to celebration as Christ is lifted up, we are kind to one another and unity among the saints is our goal. This is my prayer for the lord’s churches. Thank you for listening. I love each of you.

TEXAS STATE WOMEN'S CONFERENCE STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

TEXAS STATE WOMEN'S CONFERENCE

STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

Article I – Name

**The name of the organization shall be
Women's Conference of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas.**

Article II – Definition

The Women's Conference of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas shall be composed of messengers from the churches which compose the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas.

Article III – Purpose

The purpose of the Women's Conference of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas shall be

- (1) To encourage the women of the local churches to be active in all phases of the work in which they have the scriptural right to participate,**
- (2) To encourage the establishment of women's groups in all MBA of Texas churches,**
- (3) To participate in mission activities as selected by the messenger body.**

Article IV – Time and Place

The Women's Conference of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas shall meet annually at 10 AM on Tuesday before the Annual Session of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas Messengers.

Article V – Officers

The officers of the Women's Conference of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas shall be:

- (1) President, (2) First Vice President, (3) Second Vice President, (4) Past President,**
- (5) Recording Secretary, (6) Assistant Recording Secretary, (7) Treasurer, (8) Assistant Treasurer, (9) Corresponding Secretary, (10) Bible and Tract Distributor, (11) Assistant Bible and Tract Distributor, (12) Parliamentarian, (13) Liaison to new Women's Groups and Auxiliaries, (14) Coordinator to Voluntary Youth Projects.**

Article VI – Election of Officers

All officers of the Women's Conference of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas shall be elected annually by nomination and

majority vote with the exception of the Assistant Treasurer and Assistant Bible and Tract Distributor. The Treasurer and Bible and Tract Distributor elected by the messenger body shall each appoint her own assistant. Each officer must be a member of a local church fellowshipping with the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas and shall be present in the session when elected. No officer shall succeed herself more than once consecutively except the Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, Bible and Tract Distributor, and Assistant Bible and Tract Distributor. All officers should be committed to encouraging fellowship among our state work and to supporting each annual state project goal by encouraging and informing her Auxiliary, Women's Group, Women's Fellowship, local church and associations about said financial goals.

Article VII – Duties of Officers

Section I – President

The duties of the President shall be: (a) to preside over all State Meetings; (b) to prepare and present a President's Address to messengers at the annual meeting; (c) to appoint committees as directed by the messenger body; (d) to call special meetings when necessary; (e) to be active in looking after the welfare of the work.

Section II – Vice Presidents

The duties of the First Vice President shall be: (a) to preside over the meetings in the absence of the President or when called upon by the President; (b) to perform the duties that usually devolve upon such officers; (c) shall be Chairman of the Committee to Stimulate Interest.

The duties of the Second Vice President shall be: (a) to preside over the meeting in the absence of the President and First Vice President or when called upon; (b) shall be the Chairman of the Program Committee and shall appoint other committee members as needed to assist with the program; (c) to perform the duties that usually devolve upon such officers; (d) to work with host church or churches to ensure a meeting space for our annual meeting, to arrange for musical instruments and technical equipment as needed for the meeting and workshop, and to prepare printed programs for distribution at our annual meeting.

Section III – Secretary and Assistant Secretary

The duties of the Secretary shall be: (a) to keep a record of the proceedings of the meetings; (b) to announce special meetings; (c) to prepare and read reports as instructed by the messenger body; (d) to perform such other duties as may be necessary in carrying on the work of this office; (e) to prepare a complete recording of the minutes of the annual meeting and present them to the secretary of the messenger meeting of The Missionary Baptist Association of Texas for inclusion in the annual minute book of The Missionary Baptist Association of Texas. The duties of the Assistant Secretary shall be to (a) to assist the secretary in keeping a record of the proceedings of the meetings; (b) to

perform the duties of the secretary if she is unable to perform the duties of her office; (c) to perform such other duties as may be necessary in carrying on the work of this office.

Section IV – Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer

The duties of the Treasurer shall be: (a) to receive and disburse funds as designated by the Messenger Body; (b) to keep a record of money received and disbursed and present a yearly report at the annual meeting; (c) to post financial updates and encourage regular support of the organization's annual project goal.

The duties of the Assistant Treasurer shall be to (a) assist the Treasurer in carrying out her duties; (b) to perform the duties of the Treasurer should she be unable to perform the duties of her office.

Section V – Corresponding Secretary

The duties of the Corresponding Secretary shall be: (a) to correspond about necessary matters with the officers of the State Organization; (b) to report through our religious papers on the activities of the Women's Work; (c) to correspond with the State Officers of other State Auxiliaries with regard to work and meetings.

Section VI – Bible and Tract Distributor

The duties of the Bible and Tract Distributor shall be: (a) to solicit funds and receive voluntary offerings for the Bible and Tract Project; (b) to keep a record of money received and disbursed and present a yearly report at the annual meeting; (c) to encourage regular support of the Bible and Tract Project; (d) be available to correspond with those needing help or information concerning the use and purchase of tracts.

The duties of the Assistant Bible And Tract Distributor shall be: (a) to assist the Bible and Tract Distributor in carrying out her duties; (b) to perform the duties of the Bible and Tract Distributor should she be unable to perform the duties of her office.

Section VII – Parliamentarian

The duties of the Parliamentarian shall be: to advise the presiding officer on points of parliamentary law and also to give similar advice to the body when they request it.

Section VIII – Past President

The duties of the Past President shall be to support and advise the President and other officers and to perform the duties of the President, First Vice President or Second Vice President if either is unable to perform her office or the office of the preceding officer.

Section IX – Liaison to new Women's Groups and Auxiliaries

The duties of the Liaison shall be to be available to provide information and support to new Women's Groups and Auxiliaries wanting to join with the Women's Conference of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas for the purpose of fellowship and raising funds for our annual project goal.

Section X – Coordinator for Voluntary Youth Projects

The duties of the Coordinator shall be (a) to work with the host church to provide space for the youth of our work to voluntarily assemble; (b)

to plan voluntary activities and outings with said youth during our Annual Messenger Meetings.

Article VIII – Membership

Each church shall be entitled to three voting messengers representing the church of their membership.

Article IX – Contributions

Section I

All contributions to the Women’s Conference of the Missionary Baptist Association of Texas shall be raised by voluntary offerings and shall be given to the Treasurer for proper disbursement.

Section II

At each annual meeting, the messengers shall select by majority vote a special project within the fellowship and confines of The Missionary Baptist Association of Texas for the coming year. (a) Women’s Groups or Auxiliaries fellowshipping with The Missionary Baptist Association of Texas who desire to nominate a project shall send a copy of the proposal to the missionary’s sponsoring pastor and to the Women’s Conference Corresponding Secretary by September 1st so that the Corresponding Secretary may include such information in a letter, post, or religious publication to inform Women’s Groups and Auxiliaries in the state before the state meeting. (b) Women’s Groups or Auxiliaries who nominate a project should be prepared to present adequate information concerning the project. (c) All project offerings shall be given to the Treasurer for proper disbursement.

Section III

In the event no nomination meeting the guidelines is brought to the annual meeting, the messenger body will choose to either (1) continue the previous goal or (2) add the funds contributed to the next mission goal chosen.

Section IV

The Bible and Tract Distributor shall receive funds to provide mission points and churches fellowshipping with The Missionary Baptist Association of Texas with Bibles and Tracts upon request. Requests will be made directly to the Bible and Tract Distributor, and she will make the printed materials or funds available as she has resources to do so.

Article X -- Salaries

Section I

The Secretary, Treasurer, and Corresponding Secretary shall receive salaries as designated by the Messenger Body.

Section II

The Treasurer shall reimburse the expenses incurred by the Secretary, Treasurer, and Corresponding Secretary in copying and mailing out reports as specified.

Article XI – Committees

Section I

Committees shall be appointed by the President except when the President requests they be elected.

Section II

A program committee shall be appointed by the Second Vice President as she deems necessary to work with the entertaining church in preparation of the program material for each annual meeting.

Article XII – Amendment

These articles of agreement shall not be changed or amended unless the change of amendment be offered in writing during the morning session and permitted to lay over until the afternoon session. It may then be adopted only by a vote of two-thirds of the messengers.
